Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ!

In the *Book of Order*, 4.202, we learn that the church welcomes baptized children to the table of our Lord in this manner: “In cases where baptized children who have not yet begun to participate in the Lord’s Supper express a desire to receive the Sacrament, they shall be welcomed to the table and the session should ensure they receive ongoing instruction or formation in the meaning and mystery of the Sacraments.” The session ordinarily sets an age at which children stay in worship. Our church session set the age for participating in worship regularly for the third grade and up. So, look for more information about the children’s worship class in the September *Anchor Links*.

Worship will include the Sacrament of Holy Communion this Sunday, September 4. I have received communion over fifty years, for thirty-seven years I have served the Lord’s Supper. Yet, even I do not fully understand what happens at the Table of our Lord. I do know that we are spiritually fed and strengthened through eating the bread (the spiritual body) and drinking from the cup (the spiritual blood of Jesus Christ). I do know we remember the loving sacrifice of Jesus for our sins. I do know that we receive the grace of God through our receiving communion. But how it all happens is completely beyond my understanding, a mystery. It is by faith that we come to the Table of our Lord to receive the grace of God.

In the *Book of Order*, W-3.0409: “Theology of the Lord’s Supper”, the Presbyterian church talks about the Lord’s Supper (or Eucharist) as “the sign and seal of our communion with the crucified and risen Lord.” In the Gospel stories Jesus is always eating at table with people. The Book of Order goes on to say that “The Sacrament of the Lord’s Supper offers an abundant feast of theological meaning, including: thanksgiving to God the Father; remembrance of Jesus Christ; invocation of the Holy Spirit; communion in the body of Christ; and a meal of the realm of God. The Reformed tradition understands the Lord’s Supper to be a sign of God’s covenant.... Through the Lord’s Supper, Jesus Christ nourishes us in righteousness, faithfulness, and discipleship. Through the Lord’s Supper, the Holy Spirit renews the Church in its identity and sends the Church to mission in the world.”

Communion is an important sacrament of the church for its life and the life of each Christian. This sign of our covenant with God is also a mysterious gift to the church from the hand of our Lord, for which we are thankful.




Please make plans to join us for fellowship, food and fun. Bring your friends with you to join us on Sunday evenings. Dinner will be provided by a different family each week.
