December begins with Advent, celebrates Christmas, and looks with anticipation toward Epiphany. At least that is how it looks on the church calendar—but maybe not how the rest of the world looks at December. Have you ever thought about what it means that God came to earth in the form of a human being? God is after all bigger than we can imagine. Sounds scary or crazy right? That is what December in the Church is all about.

Advent begins with waiting. Developing the practice of waiting is hard to do in a society of instant gratification. We can get what we order on line the same day we ordered it. It seems crazy to some of us, but we expect it in today's world. Advent is the season we remind ourselves why we practice waiting, keeping at bay the voices that tell us that our waiting is fruitless. When we lose faith in our waiting, an immediate object of desire can distract us from the great calling to faithfully follow Christ. Waiting opens us up and sharpens our senses to the presence of God all around us. Without the practice of waiting, it would be too easy to miss the love of a mother for her child amidst all the violence. We could miss the compassion toward another in the midst of greed and selfcenteredness. If we do not wait, we miss the love, grace, hope, peace, and joy God is bringing us every day.

Advent tells us love is coming! Not just any kind of love, but agape love, unconditional love, love that is full of grace, gratitude, and hope. There a Crosby, Stills, Nash, and Young song titled *Carry On*. The refrain says: *Carry on. Love is coming. Love is coming to us all*. They may not have been talking about agape love, but it is a great phrase for Advent. Carry on in the midst of tragedy, loss, despair, hate, fear because we are celebrating the coming of the Love of God in the Person of Jesus Christ. Advent is a time of joyful anticipation. Advent is a time of confident hope. Why? Because love is coming! So carry on, love is coming to us all.

The driving force of Advent is hope. If we did not have anything to hope for, there would be no point to the season. The big hope is the Christ child that is born will bring justice and peace to all creation and heal the rift between humanity and God. This big hope is filled with smaller daily hopes that can shape us as disciples of Christ. Hope shapes relationships; a life of hope sees the good in others and is full of forgiveness and generosity toward others. Hope shapes what we do. As hopeful people, we work with fairness and integrity. Hope shapes our inner peace. A hopeful person lets go of anxiety, need for control, grasping, and anger. Hope leads us to faithfulness and celebration.

Christmas is the largest celebration around the world. The angel said that Christmas would bring "great joy...for all the people. Is that true for you? Is Christmas more of a hassle than a source of happiness? Perhaps paying attention to Advent would help. If we slow down a little and take time to reflect on the purpose of Christmas, we will experience the joy and celebration of Christmas. The good news of Christmas is worth celebrating.


Presbyterian Women's Christmas Luncheon
