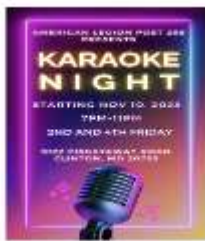

What makes Vet Centers unique?

Non-traditional hours (including evenings and weekends), services without time limitation and at no charge. Individuals do not need to be enrolled in VA Healthcare Services, do not need a disability rating or service connection, and can access Vet Center services regardless of discharge character.

What makes Vet Centers different than VA's Mental Health?

While Vet Centers are not a part of Mental Health in the VAMCs, they are connected through coordination and bi-directional referral. Vet Center staff are licensed professionals who offer a non-medical approach to counseling and do not provide medication management.

Vet Center Call Center

1-877-WAR-VETS is an around the clock, confidential call center, where combat Veterans and their families, can call to talk about their military experiences or any other issue they are facing in their readjustment to civilian life. The staff is comprised of combat Veterans from several eras, as well as family members of combat Veterans. This benefit is prepaid through the Veteran's military service.
