After some time passed and I continued to follow my heart, I decided to investigate Crossroads House to see if it would be the answer to my prayer. I was met at the door with a warm smile and immediately felt welcome. After a brief interview I was given an application and a tour of the house. I was blown away with what was taking place inside this beautiful home. Since I wasn't comfortable doing resident care, my first experience was to volunteer to clean, garden, shop for the resident, or do office work. That quickly changed when one Friday evening I was cleaning out the refrigerator and one of the volunteers needed help with a resident. I said that I don't do that but she insisted that I put on a pair of gloves ASAP. To my surprise I survived and eventually became a hands on volunteer. That was twenty three years ago.

It never ceases to amaze me how much joy and satisfaction I receive each and every time I complete a shift; whether it be taking care of a resident or simply helping out with a fundraising project, gardening or just sitting and being present with a resident. Our Living Legacy Center (LLC), located behind St. James Episcopal Church, 405 E. Main St. in Batavia, is a multi-functional building that Crossroads House uses for fundraising event planning, meetings, and training for both our Direct Resident Care Volunteers and End-of-Life Doula programs. The LLC is also the site for our Grief & Loss Peer Support Group sessions.

The LLC is available to the public.

Businesses and organizations may use the site for meetings and trainings. It is suitable for small parties, like baby and bridal showers or birthday and holiday gatherings.

Only the first floor is available. There is a bathroom, full kitchen, 4-person pub style table and two large conference tables. The site features free WiFi and surround sound with a large screen TV for hook up to a computer or phone.





