The Light of the World

He was caught in an elevator during a power outage. There was a frightening jolt of the elevator when things suddenly stopped, and passengers were left in total darkness. The reaction of the seven folks caught in the elevator was predictable. They all started talking, some shouting for someone to push the buttons, to use the elevator phone to call 911. He said that everyone began to move around in the blackness to make sure they didn't touch anyone or get touched.

Then, after a few ominous minutes had passed, one of the passengers remembered the tiny flashlight he carried on his keychain. With the push of a button, a small, amber light filled the elevator car. Just like a little child relaxing when a night light is turned on in his/her bedroom, so, too, these weary and worried adults were encouraged by the light of the small flashlight, and found their fears disappeared with the darkness. For the next 45 minutes, they joked at their predicament, shared stories, and a bit of history about themselves. In our life experiences, that is the power of light overcoming darkness.

When Jesus walked among us, He said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows Me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (John 8:12). St. John, the evangelist, testifies in the opening verses of his gospel, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through Him all things were made; without Him nothing was made that has been made. In Him was life, and that life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it" (John 1:1-5).

In our world where illumination takes place with the flip of a switch, we often forget the powerful impact and importance of those divine words. We forget just how dark things can be. Sadly, we forget that without the Savor we were all condemned to live in perpetual darkness and in the shadow of eternal death. Without the forgiveness Jesus Christ has won for all humanity, the blackness of our sin would be and remain all-encompassing.


