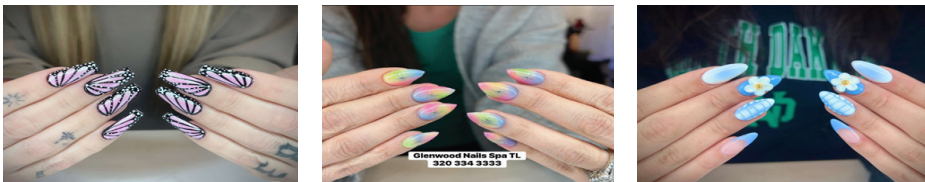


ents, many of whom have become more like friends and extended family. That sense of connection has led to a heartfelt and meaningful gesture from the community.

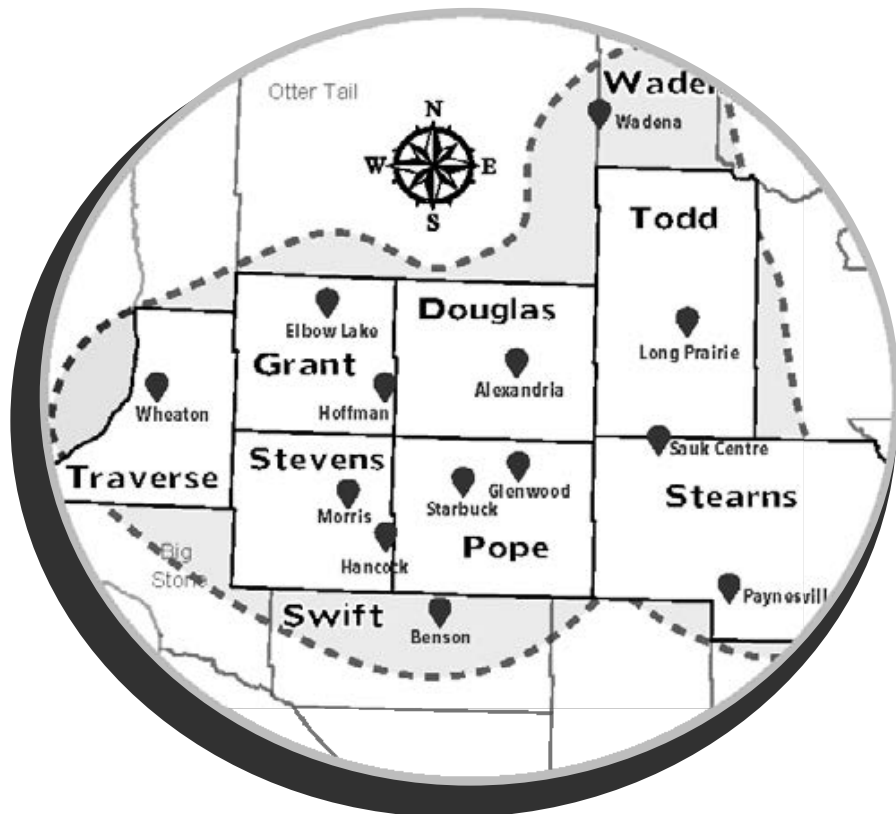

# Anhydrous safety should be a top priority this spring

The MDA reminds farmers and applicators to stay vigilant when working with NH3

As spring fieldwork ramps up across Minnesota, many farmers and applicators will soon begin applying anhydrous ammonia (NH3). With tight weather windows and increasing pressure to get into fields, the Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA) urges everyone who handles NH3 to make safety their top priority. Accidents involving anhydrous ammonia can result in severe, life threatening injuries when proper precautions are not

followed.

"Spring fieldwork moves quickly, and we know farmers and applicators are working hard to make the most of every weather window," said Thom Petersen, Minnesota Commissioner of Agriculture. "Taking a few extra minutes to check equipment, wear proper protective gear, and slow down can prevent serious injuries. We want every farmer and applicator to get home safe at the end of the day."

The MDA offers the following safety reminders for farmers, applicators and those performing equipment maintenance:

- Always wear appropriate goggles and gloves; never wear contact lenses around NH3.

- Keep at least 5 gallons of clean emergency water easily accessible at all times.

- Assume all hoses and lines contain product and use caution when connecting or disconnecting.

- Stand upwind when connecting, disconnecting, bleeding lines, or transferring product.

