



JASPER WINERY

It's not often there's an elite vineyard right in a capital city's backyard. Jasper Winery hosts events throughout the summer, including a summer concert series, fully equipped with food trucks, live music, and indoor and outdoor bars that serve up wines and plenty of other tasteful drinks. Known for its wine, naturally, Jasper Winery will also surprise you with its select choices of ciders produced there.

TASSEL RIDGE WINERY

An hour's jaunt outside Des Moines, Tassel Ridge Winery is a bit off the beaten path but well worth the drive. It features an excellent selection of wines, with everything from dessert to dry wines. One quick look at the wine awards section on their website indicates that you can't go wrong at Tassel Ridge.

BIG GROVE BREWERY



Complete with a lazy river and swim-up bars for parents looking for a relaxing time, the water attraction has more than enough for the kids — the Kokomo Kove splash factory, waterslides, wave pools and much more to explore.

RAMADA BY WYNDHAM TROPICS RESORT

Just outside of Des Moines is one of the state's best lakes for recreation. Saylorville Lake and the surrounding park give you plenty of access to boating and kayaking fun, including rental opportunities. The 26,000-acre lake has plenty of places and small coves to explore and enjoy, whether you're with friends, family, celebrating a birthday, or just looking to get out on the water this summer. Give Fleetwood, the only floating restaurant in Iowa, a look if you get hungry during your time there. Just make sure to wait 30 minutes until you swim again and don't forget the sunscreen.



BIG CREEK STATE PARK

Located just north of Saylorville Lake is another one of Iowa's fantastic lakes, offering just as much fun as the last. This familyfriendly park is fantastic for a day on the beach, an outing on the water, or for a family picnic. Boat, kayak and pontoon rentals are available. The lake is a popular fishing destination if you're interested in catching crappie, bass, walleye or bluegill.

RACCOON RIVER PARK

Blue Heron is a 232-acre lake and is the centerpiece of Raccoon River Park. It provides boat access for fishing enthusiasts and a great chance to get in the water (swimming is limited to the roped area by the beach). The lake is designated a no wake zone, which allows for passive recreational experiences. Surrounding the park is plenty of fun as well, with trails, spots for picnics and the chance to see wildlife.

Slightly southeast of Des Moines, Lake Red Rock offers a variety of recreation. Tritons, ski boats, kayaks and paddle boards are available for rental to provide a full day of fun in the sun. This man-made lake was created to be a relief from floods in Des Moines and brings an interesting history with it. Several towns were moved or deconstructed with the creation of this lake (don't worry, everyone was warned beforehand), but one thing remains from the towns under its waters: a graveyard.

Gray's Lake Park becomes an absolute hot bed in the summer for Des Moines residents. The area is a favorite during the sun-soaked months of the season. The trail that winds around the lake is perfect for walkers, runners, joggers and anyone else who feels like moving. The bridge across the lake is one of the most scenic in the city, and the beach is a great spot if you're looking to get into the water. Gray's Lake isn't as large as the others in this listing, so motor boat rentals aren't available, but there are still paddle boats, kayaks and canoes available.

FURMAN AQUATIC CENTER

North of Des Moines resides a sneakily good aquatic center in Ames. The waterpark is fully equipped with a lazy river, slides for the young ones and a slide for those who think they can handle its 10-foot drop into the pool. There are also several diving platforms of ranging heights for the thrill seekers. Also, for the kids, a splash park will keep them busy for hours.

CASCADE FALLS AQUATIC CENTER
