Hello, and welcome to the second edition of the "new" Community Focus! It is a beautiful sunny day as I write this—and I'm hopeful that summer is underway. Please stop in and see the Town Clerk, Brenda Giglia, if you need a permit for Boughton Park or have questions about Michael Prouty Park. The exterior restroom at the Town Hall is now open and available for use—it is on the side of the Town Hall closest to the baseball backstop. We continue our partnership with East Bloomfield for their Summer Rec program—registration forms are available at the Town Hall. And we are happy to have some new display items from the Historical Society in the lobby of the Town Hall—please take some time to read and view them when you stop in. The Town Board will soon begin working on our budget for 2023. This is a several months-long process that involves all departments and takes into consideration our revenues from sales tax distribution from the county, mortgage tax revenue, and our town's assessed values among many other things. We strive to run the town as efficiently as possible while still delivering the services that our residents need. I would like to pass on my thanks to everyone who helped to organize and participated in the Memorial Day parades—it was nice to be able to have them again after skipping them for several years due to COVID. We have a supply of test kits and masks at the Town Hall, please stop in and pick some up if you need them. On the County level, I am currently serving as the Vice Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, and on the Public Safety and Ways & Means committees. My time on the County board and in committee meetings provides an excellent overview into municipal operations and I continue to look for new ideas to bring to our town. We are always looking for interested residents to fill positions on our Planning, Zoning, and Assessment Boards (we have two alternate positions for each board), and on committees that help guide the Town Board and future direction of the town. The 2022 annual meeting of the cemetery was held March 30th. The following officers were elected for the coming year: Pres. – Lynn Parrish, Vice Pres. – Randy O'Brien, Sec. – Marna Evans, Treas. – Wayne Parrish, Supt. – Larry Evans. Richard Frye and Lisa Parrish were re-elected to 3-year terms as Trustees. The six Trustees are: John Bennett, Gary Evans, Richard Frye, Sue Garling, Joanne O'Brien, Lisa Parrish.

The lawn mowing contract for the year was awarded to William Boldt. 585TREE was hired to take down a large black walnut tree near the vault that was in danger of falling on gravestones. The tree was taken down and sold in May.

The Treasurer reported that funds for cemetery maintenance continue to drop each year as costs increase and prices for the services have not been adjusted in several years. As such, the prices were increased as follows: plots to \$800, casket burial to \$800, and cremation burial to \$550. These changes were approved by the NYS Division of Cemeteries and will take effect on June 1st. The Superintendent has had a new Rules and Regulations sign made with the required changes and it will be installed soon.

YOU CAN HELP: The cemetery would appreciate obituary requests that donations be sent to our General Fund when a loved one passes. It would also be appreciated if a portion of your estate was donated to the General Fund when you pass and are being buried in the cemetery.

REMINDER: When placing flowers and plants on the graves, they must be potted. Any items permanently planted in the ground will be removed as allowed by NYS Cemetery Law. Also, by local policy, memorial lights are NOT allowed at any time in the cemetery.

LASTLY: If you wish to purchase a lot or schedule the installation of a monument, please contact the Superintendent, Larry Evans, at 585-624-4993.

The West Bloomfield Fire Department and the Ionia Fire Company are 100% volunteer, and we work together all the time. We respond to all calls with each other, we train together, and we share ideas for keeping our equipment up to date. We answer 70 to 90 calls per year. That equates to about 2 calls per week. More than half of the calls every year are fire and EMS calls.

Here is a breakdown of the types of calls we respond to:

Fires: This includes building fires, chimney fires, vehicle fires, appliance fires, flammable liquid fires (oils and other solvents), and grass and brush fires

EMS (Emergency Medical Service): This includes motor vehicle accidents with and without injuries, help lifting, ECHO level calls (calls where breathing is not confirmed), and CPR

Hazardous Condition: Includes gas odor/leaks, electrical problems in a building, power lines down

Service Calls: This includes water problems (basement pumping, broken water pipes), fill-ins for other fire departments

Good Intent Calls: This includes calls when we are canceled before we respond, calls where nothing is found, and controlled burning

False Alarms: Smoke detector activation, CO detector activation. These can either be for smoke from cooking or steam from a shower. Occasionally, these can turn into an actual fire

Severe Weather & Natural Disaster: This is to assess damage caused by a severe storm, to assist with flooding caused by heavy rain, wind damage, trees down blocking roads


