3. Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Case.
4. Commission Roll Call: Commissioner Forshee – present, Commissioner Houts – present, Commissioner Powell – present, and Commissioner Wooten – present.
5. Departmental Reports:

Commissioner Forshee gave the attached police department report for December 2019

Commissioner Houts gave the attached sewer report and fire/inspections report for the Month of December 2019. She also thanked the public for their support of her and looks forward to serving the people for the next 4 years.

Commissioner Wooten gave the street department report for December 2019, stating that 60 work orders had been completed. Cleaning up of the streets and removal of the Christmas lights have been done.

Commissioner Powell gave the attached parks/rec report for the month of December 2019.

Mayor Case reported that the regional commission would be getting back to regular meetings this month. They do not meet during the Holidays.

Marshana Sharp represented the Library and reported they will be having an event January 30th at 6:00 p.m. called kiss the ground and will be a local farmer explaining ways to get the soil ready for planting season. Also, the library has a photo center where you can have prints made up to 24X36. They also can make digital images of slides, and VHS.

Carey Anderson was present and discussed changes in the Dade County Chamber. They will be meeting Thursday; William Back has been working to get their certification back. They have an excited group who are ready to move forward.
