



MADISON COUNTY

madisoncounty.com

No excuses: Winterset, the seat of Madison County, is less than 40 miles from downtown Des Moines. The region, of course, inspired the best-selling novel, "The Bridges of Madison County," and was featured in the romantic drama film of the same name. After a morning of sightseeing among these iconic 19th-century covered bridges, head to the John Wayne Birthplace & Museum, which celebrated 40 years and a new museum addition last year.

Dive into the rich history of picturesque Story City, less than an hour from downtown Des Moines. This Iowa Main Street Community includes quaint shops, unique restaurants and the historical 110-year-old Story Theater/Grand Opera House. Their crowning glory is the Story City Carousel, an antique, hand-carved Herschell-Spillman portable merry-go-round from 1913. Yes, it still works! Admission is \$1.

TIP: The city's annual festival, Scandinavian Days, is scheduled for June 2-3.

Boone celebrates its rich railroad heritage at Pufferbilly Days (Aug. 4-6 this year), one of the largest community festivals in Iowa. Visitors can find a close-up railway experience via the Boone & Scenic Valley Railroad & Museum. And beyond trains, the town boasts the Boone Speedway, which attracts the nation's top racers each year at the Speedway Motors IMCA SuperNationals.

Mansions, museums and houses — don't overlook lowa's rich history this summer.

HOYT SHERMAN PLACE


1501 Woodland Ave., Des Moines hoytsherman.org

Today known primarily for its grand theater, Hoyt Sherman Place was constructed by businessman Hoyt Sherman in the mid-1800s. The mansion has hosted guests including William Tecumseh Sherman, Ulysses S. Grant and William McKinley. The first Mercy Hospital operated for two years in Sherman's home. Original floor plans and period-appropriate decor on the upper level were restored in 2021. It also has an impressive art gallery. Free tours are available during business hours.

IOWA STATE CAPITOL

With its iconic golden dome prominent on the Des Moines skyline, the Iowa State Capitol was completed in 1886 after 15 years of construction. Tours of the Capitol will take visitors through the Grand Staircase, Inner Dome, Supreme Court, Senate and House chambers, governor's and state officials' offices and the breathtaking State Law Library, with views of various murals, mosaics and displays of intricate craftsmanship along the way. Combine that with the 40-plus memorials, sculptures and fountains scattered around the Capitol Grounds, and you might need more than an afternoon to fully appreciate its grandeur.

JORDAN HOUSE

The oldest structure in West Des Moines was home to James C. Jordan, one of the city's first settlers. Jordan House was a station on the Underground Railroad during the antebellum period. Tours of the period home are offered on Fridays and Sundays.

SALISBURY HOUSE

Carl and Edith Weeks built Salisbury House in the 1920s, modeled after the King's House in Salisbury, England. Visitors can take guided and self-guided tours to view the family's original artwork, tapestries and antique furnishings, plus woodwork and flintwork dating to the 16th century.

STATE HISTORICAL MUSEUM OF IOWA

Discover Iowa's rich heritage, from pre-statehood and the Civil War to RAGBRAI and Iowa's presence in Hollywood. At any given time, the museum displays about 1,500 objects out of its collection of 80,000-plus artifacts.

TERRACE HILL

Terrace Hill goes by many names: Hubbell Mansion, Iowa Governor's Mansion and Benjamin F. Allen House. Allen was the first millionaire in Iowa and began construction in 1866. The Hubbell family donated the building to the State of Iowa in 1971, when it was designated as the official residence of the Iowa governor. Guided tours are available Tuesday to Saturday at 10:30 a.m. and noon. Visitors should make reservations 48 hours in advance by calling 515-281-7205.

WORLD FOOD PRIZE HALL OF LAUREATES

Formerly the Des Moines Public Library building, the World Food Prize Hall of Laureates underwent a \$29.8 million restoration project. Today, the building honors Iowa native Dr. Norman Borlaug for his work in agronomy. The structure was designed in the Beaux Arts style and currently houses a museum that highlights agricultural achievements, hunger and food security.





Cool off with water activities at these local parks and recreation areas.

LEDGES STATE PARK

1515 P Ave., Madrid iowadnr.gov

A must-see nature destination for all Iowans, Ledges State Park includes a four-mile trail system offering scenic views from 100-foot-tall sandstone ledges overlooking the Des Moines River. Streamwalk Peas Creek, usually ankledeep during the summer, as it runs through a stunning sandstone gorge along Canyon Road.

RACCOON RIVER PARK

Iowa may be landlocked, but that doesn't mean we can't enjoy a day at the beach. The 500-footlong beach at Raccoon River Park overlooks the 232-acre Blue Heron lake. The Raccoon River Boathouse opens for the season on May 27.

SEVEN OAKS RECREATION

Float and paddle down seven miles of the Des Moines River and explore numerous sandbars and scenery along the way. You'll pass under the 185-foot-tall Kate Shelley High Bridge — one of the world's longest and highest double-track railway bridges. River floats take between two to four hours.

Gray's Lake Park allows visitors to rent various watercraft in the heart of Des Moines. Offerings include two- and threeperson canoes, double kayaks, stand-up paddleboards, four-person pedal boats and row boats. Rentals and concession stands are located at the Christine Hensley Terrace on the southeast corner of the park (all rentals) and on the beach on the north side (paddleboards only).
