Minutes**





- 1. Luna called the meeting to order**
- 2. Luna led the Pledge of Allegiance**
- 3. Arthur gave the Invocation**
- 4. Financials:** Kerber made a motion to approve the Financials as presented. Johnson seconded the motion. Luna asked if there was any discussion, and there was none. Luna called for a vote, and all voted in favor of the motion.
- 5. Minutes:** Johnson made a motion to approve the Minutes as presented. Arthur seconded the motion. Luna asked if there was any discussion, and there was none. Luna called for a vote, and all voted in favor of the motion.
- 6. Citizens Comments:** none
- 7. Resolution 26-366 Appoint Billy Ostermann Delinquent Tax Attorney:** Johnson made a motion to appoint Billy Ostermann as Delinquent Tax Attorney. McClintock seconded the motion. Luna asked if there was any discussion, and there was none. Luna called or a vote, and all voted in favor of the motion. Passed 4-0.
- 8. Resolution 26-367 Penny Discontinuance Policy:** Brandon explained the Tennessee Comptroller is encouraging all municipalities, counties, and utility districts to adopt a resolution to discontinue pennies for cash transactions since pennies are no longer being produced. He stated as an example if it is forty-three (43) cents it will be rounded up to forty-five (45) cents and if it is forty-two cents (\$0.42), it will be rounded down to forty cents (\$0.40). He added it will probably be less than one dollar (\$1.00) annually. Kerber made a motion to adopt Resolution 26-367 Penny Discontinuance Policy. Arthur seconded the motion. Luna asked if there was any discussion, and there was none. Luna called for a vote, and all voted in favor of the motion. Passed 4-0.
- 9. Resolution 26-368 Authorizing contract with Advanced Paving for paving Town Hall parking lot and portions of Beechwood Avenue:** Brandon stated there were four (4) bids received and opened. He stated Advanced Paving was the lowest bidder and they have done work for the town before and did a great job. Advanced Paving bid \$46,700, Pulaski Paving \$62,000, Rogers

Group \$98,000 and Smith Construction \$138,000. He stated he does not believe Rogers or Smith looked at the bid specs very closely. He stated he put the language in the Resolution to be broad enough if there is leftover product and there is enough money, he would like to pave Spencer Alley and East Austin Alley while the contractor is in town. McClintock made a motion to approve Resolution 26-368 to contract with Advanced Paving to pave the Town Hall parking lot, parts of Beechwood Avenue, Spencer Alley, and East Austin Alley. Johnson seconded the motion. Luna asked if there was any discussion, and there was none. Luna called for a vote, and all voted in favor of the motion. Passed 4-0


10. Other Business: Brandon stated the Zoning Map has been completed and has been uploaded to the website.
