

Deer hunting debate

County commissioners weigh rifle or shotgun zone

As Stearns County commissioners prepare to decide whether deer hunters can use rifles county-wide, the discussion has grown beyond questions of firearms and safety, revealing deeper tensions about tradition, technology and who should ultimately make wildlife policy decisions.

A change in Minnesota law allows deer hunters to use legal rifles and shotguns throughout the state, beginning the 2026 firearms season. Current shotgun-only counties, however, have the ability to pass an ordinance to keep existing restrictions.

That compromise has left county boards across Minnesota in the middle of a divided debate.

The Stearns County Board of Commissioners is hosting a public hearing on the matter at 6 p.m. April 7 at Melrose City Hall in Melrose. The hearing comes ahead of the commissioners' May ordinance deadline.

"We're kind of in a predicament," said Steve Notch, board chair and 5th District representative. "You've got half the people saying keep shotgun and half saying rifle is fine."

According to white tail deer management history from the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, shotgun-only hunting zones were created in the 1970s after deer populations in Minnesota dropped in the late 1960s. Limiting firearm range was viewed as both a conservation and safety measure.

Stuart Austing is a longtime gunsmith, avid hunter and owner of Iron Horse Trading Co. in Albany. He said the current debate is something he has heard before.

"This isn't a new argument," said Austing, a resident of Birchdale Township. "It's something that's come up again and again as technology changed and people started asking whether the old rules still matched how hunting actually works."

Earlier restrictions reflected a different era of hunting, Austing said. Fewer deer, different firearms and larger groups that drove deer across open farmland were more common than they are today, he said.

Austing said one

of the biggest misconceptions is how modern firearms are compared with those used when shotgun-only zones were first established.

"Growing up, we were all taught that slugs and shotguns were safer than rifles," he said. "In that same breath, people have been spending their lives getting better and better shotguns and trying to get them to perform like rifles."

Traditional slugs once limited both accuracy and effective distance, Austing said. Today, rifled barrels and modern slugs allow shotgun hunters to achieve accuracy and ranges far beyond what earlier generations experienced, he said.

Modern deer rifles are typically used within controlled distances, especially in wooded or rolling farmland common across Central Minnesota, Austing said.

"The equipment has changed, but so has how people hunt," Austing said. "A lot of this discussion is based on what hunting looked like 30 or 40 years ago."

Much of the public debate has centered on whether rifles are capable of longer ranges and if they pose greater risks in populated agricultural areas.

According to the MN DNR, available data does not show firearm type as a primary safety factor.

"We didn't have safety concerns about it," said Joe Albert, communications coordinator for the MN DNR. "From a wildlife management standpoint, we can manage deer populations regardless of what legal firearm is used."

Hunting incidents have steadily declined for decades, Albert said. This, he said, is largely due to mandatory firearm safety education and im-

proved hunter training.

"At the end of the day, safe handling practices matter more than the type of firearm," Albert said.

Enforcement can become more complicated when neighboring counties adopt different rules, creating potential confusion for hunters traveling between areas, Albert said.

There is a patchwork of acceptance already beginning to emerge as some counties throughout Minnesota are making decisions on whether to allow the shotgun-only zones to continue or follow the state's rifle recommendations.

Ben Wiechman, a hunter who lives in Melrose Township, hunts in three to four area counties going through the decision-making process. Wiechman wanted to track the decisions of the counties he hunts in. Shortly after he started, Wiechman said, he decided to compile a public spreadsheet tracking the decision-making process of Minnesota's 61 counties either entirely or partially in a shotgun-only zone.

"It was surprisingly hard to find information," he said. "You had to dig through agendas and meeting minutes county by county."

As of March 2, only three counties, including Stearns County's western neighbor, Pope County, have opted to stay with shotgun-only zones. In Wiechman's following of meeting minutes, calls to county offices and watching of meeting livestreams, he found 22 counties will allow rifles, and the remaining counties, like Stearns County, still have a decision ahead.

A common theme he noticed was frustration among local officials.

"A lot of commissioners don't feel equipped to make this decision," Wiechman said. "They feel like they've been pushed into the middle of their neighbors over something that probably should have been decided at the state level."

For hunters who cross county lines each season, inconsistent rules can create confusion.

Sauk Centre Conservation Club member and area hunter Andy Uphus said the divide sometimes feels arbitrary.

"I hunt both (shotgun-only) zone, just north of Sauk Centre, and I hunt with rifles by Wadena," Uphus said. "I do both on basically the same landscape. So, to me, it's just this imaginary line that separates the rifle and the (shotgun-only) zones."

Uphus has taught firearm safety, and Wiechman has mentored youth hunters.

