

**Town Supervisor's Update**

Welcome to Fall! This season is a busy one for the Town Board as we work on the 2025 budget and assess where we are so far with our 2024 budget. The revaluation process last year had a significant impact on our budget; and, as always, we will continue to look for ways to improve our operations and spend wisely. Please attend any of our Town Board meetings if you have specific requests or topics, you would like us to evaluate. (Check the Town website <a href="https://www.townofwestbloomfield.org">www.townofwestbloomfield.org</a> for dates and times). One of our most significant sources of revenue is the sales tax distribution from Ontario County, and while we have seen a minor increase this year, we need to plan for a "normal" distribution next year, so we are not caught short. Shopping local and in Ontario County does have an impact—so please do so when you can. We have also encountered delivery issues with equipment, so even when we plan for a one budget year, equipment is not always available in that budget year. This increases the complexity of the budgeting process.

We will again be working to stay within the allowable tax cap rate set by Albany, while ensuring that we provide the services that our residents need. We have completed one of our two American Rescue Plan projects this summer—the paving of our parking lot at the Town Hall, and we anticipate contracting for the playground area in Prouty Park this fall.

**Town Board Meetings 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday of the month @ 7:00 PM**. Thank you to those who have attended our Town Board meetings over the last couple of months—your feedback is important to me and the Board as we work on the Town's business—and if you have not been to a meeting in a while, please consider attending some Wednesday evening.

Remember, we are always looking for residents to assist us on our Boards and for potential committees. We are also looking for a new Planning and Zoning Board of Appeals Clerk—please submit a resume if you are interested. The Town has over 20 residents who serve on the Planning and Zoning Boards, the CPIC and the Assessment Review Board. Thank you to all of you that serve now or have served in the past!!

# **Tax Reminders & Information**

Detailed information on how and where to pay your taxes can be found on your tax bill. Town and County taxes are due in January and are collected at the Town Clerk's Office (9097 Daylight Drive, West Bloomfield, NY). During the month of **January**, Canandaigua National Bank locations will accept **full** payments only. The Statutory deadline for the County to deliver the warrant is December 31<sup>st</sup>. The Warrant grants the Collecting Officer the authority to collect taxes, w/o the Warrant the collecting officer cannot accept taxes.

#### **State Law**

According to the Real Property Tax Law §922, the failure to mail a tax bill or the failure of a property owner to receive a tax bill will not affect the validity of the taxes or interest prescribed by law. Also, we are not legally allowed to change or rescind penalties, Real Property Tax Law §924.

# **Payment Information**

Please make sure your check is made out correctly, including pay to, date, and written and numerical amounts (these must match). Any checks incorrectly made out will be returned and may be subject to a penalty if received by the tax receiver after the penalty free period. We do not accept postdated checks; they will be returned and may be subject to penalties. If payment is made by mail, the United States Postal Service postmark (not a postage meter mark) is used as the payment date (RPTL §925). If there is no postmark, the date received will be used as the payment date.

For your convenience, there is a **secure** drop box located at the Town Hall. Payments by **check** may be placed in the drop box. The drop box is checked daily by 9:00 A.M. on regular Town Clerk business days. Payments collected will be considered received on the prior business day. The Town of West Bloomfield now accepts credit cards for municipal payments, including tax payments. Fees will apply.

## **General Information**

Upon payment of the taxes by the bank or mortgage company, the receipt is mailed directly to the homeowner within two to three weeks.

If you are responsible for paying the property taxes and have not received your town / county tax bill by mid-January, please contact the Tax Office (585-624-2914) immediately.

If you receive a bill in error (example: you no longer own the property) please notify and return the bill to the Tax Receiver's Office.

