FROM PASTOR BOB



Our Mission: To serve, love and grow in the ever-widening circle of Christ's grace. This is how we seek to live. And living in God's grace cannot be separated from a heart full of gratitude. The two go hand in hand. Awhile back, the magazine *Presbyterians Today* had on its cover the headline "Grace & Gratitude: We Love

Because God First Loved Us." The main article says grace and gratitude is a Presbyterian vision for the twenty-first century, and our response to God's love helps define what it means to be Presbyterian.

Charles Wiley in his article says, "The rhythm of grace and gratitude is key to understanding what it means to be Presbyterian. It is our Presbyterian accent on the gospel: all that we have is not by our earning but from God's love for us, and in response we say thank you by sharing that bread, that love, with others. We share it because the bread was never ours to begin with: it was and is God's."

We love because God loved us first. The image of God's hand reaching down to us as grace and our reaching up to God in faith and gratitude is powerful to me. I think grace and gratitude are a great description of who we are. It could be our tag line. If someone asks you what we believe or what makes us unique, you can say God's gift of overwhelming grace inspires us to live a life of gratitude. Grace and Gratitude—a vision of faithfulness.

Another article in the same magazine lists 17 ways to focus on grace and gratitude. I would like to share a few of them

with you. Two Sundays ago was Pentecost, the celebration of the gift of the Holy Spirit—a gift that calls us to go into the world living lives of grace and gratitude. Here are a few suggestions on living with grace and gratitude. Add some of your own.

- Write a letter to someone who has had a positive impact on your life.
 It's never too late to say thanks!
- Commit to doing at least one act of unconditional love per day. Then be grateful for being able to spread God's love in the world.
- Shift your focus from what you want to how much you already have—and give with thanksgiving.
- Encourage the congregation to sponsor a Community Appreciation Day.
- Look for beautiful things that are often overlooked. Jot down one observation and one thing you are thankful for on your calendar each day.
- Begin your prayer time with thankfulness. We often start with asking God for help with a problem. Remember the prayer process: Help – Thanks – Wow!
- Identify people in the congregation or community who need a break: a single parent whose job and childcare responsibilities give them little free time, or someone whose days are full of caring for another and needs some free time.
