It is almost here! It is the week we have been waiting for all year long! I hope that is the way you are thinking of Holy Week. As you read this newsletter, we are still in the Lenten season and Easter is quickly approaching. However, before we can rejoice at Easter/Resurrection Sunday, we have to remember the last week of Jesus' life: the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem; the Passover meal with the disciples followed by the betrayal of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane; and the self-sacrificing love of Jesus on the cross. As Christians, we know that Holy Week is important, but at times we want to rush to the celebration of Easter without the mourning of Holy Week.

In the book *Season of Ash and Fire*, Blair Gilmer Meeks shares how our mourning during Lent and our celebration of Easter connects us to all Christians who have gone before us. She writes "The traditions of Lent and Easter are as old as they come for Christian worship. Part of our sense of renewal is discovering just how ancient they are and joining the faithful, myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands, whose mourning has been turned to dancing with each new celebration of Easter."

Easter is indeed a time of celebration and dancing. As Christians, Easter Sunday is the most important day of the year; it is the day we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus the Christ and his defeat of sin and death. The late Billy Graham summed up Easter by saying "God proved His love on the Cross. When Christ hung, and bled, and died, it was God saying to the world, 'I love you.'

As the Lenten season comes to an end and the Easter season begins, I invite you to think of ways in which we can share God's message of love with others. The wonder of Easter invites us to consider the new life that is offered in Christ and the best way to share what we have first received.

Christ is risen indeed!