# **Highway Superintendent**

Summer is over and preparations for winter work are in progress. This work includes installing plow equipment on the trucks, putting up snow fences, filling the salt barn and checking plow routes. Residents can prepare for plow season as well by moving personal items away from the road that might get damaged, repairing weak or damaged mailbox posts and generally just considering that our large trucks will soon be pushing snow out of the roads. I've mentioned it before but will its worth mentioning again that we repair mailboxes that we hit but not those that fall over due to owner's neglect. If you have questions about proper replacement I have written instructions here in my office.

Also, as a reminder, it's illegal to push snow into or across the road. This includes shovels, and snow blowers. Please push snow back onto your own property to keep your neighbors safe.

One of the hot topics in NY is "salt reduction" NYS is offering grant opportunities to assist municipalities in purchasing salt reduction equipment. The program is called the "Water Quality Improvement Program." There are several methods to achieve this, and our department will be deploying some of them this year. First, is the use of segmented plow blades. These employ many smaller spring activated blades rather than one fixed blade.

As a result the blades can conform to the road surface and clean snow and ice more efficiently. The second is "mini weather stations." These weather stations will be pole mounted in several locations around town to monitor air and surface temperature and humidity every minute to create location specific forecast. The weather stations have cameras that allow us to view road conditions remotely via a phone app. This will reduce driving time for the night crew as well. In the summer these can be moved to areas where flooding occurs and help us monitor that as well.

If you've been to the town hall lately you've noticed the new asphalt parking lot. The crew did a great job and it's nice to have this beautiful and safe addition to our new town hall.

We continue to plan and design the new playground. It's our hope to have the planning phase finished soon and move forward with this exciting addition to Prouty Park. No dates are set yet for completion but we should know more in the next newsletter.

We have one of the highest deer densities in the state and since the breeding season is now in full swing the bucks and doe are running everywhere including across the roads. Please slow down and be watchful. Your car will appreciate it!

# **Ionia Volunteer Fire Company**

The 2024 Fire Prevention Week theme "Smoke Alarms: Make them work for you" strives to educate everyone about the importance of having working smoke alarms in the home. Since 1922, the National Fire Protection Association has sponsored the public observance of Fire Prevention Week. In 1925, President Calvin Coolidge proclaimed the week a national observance, making it the longest -running public health observance in the United States. Fire Prevention Week is observed each year during the week of October 9th in commemoration of the Great Chicago Fire, which began on October 8th, 1871, and caused devasting damage. The horrific conflagration killed more than 250 people, left 100,00 homeless, destroyed more than 17,400 structures, and burned more than 2,000 acres of land.

Early detection of a fire will minimize damage and potentially save lives. The smoke alarm will hopefully detect fire or smoke while the fire is small and alarm or sound an alarm. Early detection allows time for the occupants to escape a

building safely. A fire doubles in size every minute. My experience with fighting fires and those people who witnessed a fire in their home say that when they witnessed the fire without a functioning smoke detector, the fire was large, or the building was filling with smoke and they narrowly escaped.



Smoke detectors should be mounted to the ceiling outside bedrooms with at least one smoke detector on each floor of the house. Make it a routine to change the batteries in the smoke detectors in the Spring or Fall when you change your clocks in the house (spring ahead or fall back). The new smoke detectors have "forever" batteries. These detectors are considered disposable and are meant to be discarded when they are ten years old.

Should you have any questions or need assistance with your smoke detectors, feel free to stop at the Ionia Fire Station on any Monday evening.

people, and property. This day and age you are looking at \$150 to \$200k for each paid new firefighter and their gear. Paid firefighters would raise the town's fire tax much higher than the current cost now.

Bottom line is we need young volunteers to step up and help keep our fire service all volunteer. So please, if you know of anyone that may be interested in finding out what the fire service is all about, stop by the firehouse any Monday night around 7 pm, or contact the firehouse at 585-624-1414 or myself at 585-739-3582. (When calling the firehouse number, if nobody answers after 3 or 4 rings it will automatically roll over to my number. Please let it ring until you reach me, or you can leave a message.)

We hope everyone had a great summer and wish you a safe and happy fall season. And please make sure your smoke and Co detectors are working properly.


