### FROM PASTOR BOB

May is a month of celebrations. In the McAulay household we celebrate birthdays, our anniversary, and Brendan's graduation. We celebrate Mother's Day. In Indianapolis the Indy 500 is a big celebration. In the church on May 20 we celebrate Pentecost, the gift of the coming of the Holy Spirit into the lives of the first disciples and our lives.

We tend to think of Pentecost as an ancient miracle that happened a long time ago, and we treat it with uncertainty, or fear, or we celebrate it without letting it impact our lives. Of all the persons of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit is the hardest to understand or feel comfortable about. I think it is because images associated with gifts of the Spirit like healings, miracles, and speaking in tongues are not as familiar to most of us. Yet all three parts of the Trinity are important for us to fully understand the nature and fullness of God. It is easier to get a handle on God the Creator, loving Parent or God the Son, who was human like us, and our savior, teacher, and redeemer. It is more difficult to get a handle on God the Holy Spirit. We only have images like wind—we can hear the sound of it and see the effects of it, but we do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So we tend not to pay as much attention to the Spirit part of the Trinity.

If we neglect the Spirit, we leave out an import part of who God is and what God does. We need all three parts of the Trinity to more fully understand the wonderful love, grace, power, and comfort of God. We do not completely neglect the Spirit. Every Sunday we are sent out into the world with the blessing of the love of God, the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit. We baptize in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The Trinity is at the heart of our faith and understanding of God. That is why we celebrate Pentecost—a celebration of the church that is sometimes seen as less important than Advent, Christmas, Lent, or Easter. But without the Spirit, the Church isn't fully alive and is sometimes dead.



Jesus called the Spirit the paraclete, which can be translated as advocate, comforter, intercessor, counselor, helper. The word paraclete comes from two smaller words that mean "called to the side of." Jesus promises to be in our presence in a new form. The disciples experienced the Spirit as a powerful transforming force moving through them. Fiery, windy, creative, voice-giving, truth-telling, singing, shouting, awakening, unquenchable—the very being of God shooting through the earth, through the church, through us. A power for good and renewal and resurrection, of healing and hope, of correction and cleansing and love, like no power human beings have ever encountered; the gift of God from Jesus so we could experience the fullness of God. Holy, wondrous, and amazing-the Spirit of God.
