The body convened in open session as the Municipal Board of Canvassers (MBOC) and the Local Board of Canvassers (LBOC) at 8:00 p.m.

Chief Inspector Schwanz directed Clerk/Treasurer Hauri to read the opening statement.

It was verified that the display on the voting machine indicated 28 ballots cast. The seals on the Election Data, Power, Printer, and Accessories doors were all intact. The numbers on the seals were compared to the numbers recorded on the Inspectors' Statement and were confirmed to be the same.

The polls were closed on the voting machine. Official Results reports were printed, and the machine was turned off. The seal was broken on the printer, and all printed tape was removed from the printer. The seal was broken on the cartridge door, and the cartridge was removed. The seals on the accessories door and power door were removed. The printer, accessories, and voting machine were enclosed in their respective carrying cases.

The two poll lists were compared and the certification pages (EL-107) were completed.

There was 1 Election Day registration.

There were no provisional ballots cast.

There were 2 absentee ballots issued. One ballot was returned and processed prior to the closing of the polls. No absentee ballots were rejected.

On Election Day, 0 electors chose to vote via paper ballot; therefore, a total of 1 elector voted by paper ballot.

The ballot box was unlocked, and the ballot was removed.

The number of ballots cast (29) were compared to the number of voters (29).

The paper ballot was tallied on the tally sheets (EL-105). The totals from the Official Results report were then added to the tally sheets. All tally sheets were signed and reviewed for accuracy.

The Election Night Call-In sheet was completed.

Results were phoned in to the Richland County Clerk's office and Richland School District.

The Inspectors' Statement (EL-104) was completed and reviewed for accuracy.

The EL-106 to certify Village of Boaz race results was completed and reviewed for accuracy.

It was verified that the voting machine Zero Proof reports and the Official Results reports were signed.

The voted paper ballot and voted machine ballots (machine tape) were placed in the plastic bag for Richland County and sealed shut. The bag was signed and dated.

All materials to be retained by the Village were placed in the Spring Election 2024 envelope to be filed in the Clerk's office.

All materials to be submitted to the Richland County Clerk, were gathered and placed in the custody of Clerk/Treasurer Hauri.

All materials to be submitted to the Richland School District Clerk were gathered and placed in the custody of Clerk/Treasurer.

The American flag and sign for persons needing assistance were brought in from outside.

The Clerk/Treasurer issued payment to the Election Inspectors.

The meeting of the MBOC and LBOC ended at 10:00 p.m.
