FROM PASTOR BOB

When you have to say goodbye, what do you say? Saying goodbye involves grief. There is loss, denial, bargaining, anger, and acceptance. Part of how we say goodbye represents how we choose to live in the future. Who we were in the relationship that is now changed, or how ready we are to let go, impacts our



goodbye. When a congregation says goodbye and allows all the feelings, good and difficult, to be expressed, it prepares itself well for the future with a new pastor. My prayer and desire for us this month is we say goodbye well.

Jesus gives us an example of saying goodbye in what is called His "Farewell Discourse" in the gospel of John. Jesus tells his disciples to believe and trust in God—He is going to prepare a place for them and promises not to leave them alone because the Holy Spirit will be with them. The disciples respond with questions: "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" and "Lord, show us God, and we will be satisfied." Questions are a good response to transition in life.

Goodbyes call to mind the past so that a future is possible. I think that's one thing that Jesus emphasizes in these parting words to his disciples. You have done good work over the last 23 months and have much to celebrate. There is good energy in the congregation; a new class for 8 to 12 year-olds has begun; Messy church has added vitality to the worship and ministry of the church for a full year; Coffee and Conversations has given a new opportunity for adult bible study; there is more transparency about money and stewardship; the office staff is working well together to support the ministry of the church; the connections between Independence Academy, Parkview, and School 70 are as strong as they have ever been; and your future story is guiding your next steps. The future looks bright. I have seen and experienced this congregation as the Body of Christ. There has been suffering and there has been healing. We have shared hurt, anger, and pain. We have laughed together, grown together, and learned together. It has not been easy, but it has been good to spend time together learning to trust God at all times and in all things. Because we are the Body of Christ, we can grow in faith together as we experience the dying and rising of Christ in our own lives. The Easter promise of New Life in Christ is ours to claim and live.

I want to give thanks for the life we have shared in Christ. Our time together has been full of sharing, trying new ministries, laughing, praising, and serving God. For all you have shared with me and taught me, I thank you. The good memories are many. You have been very kind and supportive of me and Ondrea. I encourage you to build on your strengths of reaching out into the community and caring for one another. I encourage you to build on your strength of commitment of service to God and your neighbor by *Serving, loving and growing in the everwidening circle of Christ's grace.*

This month, our time of shared ministry will come to an end. But our time of service to God will not end. You will begin a new chapter in the life of FMHPC, and I will discern a new calling and my future ministry will carry with it the positive impact you have made on my life.
