### "VICTORY IN SPIRITUAL WARFARE

Spiritual warfare is defined as "the battle between Ultimate Good and Ultimate evil, between God and the devil, angels and demons, that goes on not only all around us, but also within us as well." It is nothing less than the battle for the earthly lives and eternal souls of every man, woman and child in Creation for control of Creation. Spiritual warfare is "the elephant in the room" that dare not be ignored in many individuals, families and even "church families" Otherwise, it becomes a "bull in the china shop" of our lives wreaking havoc within, among and all around us. It is a spiritual "DIS-EASE" that attacks our minds, bodies, spirits and relationships Like the flu, it's causes are unseen, although its effects are undeniable, miserable, contagious and potentially deadly. This spiritual "DIS-EASE" requires a true diagnosis and responds only to a "spiritual" cure. Before one takes the cure however, one must first trust Jesus, our Divine Physician and accept the diagnosis; that is that spiritual warfare is for real. Have you got the fever? God's got the cure. The following are some of the primary symptoms and signs that you are under spiritual attack and in trouble, for your self diagnosis:

- 1. A troubled soul only going through the motions of worship, prayer, Sunday school, study, fellowship and service, habitually, mechanically and joyously. The fire is warming or has gone out. This is experienced as a pulling away from God and His people for a bit or leaving altogether.
- 2. A troubled spirit- "Malaise", a general feeling of discomfort, discontent, uneasiness or pain that is experienced as anxiety, melancholy, unhappiness and depression about the people and things around you.
- 3. A troubled mind- confusion or doubt concerning what is right and wrong (loss of your moral compass). This is experienced as misunderstanding and misinterpreting the will of God and the motives of others; taking things out of context and making mountains out of mole hills.
- 4. A troubled heart-an unshakable sense of hopelessness and helplessness that devolves into fear, and is often expressed through unforgiveness, anger, judgmentalism, gossip and criticism of others.
- 5. A troubled life- it appears that most, if not all your life resources are drying up; (actually you are being robbed by demons). This is experienced as an overwhelming sense of hopelessness and helplessness that manifests itself in worry rather than worship.
- 6. Troubled relationships-brokenness between you and God (vertical relationship) and between you and others (horizontal relationship) expressed by harmful words spoken in anger, fear, envy, etc.

This is the "DIS-EASE". What is the cure? Join us for "Victory in Spiritual Warfare". The current study will end mid-April. Another will begin shortly thereafter in mid-June. You got the fever? God's got the cure!




### **FAMILY WEEK LUNCHEON**

## A Note from Stewardship

It is important that we all stay informed of the financial health of our Church. This note is to make everyone aware of what has happened since we borrowed and built our wonderful Fellowship Hall.

You may remember that we borrowed \$400,000. You may also remember that, in 2016, we refinanced our loan with the United Methodist Development Company (UMDEVCO) to get a lower interest rate. At the time of the refinancing, we had already reduced the original principal by 41% to \$229,514. Since then, we have made minimum as well as extra (principal) payments, except for the latter part of 2017. For those payments, we paid only the minimum monthly amount due to a decline in contributions. By the end of 2017, we had reduced our overall debt to \$211,552. That is an *overall reduction* of 47.1% of our original debt.

Our loan with UMDEVCO has what is called a "balloon" payment that is due on March 1<sup>st</sup> 2021. At that time, we will renegotiate the interest rate, which will probably be slightly higher than the current rate. For now, however, we are seeing slightly higher contributions and are hopeful that this trend increases, and we will be able to resume extra principal payments. The extra payments go directly to reducing our principal, avoiding significant interest payments and providing a tremendous reduction of our debt.

We are blessed as a congregation to have this wonderful Fellowship Hall where we and our community can meet, worship, and have fellowship. We ask that all of us that read this consider adding a "little extra" to our contributions.

### SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT



Have you often wondered how two Christians can have diametrically opposed views on a subject, and both state that they feel that they are being "led by God". How can two people both be saying they are being led by God? Truth be told, they can't. That does not mean that they are not both being spoken to by God, but one is not interpreting the message correctly, or someone is making them think the message is different than what is intended.

Today the church is experiencing a lot of internal conflict about many issues, such as homosexuality within the church, transgender rights, legislating morality, and apathy within. There are those within the church who are actually being led by God, the "prophets," who are speaking for God about these issues. There are others who are hearing God's message, but are being mislead by the forces of evil. Satan is a master of deception and is confusing a lot of us with lies and misdirection.

How often have you said to yourself something similar to "I won't claim this on my taxes, and nobody will ever know?" or "I'll leave work a little early and nobody will be the wiser." While both of these are what we call "little white lies," they are still lies and not the truth. So, how do we know who is the true "prophet" and who is under the influence of Satan and his dark forces? The answer lies in the Bible. The Bible is the truth, speaks the truth and always will be the truth. While Eve had the words of God spoken to her, she still listened to Satan. We have the Bible to give us the written words of God. We have the truth. We have the "belt of truth" to put on to guide us. Whether or not we listen to the truth is a choice each and every one of us has to make on a daily basis.

We can easily justify our little white lies, saying that they don't harm anyone, we won't do them again, or nobody will ever know. God knows. God knows what is in our hearts. He knows if we are sincere and if we are acting for the right reasons. There are many Christians who are squeaky clean on the outside, but are filthy on the inside.

Those who are God's "prophets" need to keep speaking his word, regardless of how others react. Don't be afraid. Those of us who are not "prophets" need to hear these messages and recognize the truth. That is the hard part, knowing what the truth is and what the "little white lie." is. Fortunately for us, we can find the truth in the pages of the Bible. All we have to do is read, come to church, fellowship with other Christians, and perform the hardest task of all: listen.