They agreed rifles can make it easier to introduce new hunters to the sport. Shotguns often produce heavier recoil and are louder, which can make training youth hunters more difficult and increase costs due to expensive ammunition.

Uphus said he feels as though no matter what the weapon being used is, the sport is safe. But he said nothing is ever certain, and, for him, the discussion boils down to basic safety.

"You follow the general rules of firearm safety," Uphus said. "Know your target and what is beyond it. It doesn't matter what you are hunting with."

The upcoming public hearing, Notch said, is intended to gather community feedback before a final vote in early May.

Notch said he encourages those in favor or opposed to a rifle zone in Stearns County to submit a letter either as a collective group or a township as a whole to share their feelings on the matter. Doing so will ensure as many opinions are considered as possible.

"You just hope that people understand why the decision was made," Notch said.

As counties across Minnesota reach different conclusions, Stearns County hunters can be assured they have a voice as the process continues, he said.

Clicks carry risk

Local experts explain online safety

The first week of March each year is recognized nationally as Consumer Protection Week, and Thursday during that week is known as Slam the Scam Day.

As technology advances and artificial intelligence becomes more visible online, scams and digital fraud continue to grow and become more difficult to spot. But locally, investigators said many crimes still rely less on technology and more on strategy to catch others off guard.

"We still see a lot of the old-fashioned methods," said Zach Sorenson, investigative lieutenant with the Stearns County Sheriff's Office. "People impersonating businesses, asking for money or personal information — those are still the most common."

While concerns arise over AI-generated deep-fakes — manipulated videos or audio — Sorenson said those tools have not yet played a major role in reported cases locally.

"We're aware of AI and what it's capable of, but close to home, we're not seeing it driving a

large number of fraud cases," he said. "That doesn't mean it isn't happening elsewhere, but, right now, most of what we investigate looks pretty traditional."

Law enforcement is watching closely as technology evolves.

"It's kind of a two-way street," Sorenson said. "People trying to take advantage of citizens are learning how to use new tools, and we're trying to understand and use those same tools to investigate and solve crimes."

According to Sorenson, the most effective protection remains vigilance.

One of the most common scams involves messages that appear to come from trusted institutions such as banks or local businesses. Sorenson said fraudsters often use email addresses or phone numbers that closely resemble legitimate ones.

"If something comes in asking you to move money or provide private information, verify it," he said. "Call the local branch directly using a number you already have,

not the one provided in the message."

Other warning signs include requests to send cash, purchase gift cards or mail money through couriers — tactics Sorenson said are almost always scams.

"If you're being asked to send large amounts of cash or disguise payments in the mail, you should be very suspicious," he said.

Logan Gruber, re-founder and marketing director of Blue Ox Websites & Marketing, said AI has changed the scale of scams more than the strategy.

"Scammers have always existed," Gruber said. "The difference now is how fast they can reach people and how many they can reach at once."

AI allows fraudulent emails, messages and fake content to be produced in massive quantities. Even poorly written scams can succeed if only a small percentage of people respond.

"You look at some and think, 'How could anyone fall for this?'" he said. "But if 1% of people do, that's enough to make money."

Gruber said deep-

fakes are often created using AI tools and can make false content appear convincing. However, many misleading posts online are designed simply to generate attention and advertising revenue rather than directly steal money.

"The motive is often eyeballs," he said. "More views means more value."

Despite advancements in technology, both experts said most scams succeed through human psychology.

Social engineering or impersonating trusted organizations and creating urgency remains one of the biggest threats.

"Speed is what gets people," Gruber said. "If someone pressures you to act immediately, that's a red flag. Take a breath and verify."

That advice aligns with law enforcement recommendations. Sorenson said criminals rely on confusion or distraction, hoping victims act before thinking.

Sorenson and Gruber agreed that there are habits that decrease risk, such as contacting a business directly to confirm suspicious requests; checking email addresses and website domains; enabling two-factor authentication on accounts using a pass-phrase instead of short passwords; freezing credit reports when not actively applying for loans; reviewing bank and credit card statements; and limiting personal information shared publicly online.

Gruber said it is smart to review privacy settings on social media and payment apps, noting that publicly visible transactions or personal details can unintentionally reveal sensitive information.

As more daily life moves online, opportunities for fraud continue to grow. The increase, Gruber said, is tied as much to digital habits as to new technology itself.


"The more people (there are) living behind screens, the more opportunities there are," Gruber said.

For Sorenson, the takeaway remains straightforward.

"Don't necessarily trust everything," he said. "Verify everything — especially when money or personal information is involved."

And in an era defined by instant communication, both agree the most powerful defense is slowing down.
