### **HIGHWAY 141 CORRIDOR STUDY**

The Cities of Grimes and Johnston, and Polk County, are partnering with the Iowa DOT to prepare a traffic access management and operations review of the Iowa 141 corridor between the Iowa 44 (E. First Street/N.W. 70th Street) and Iowa 415 interchanges. A map of the approximate three-mile-long Iowa 141 study corridor specific to this effort can be found online, http://www.cityofjohnston.com/Highway-141-Corridor-Study.

Each City has completed recent updates to their Comprehensive Land Use plans for the areas of influence on the corridor. The study will incorporate the Johnston Thrive 2040 Comprehensive Plan Update, the 2018 City of Grimes Comprehensive Plan, and the Polk County / Iowa DOT IA 141/415 Corridor Study (121st Street intersection improvements to the north). These plans, along with continued traffic growth, crash history, and land use development have demonstrated the need for the agencies to evaluate short- and long-term needs for continued safety and efficiency of operation for the future.

The primary objective will be the development of a master plan for the Iowa 141 corridor from north Iowa 44 interchange to the Iowa 415 interchange. The plan will include short-term and long-term buildout needs of the corridor including access management, safety performance, major intersection location form and function. The plan will provide the basis for future access management coordination and potential roadway improvement project planning.

The first public meeting for this effort will be held on Thursday, May 13, at 5:30 p.m. at Johnston City Hall, 6221 Merle Hay Road, Johnston, or available via Zoom. To register in advance for this webinar, visit http://bit.ly/Hwy141Zoom.


