

Minutes of Nutmeg Chapter Meeting January 22, 2023

Call to Order: Tom Bachand, Nutmeg Chapter President, called the meeting to order at 2:00 PM

Opening:

The Meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Chapter President Tom Bachand. Tom expressed appreciation on behalf of the membership to Cynthia and Harold Foskett for their generosity in welcoming us and hosting the meeting at Foskett Equipment in Woodstock, CT. The showroom became a meeting, greeting, and dining room. An assortment of sandwiches, snacks, and baked goods kept everyone satisfied.

Attendance: There were 21 members and guests present.

Secretary's Report:

A motion was made to accept the Secretary's Minutes of the November 13, 2022 meeting as they appeared in the previous Newsletter. The motion was seconded and the members voted unanimously to approve the Minutes.

A motion was made to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented. The motion was seconded and vote was unanimous to accept the report.

Membership Report: Lance Dimock

Lance reported a membership count of 142. Three members' dues expired in 2021. 44 members remained delinquent with their dues for 2022. In accordance with the Board of Directors recommendation and action voted on by the membership at the May 2022 meeting, these members who have not paid dues will no longer receive the Newsletter effective December 2022. The Online Newsletter is available to all. It was noted that 14 new members joined at the Brooklyn Show. Lance also notes that members using the Membership form in the Newsletter is very helpful in keeping our membership list current. A motion was made to accept the Membership Report as presented. The motion was seconded and vote was unanimous.

Website and Social Media: Kathy Arnauckas

Kathy reported that the website is active and invites folks to add contents by contacting her. The Face Book page also remains monitored and updated. Kathy noted that member Mike Kenderdine has used Face Book to contact the Club about an upcoming "Touch-a-Truck" event at Mineral Springs Campground for listing in our Events Calendar. Communication was received from National ATHS notifying the chapter that a "Creating Event Flyers" zoom event is scheduled. With the attention that social media garners for the Club, it is well worth the upkeep and cost.

NEW BUSINESS: 2023 NUTMEG CHAPTER TRUCK SHOW: June 25, 2023

- 1. John Raymond has secured the Brooklyn Fairgrounds with a verbal contract.
- 2. The food vendors have been lined up.
- 3. Photos of Rob & Vanessa Coutu's 2023 show trucks have been taken for the flyers, tee shirts and dash plaques
- 4. The Certificate of Insurance has been requested online from National ATHS
- 5. The Girl Scout troop has informed us that the Scouts will park spectator vehicles again this year at the show.
- 6. National ATHS now requests a copy of the show poster in order to include the Brooklyn Show in the publicized schedule of the Wheels of Time and also in order to get the insurance certificate. The purpose of this is to show any chapter's commitment to actually having a show. Apparently the deadline for this now is November/ December, which is two months earlier than in the past.
- 7. Tom asked for members' feedback from the 2022 show experience.
 - It was recommended that the New Membership handouts be printed two on a sheet, then cut in half.
 - Rob Coutu spoke of the Nutmeg Chapter and the ATHS truck clubs as being representative of patriotism, history, common interest, fellowship, all pieces of Americana. With that said, he made the recommendation to introduce new entertainment that would include an emcee and trucking songs. Gary Pomo, a well-known local entertainer, would provide the type of entertainment more suited to a truck show. There was enthusiasm expressed and Rob was asked to contact Gary and to follow up on availability and sound system requirements if he is not self-contained. John Raymond will also contact the fairgrounds about a sound and public address system.
 - Perhaps the trucks could be announced as they enter the fairgrounds.
 - Perhaps there could be a 12:00 horn blow.
 - Kathy Arnauckas spoke of a potential new pool of volunteers among the high school students who need community service hours as a requirement for graduation. Other sources could include 4H Clubs, TEEG, and ARC. These volunteers would be teamed with adult club members. Gate 1 was short on volunteers in 2022.
 - Don mentioned that Ballston Spa and other clubs pay helpers.
 - The Cornet Band has inquired about appearing at the 2023 Brooklyn show. Club will follow up after contacting Gary Pomo.




