

Caregivers are presented with their own take home Breaking the Cycle of Incarceration Model and resource lists for children of incarcerated parents, caregivers, and incarcerated parents. These tools were developed through a qualitative research narrative inquiry case study framework project by authors Dr. Mona and Bob Davies. The model is helping to break the cycle of poverty, illiteracy, delinquency and to enhance positive youth development.