- When stopping work or disconnecting equipment, close valves, bleed lines, disconnect, and secure hoses. Handle hose-end valves by the valve

body only.

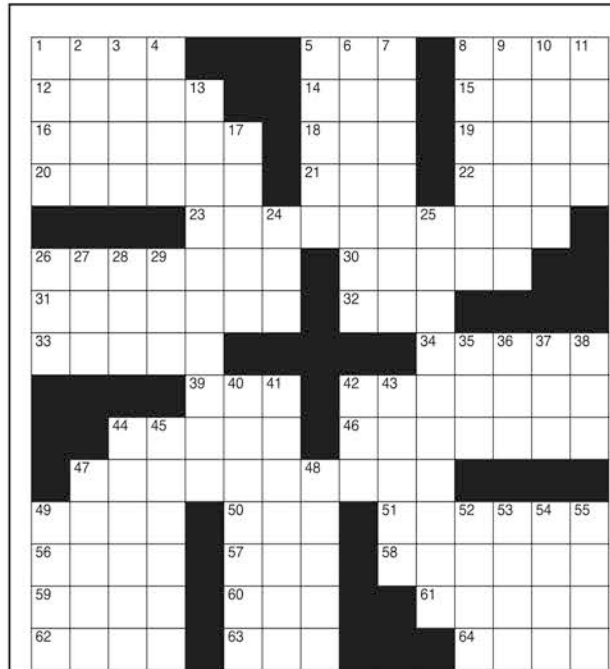
- Whenever possible, place equipment away from homes, people, and livestock.

Safe transport of anhydrous ammonia is equally important. When towing a nurse tank, operators should drive no faster than 30 miles per hour, display a clean and visible slow moving vehicle emblem, and secure the tank with two independent safety chains in addition to the standard hitch pin and clip.

If an accident or spill occurs, call 911 immediately. Then contact the Minnesota Duty Officer at 800 422 0798 or 651 649 5451.

## First Red Flag Warning issued for 2026

### Wildfire dangers increased with dry and winding conditions

Warm, dry and windy weather has combined to raise the wildfire danger for western Minnesota. Those conditions have resulted in Red Flag Warnings and burning restrictions.

Through the morning of March 31, the Benson area has recorded 1.37 inches of precipitation for the month. Much of it came March 15, when 7 inches of snow fell, containing 8 tenths of an inch of precipitation.

March averages 1.59 inches of precipitation, so the month's total is 22 hundredths below the average.

More significantly, there has only been 2 tenths of an inch of precipitation since March 15. At the same time, the area has seen several days with winds gusting to over 30 mph throughout the day and temperatures that have been above average.

Temperatures the past two weeks have been well above average, aiding the drying out of grasses in the area. Since March 18, highs have averaged 56.2 degrees compared to the historic average of 42.8 degrees – a 13.2 degree difference.

March 21 saw a record high of 72 degrees, breaking the old record of 66 degrees set in 2012. The average high for the date is 41 degrees.

March 25 the area saw the high reach 70 degrees tying the record high set in 2004. It reached 70 degrees Monday, but that high fell short of the 78-degree high recorded March 30, 1963.

Lows at 27.8 degrees have been 3.3 degrees above the average of 24.5 degrees for the period.

"The combination of warmer temperatures near 60, very low relative humidity values between 15% to 20%, southwest winds gusting from 35 to 45 mph, and dry fuels will lead to critical fire weather conditions across central and southern Minnesota Saturday," the NWS said as last weekend approached.

"Any fires that develop will spread rapidly. Outdoor burning is not recommended," it said.

Among the counties under the Red Flag Warning were Stevens, Pope, Swift, Chippewa, Kandiyohi and Douglas.

That Red Flag Warning was followed this past

Sunday by Minnesota Department of Natural Resources announcing it was restricting the open burning of vegetative debris starting Monday, March 30.

It is putting the restrictions in place due to increased wildfire risk resulting from warm temperatures and dry conditions in parts of central, northwest, and northeast Minnesota.

The restrictions apply to the following area counties:

Douglas, Grant, Otter Tail, Pope, Stevens, Traverse, and Wilkin. So far, Swift County is not mentioned despite its dry conditions.

The DNR will not issue permits for open burning of brush or yard waste in these counties until restrictions are lifted.

"Wildfire risk increases each year after the snow melts and before vegetation greens up," said Karen Harrison, DNR wildfire prevention specialist. "Spring burning restrictions help reduce the number of wildfires, especially those caused by debris burning."

