Not ready for the burn pile quite yet

I inherited some old Adirondack chairs a few years ago. At the time, I reasoned that with a light sanding and a new coat of paint, these could be nice chairs. When my "light sanding" peeled off heavy layers of paint, I knew I was in for more work than I had planned. I persisted, though, using a power washer to take off the large stuff and an orbital sander to smooth it out. After two coats of oil-based primer, two coats of top paint, and many hours of labor, my wife asked why I didn't just buy new chairs. Fair question.



The answer was that this became a challenge I had to conquer. The amount of time or money I was putting into the chairs quickly became irrelevant. I simply had to win. While power-washing, sanding, priming and painting, I couldn't help but think about what these old chairs had been through, and I smiled as I thought how similar they are to the human body.

Each layer of paint represents memories for someone. These are the experiences the prior owners had, much like the clothes we choose to wear on our bodies. Sometimes old and worn. Sometimes faded. Sometimes needing repaired. Sometimes needing replaced. But we also sometimes hang on to them, often by needle and thread or with a new accessory to make the old appear new again. Even so, each layer — each color — represents a specific stage of life.

Underneath those layers of paint, I found a few damaged boards that needed repair broken bones, you might call them. Despite the fix, they are not quite the same. The repaired pieces don't blend in with the others, but they do keep the old chairs usable, at least for a while.

Securing these boards were a bunch of rusty screws — the joints of the chairs. At first, they were shiny, new and sharp, made to hold the bones together. Over time, they weakened, became discolored and even broke off. So, in a surgical DIY effort, I took a few of the worst ones out, and I screwed in shiny, new, sharp ones again.

While putting in the new screws, I realized that some of the core wood was soft and rotten, no longer able to do what it was intended to do. The shiny, new, sharp screws couldn't hold that mush together anymore. Repair was no longer an option. These vital boards — the organs of my chairs — needed replaced immediately.

I did the work to these chairs a few years ago, and I am proud to say they are still standing today. Sure, the paint is peeling in spots again, and a few more repairs are needed, but they are usable. My wife says they need to be discarded, maybe even set aflame. I am not ready to throw them in the burn pile just yet. Like most of us, with a little TLC, they have a few more good years left in them.




When Jess and Jon Severson moved into their Waukee home in 2022, the new home offered an unfinished basement. The builder had only one basement option, which they declined.

The couple says the remodel was ideal.


"It was super easy and super quick. When you do a remodel, you think it will take too long," Jon says. "We stayed on budget and on schedule. We're lucky."

Remodeling with a budget in mind

Modern décor gives new look to living room and kitchen.



With an eye for design, Cheryl Baumgarten enjoys changing the décor of her home while keeping an eye on the budget.

(Editor's note: The following is about the author, Joe Baumgarten, and his wife, Cheryl's, remodeling experiences.)

Cheryl Baumgarten would describe her design style as "modern, but on a budget." Since the Baumgartens moved into their Urbandale home in 2021, they have followed that model to make some significant improvements.

"The kitchen was mostly as we wanted: granite countertops, white cabinets, a large island, backsplashing, etc. It was the walls and the floors that desperately needed help," Joe says.

"The upstairs had solid wood flooring, but it was a very dark brown and had been damaged by the prior resident's dog," Cheryl explains.

She chose a lighter tan manufactured wood that now covers every room on the main floor except for the laundry and bathrooms.

"It lightens up the living space, giving it the appearance of being much larger," Joe adds.

The entire basement was covered with an outdated and worn carpet that was replaced by tan-colored LVP flooring.

"It has a much cleaner look and helps keep our allergies from flaring," Joe says.

One of their favorite rooms in the house is the three-sided sunroom with a see-through fireplace. In addition to the new paint and floors, blinds and new marble tile around the fireplace were added to the room.

"Every single room in the house was painted the same 'contractor beige'; it was so dull," Cheryl says. "I chose a medium gray for most of the rooms. Fortunately, Joe was able to repaint all three bathrooms and three of the bedrooms himself. He did a great job, and that saved us a good amount of money."

The savings were used to hire professionals to paint the kitchen, living room, master bedroom, stairwell and family room.

"All of those rooms connected and had too much height and too much trim for me to tackle," Joe says.

Pruisners start from scratch with master bathroom.

When the Pruisners purchased their Ankeny home nine years ago, they knew it would need to be completely remodeled and updated.

One of the highlights for the couple is the new master bathroom.

"The bathroom was all my vision," Pruisner

says. "I absolutely love interior/exterior design and was so excited to do this project. I knew we were starting from scratch, as we demolished it down to the studs, so I had free range on the design."

She wanted to have a wet room, which kept the shower and tub separate, and the rest just kind of fell into place. She decided on a modern farmhouse style and chose neutral grays for the space. The floors are tile, and the shower walls are marble. White bowl sinks and gray cabinets complete the look.

The Pruisners purchased everything prior to

construction starting, so the overall project went smoothly.

They most recently finished adding a covered front porch and additional backyard landscaping.

Pruisner advises folks to be prepared for the ups and downs that come with any construction project.

"Sometimes it works out exactly as planned, and sometimes you have to make quick changes to the plan to make it all work out," she says. "But, overall, it's so worth it in the end."



"If I have a party, people can put drinks on them," she explains. "I can put my stereo on one of them."






"I started with the driveway and then my garage floor just looked terrible. It was all pitted from salt or that brine they use on the roads in the wintertime," she says.
