Step 7: Because we have been set free, we share our testimony. Our experience, strength and hope.

Luke 4:18

“The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, and he has anointed me to be hope for the poor, freedom for the brokenhearted, and new eyes for the blind, and to preach to the prisoners, You are set free!”

1. Who are some of the poor, brokenhearted and blind we can be hope for? HOW can we be hope?

2. What does this type of “prisoner” that we are told to preach to look like? What should we be preaching?

Hebrews 10:24-25

“And let us consider how to stir one another up to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.”

1. How can we “stir one another up?”

2. What does the scripture refer to when it says not to neglect meeting together?

3. What is the “Day” that’s drawing near?

Revelation 12:11

“And they have defeated him by the blood of the lamb and by their testimony. And they did not love their lives so much that they were afraid to die.”

1. When the accuser comes and begins to bring up what we've done and who we used to be, how can we defeat him?

2. Are there things that hold you back from sharing your testimony with a friend, neighbor, or family member? Consider that question this week and ask God to give you clarity. If it's simply fear of judgement or rejection, ask him for the strength and courage to need to begin to share it.

3. Make a list here of the people you want to see set free and pray over them this week, asking God to help you share a testimony with them.