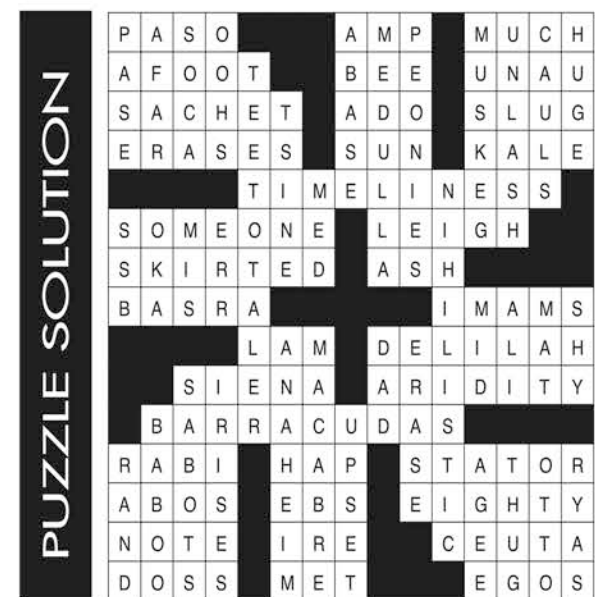
Harrison encourages people to use other methods to handle yard waste, such as composting, chipping or taking brush to a collection site. People cause more than 90% of wildfires in Minnesota. If a fire rekindles or escapes, the person who set it is liable for any damage caused, as well as for the costs of wildfire suppression.

Burning restrictions will be adjusted as conditions change. Snowfall is in the forecast for Wednesday night through Friday, which could lessen the fire danger and bring needed moisture to the soil.

# Farm custom rates expected to rise

Due to the high cost of investment in farm machinery, an ever-increasing number of farm operations are hiring others to provide some or all of their machinery resources.

This is especially true with new and younger farm operators, as well as with children that decide to start farming with their parents.

In addition, some land investors are choosing to operate a farm themselves rather than cash renting the land to someone else, thus hiring another farm operator under a custom farming agreement.

Custom farming agreements usually include tillage, planting, some weed control, harvesting, and delivering grain to a specified location. Some farm operators also hire custom work for specific farm operations such as planting, combining, or tillage. Some negotiate these types of custom rate and custom farming arrangements prior to planting each year, while others wait until harvest is completed.

One of the best resources for average custom rates is the annual "Iowa Farm Custom Rate Survey" that is coordinated and analyzed by Iowa State University. Earlier this year, 205 custom operators and farm managers responded to the 2026 survey, submitting nearly 4,700 expected custom farm rates for various farm operations.

It should be noted that custom rate survey was completed prior to the initiation of the conflict in Iran, which may result in custom operators adjusting their final custom rates by year-end, in order to more fully reflect any changes in fuel

The survey summary lists the average and median custom rate, as well as a range, for various tillage, planting, fertilizer and chemical application, grain harvesting, and forage harvesting functions on the farm.

The median rate, which is most commonly used in custom rate negotiations, means that half of the reported rates were higher and half were lower than the listed rate.

The survey also includes custom farming rates for corn and soybeans, as well as many miscellaneous farming practices, average per hour farm labor rates, and includes a formula for calculating rental rates.

The average custom rates for farm operations in most areas of the Upper Midwest tend to be very close to the Iowa rates.

Average 2026 farm custom rates for some typical tillage, planting, and harvesting practices, as well as custom farming rates, are listed in the following table. The complete 2026 "Iowa Farm Custom Rate Survey" for all farming practices is available on-line at the following Iowa State University web site:

### Rising custom rates

Based on the Iowa survey, the average custom rates for harvest operations in 2026 were expected to increase by nearly 6.5% compared to the rates in 2025.

The average custom rates for tillage, planting, and other pre-harvest operations are expected to increase by about 8.5%.

Custom farming rates for corn and soybean production are expected to increase slightly compared to a year earlier, following an increase of nearly 20% in recent years.

The cost for new and used machinery increased in

2025, along with continued high repair costs, labor charges, and interest rates.

All listed custom rates in the Iowa survey results include fuel, labor, repairs, depreciation, insurance, and interest, unless listed as rental rates or otherwise specified. The average price for diesel fuel was assumed to be \$2.89 per gallon.

