

Protections of Person & Property Committee.

Committee Membership (8)

1. City Council Member Representative Annual Appointment by Mayor, approved by Council (1 Year Term) May
2. Mayor, City Administrator, ex-officio non-voting members who are not counted for purposes of a quorum;
3. Calumet County Emergency Management Director or Representative -Annually May
4. Two Billion Business Representatives with background in Police, Fire, Ambulance/EMS, Emergency Management on a municipal level with voting privileges who are counted for purposes of a quorum. (Three Alternating Term) May
5. Two city residents with suitable expertise by virtue of training and experience in police, fire and/or emergency services on a municipal level with voting privileges who are counted for purposes of a quorum. (Three Year Alternating Term) May

Committee Responsibilities

- a. Oversight of public safety services, which include: Police, Ambulance/EMS, Fire, Emergency Management;
- b. The protection of persons and property committee shall supervise and instruct the police department, subject to prior approval of the mayor. The city council may, however, direct the committee to act for the council in a specific matter affecting the department without prior approval of the mayor. (City of Brillion Ordinance -ARTICLE III. PROTECTION OF PERSONS AND PROPERTY COMMITTEE Sec. 46-56. Supervision and instruction.)
- c. Review and recommend to Council agreements and Contracts for public safety services, which include: Police, Ambulance/EMS, Fire, Emergency Management including with outside communities;
- c. Review and recommend approval or denial of licenses and permits required by the city for special events;
- c. Develop and recommend policies and plans regarding public safety issues; review and update Emergency Management Plan
- d. Serve as the forum to discuss concerns raised by citizens regarding public safety related matters;
- e. Consider the enactment, implementation and enforcement of any criminal, traffic, fire, building, public nuisance or other such codes, ordinances or resolutions appropriate to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the public and make recommendations to city council;

- f. Consider any other matters referred to the committee by the common council or committee of the whole;
- g. The committee has no authority over any matters falling under the jurisdiction of the, the plan commission;
