Core Values

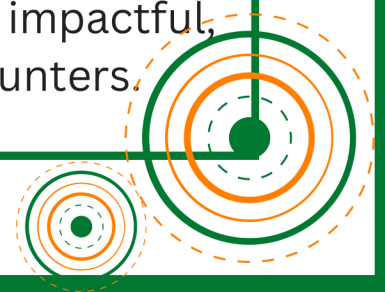
Collaboration: Partnering with individuals and organizations to pool resources, promote community building, and advocate for equity.

Integrity: Acting with clarity, honesty, and transparency in serving others and managing the resources entrusted to our care.

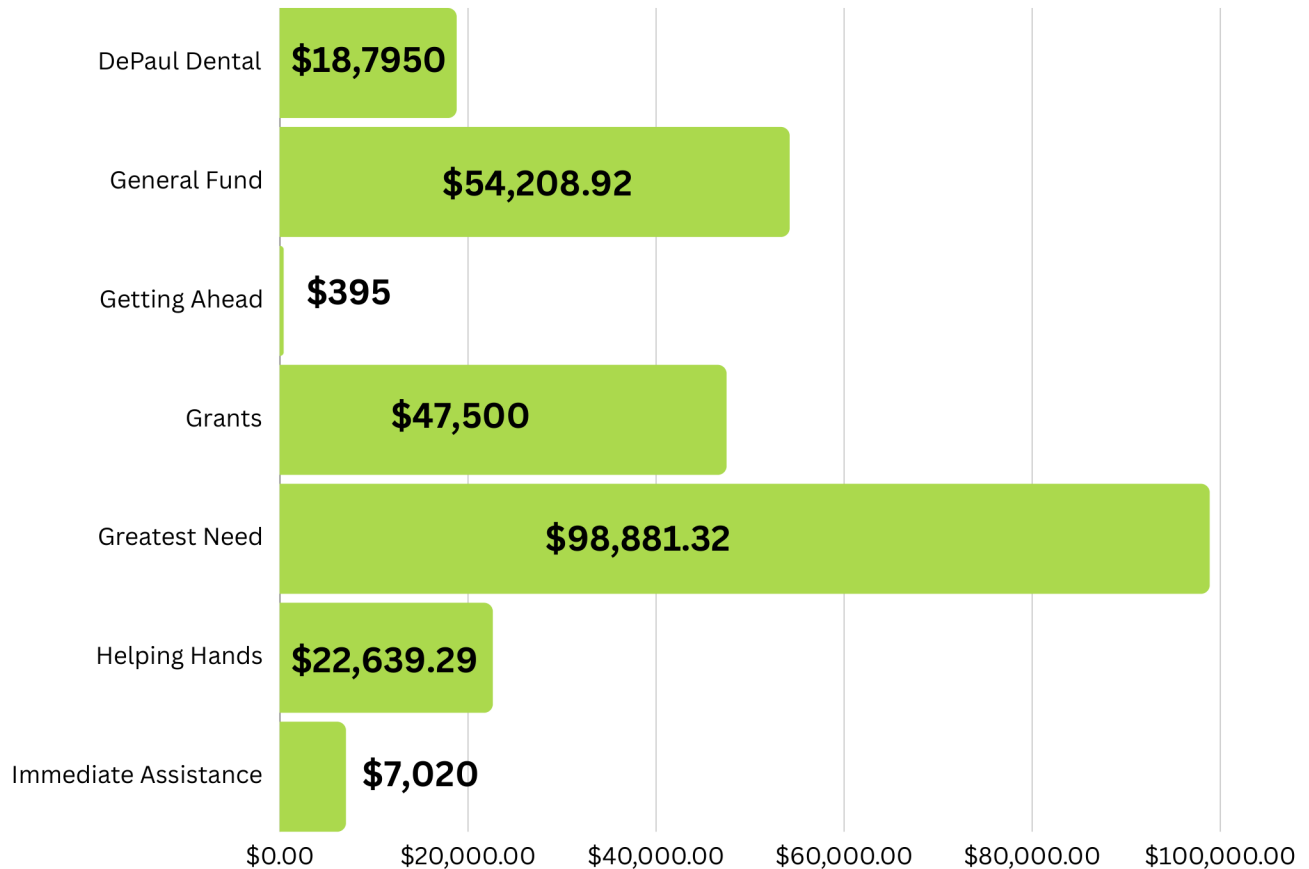

SETON FAMILY STORE

Seton Center operates a high-quality secondhand store staffed by paid employees and volunteers. We rely upon the generous donations of clean, sellable goods and continue to remain appreciative of the support of our community!

Revenue from the SFS covers many of the operational expenses of Seton Center, as well as help fund Outreach programs. SFS also offers vouchers for in-store merchandise to families in need, hosts charity drives and collections for partner agencies, and donates unsold merchandise to other organizations for their use or resale.

In FY23, we served 14,963 customers, a 6.75% increase.

Seton Center could not have a successful mission without the dedication and commitment of our volunteer team!