A fuel price increase 50 cents per gallon would likely cause most custom rates to increase by approximately 5%.

These average or median rates are only meant to be a guide for custom rates, as actual custom rates charged may vary depending on changes in fuel costs, availability of custom operators, timeliness, field size, etc.

There are also many other specific situations among farmers and family members that share farm machinery that could also lead to adjustments in final custom rates.

Following are the median custom rates for some common farming practices for 2026, as well as the range of custom rates listed, based on the Iowa survey.

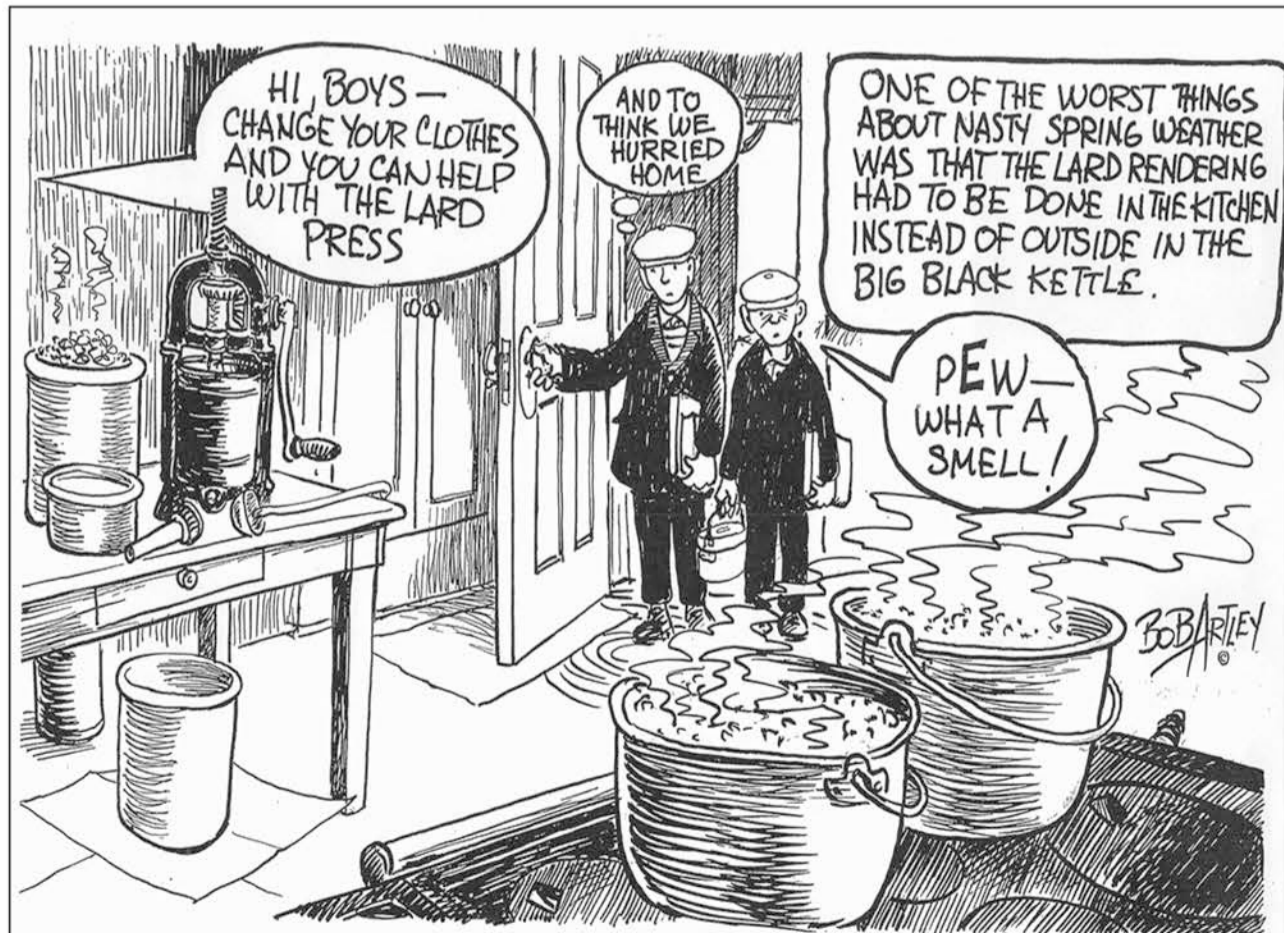
