WORKSHOP

1. Approval of Agenda.
2. Approval of previous minutes from January 10, 2022 regular meeting.
3. Board Appointments/Proclamations –
4. SPLOST/ Capital equipment
 - A. City Park restroom improvement to leave open year around and picnic table replacement. Commissioner Powell has obtained quotes and presented to commission for the following:
 - *Picnic Tables: Barco Products to replace the picnic tables that had to be removed. Quote from Barco was \$7132.00 with handicap accessibility and 5 tables with plastic coating.
 - *Electrical Work: Tri-State Electrical Contractors with a quote of \$3295.00 to include 80cfm Exhaust Fans and Installation for each restroom and 100amp panel and Installation in the attic of restrooms.
 - *Doors for Restrooms: Marter Garage Doors with quote of \$1840.00 to include 2 Commercial door closures, 2 Door pulls, and insulating attic.
 - *Heat/Air unit: 72 Degrees with quote of \$2750.00 to include unit, duct work, return and thermostat.
 - B. Police Department Patrol Car Purchase was not discussed.
5. Resolution Joint Trenton-Dade Hazzard Mitigation Plan (R2022-1)
 - *Mayor Case went over the status of the Joint Trenton-Dade County Hazzard Mitigation Plan and stated this plan is part of the Stafford Act allowing funding for natural, technological, and man-made disasters to help with the damage to city roads, debris and uninsured citizens. The funding would be 85% to 15% however the money must be paid in full then reimbursed. The Board of Commissioners of Dade County and representatives from Dade Emergency Management Agency held public hearings on November 7, 2019 and was placed on hold due to COVID. The 2020 Plan was approved on December 6, 2021. The next public hearing to review and discus the draft was held on February 3, 2022. The 3rd and final public hearing was held February 15, 2022 and the Plan was adopted.
6. Distilled Spirits: Discussion on Distilled Spirits was held that brought up several concerns such as the store must be zoned for the area built, security use of cameras and access by police department, the advertising in the windows, fees to open the store such as licensing, nothing else is to be sold in the store and age to enter the store.

Mayor Case stated zoning concerns will be talked about in the Planning Committee meeting on Thursday at 5:30 pm. It was decided by commission to have a work session meeting in March. Commission agreed on March 1, 2022 at 5:30 pm.

Commissioner Norris gave the Police Department report for the month of January 2022. Commissioner Powell gave the parks/rec report for the month of January 2022.

Commissioner Wooten spoke in regards to LMIG money. The streets currently going to be paved will be West Crabtree due to it being heavily used and problems with it at this time. Commissioner Wooten also mentioned the next roadway would be Lookout Circle.

Mayor Case gave the fire and utilities report for Commissioner Houts in her absence.

Mayor Case read the financial reports for the month of January 2022. He will be meeting with engineers on Wednesday in regards to ARPA Sewer Plant upgrades and contract. They have ran into issue with the new truck for parks department and it as decided to wait on the 2022 trucks to be available. Mayor Case spoke to Dade County in regards to the SPLOST payments and according the Rebecca she will be mailing out a check this week which will be actually 3 payments so the amount in the account should be correct by next meeting.

A motion was made by Commissioner Norris and seconded by Commissioner Powell to accept the January 2022 Financials. All in favor. Motion carried.

Mayor Case provided update on Regional Comprehensive Plan that an online survey will be going out to the public as well as working with services such as food banks, senior citizen building, meals on wheels, school and local churches to assist in completing the survey. The survey will be for input on community improvement and grants

6. APPEARANCES



Mindy Howard from Dade County Library was not present.


