



Minutes of Nutmeg Chapter Meeting

July 18, 2021

Call to Order: Donald Arnauckas, Nutmeg Chapter President, called the meeting to order at 2:10 PM.

Opening:

The Meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Chapter President Don Arnauckas. On behalf of the Club and accompanied by a round of applause, Don extended the members' appreciation to Rob and Vanessa Coutu who hosted the meeting at Coutu Truck Country in Willimantic, CT. The meal selections were abundant, the space was roomy and comfortable, the air conditioning was most welcome and the time and opportunity to explore the grounds and collections were available.

Attendance:

There were 23 members and guests present.

Secretary's Report:

A motion was made to accept the Secretary's Minutes of the April 18, 2021 meeting as they appeared in the Newsletter. The motion was seconded and the members voted unanimously to approve the Minutes.

Treasurer's Report: Tom Bachand Reporting period May – June 2021.

1. Savings Account- No activity beside interest recorded
2. Regular Account

Income: 50/50 Raffle, dues, donations

Expenses: BTS Graphics & Printing, Newsletter postage

3. Show Account Activity: See Comprehensive Report under New Business Nutmeg Chapter 2021 Truck Show

RECOMMENDATION BY TREASURER TOM: Tom is recommending that \$2200.00 be transferred from the Show Account to the Savings Account (Savings Account serves as a reserve account for the Show Account, if needed.)

RECOMMENDATION #2 from the Floor: Raise the Boy Scout donation due to the fact that they are taking leadership positions now.

ACTION: These two recommendations will be on the agenda for vote at the November Annual Thanksgiving meeting.

4. Tom noted that Matthews Catering is available for the November Annual Meeting but is requiring a contract and deposit of \$1,000. to be held for two years dependent on any state mandates that might arise due to pandemic issues.

RECOMMENDATION OF TREASURER: Sign the contract and pay the deposit to keep the caterer commitment. Tom stated that he would negotiate for a lower minimum of attendees at 80.

ACTION: Members present voted unanimously to approve paying the deposit. There will be a "Save the Date" notification in the July Newsletter and an RSVP form and payment due notice in the September Newsletter.

Lance Dimock was not present at the meeting, but had reported to Tom that a few new members joined the Club at the Show and members whose dues had lapsed also paid and were reinstated as active members.

NOTE: Actual Show expenses were lower this year because 1) Tee shirts and dash plaques had been purchased previously for the 2020 Show that was canceled due to the pandemic and 2) Golf cart rentals were unnecessary due to the generosity of the Foskett's and Lee Johnson in donating their carts and transportation for the day.

3. FACTORS CONTRIBUTING TO THE SHOW'S SUCCESS


