DIVINITY

INGREDIENTS

- · 2 cups of sugar
- 1/2 cup of water
- 1 (7 ounce) jar marshmallow crème
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- Food coloring (optional)
- Pecan halves

DIRECTIONS

- · Heat sugar and water on the stove until boiling. Continue to boil until it reaches a soft ball stage. In stand mixer, add marshmallow creme. When syrup is done, slowly poor syrup mixture into marshmallow creme and add 1 teaspoon vanilla. Beat until stiff. If you desire to have a different color than white, this is where you would add a few drops of food coloring. I usually use red to make it a light pink.
- Immediately spoon onto waxed paper and press a pecan half on top of each piece. You know it is set up when you can pick it up easily with your fingers and it is no longer sticky.

CHOCOLATE CRINKLE COOKIES

INGREDIENTS

- · 4 ounces unsweetened chocolate, chopped
- 1 3/4 cups granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup shortening
- 1/4 cup butter
- 3 large eggs, lightly beaten
- · 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- · 2 teaspoons vanilla
- 1 1/3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/3 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 2/3 cup powdered sugar

DIRECTIONS

- In a 1-quart saucepan, cook and stir chocolate, shortening and butter over low heat until melted. Cool.
- · Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Lightly grease cookie sheets. In a large bowl, combine eggs, granulated sugar, baking powder, baking soda and salt. Beat with an electric mixer on medium speed until combined, scraping side of bowl occasionally.
- Stir in melted chocolate mixture and vanilla. Then gradually stir in flour and cocoa powder.
- Shape dough into 1 1/2-inch balls. Roll balls in 1/4 cup granulated sugar, then in powdered sugar to coat.
- Place balls 2 inches apart on prepared cookie sheets. Bake 8 to 10 minutes or just until edges are firm and cracks appear slightly moist. Cool on cookie sheets 2 minutes. Remove; cool on wire racks. (Cookies will deflate slightly upon cooling.) Makes about 36 cookies.

HOW TO STORE

· Layer cookies between waxed paper in an airtight container; cover. Store at room temperature for up to three days or freeze for up to three months.

Ham balls

"What makes the ham balls special is I always grind my own ham, and I use the large cookie scoop," says Deb Hubby. "This way the sauce to meat ratio is much better."

HAM BALLS

MEATBALL INGREDIENTS

- 1 ½ pounds ground ham
- · 1 pound ground pork
- 1 pound hamburger
- ¾ cup milk
- 2 eggs
- 1 ½ cup graham crackers, crushed

SAUCE

- · 2 cans tomato sauce
- ¾ cup vinegar
- · 1 cup brown sugar
- · 2 tablespoons mustard

DIRECTIONS

- · Mix all the ham ball ingredients together. Make into balls with a large cookie scoop and place on a 10-inch by 15-inch pan.
- Mix sauce ingredients and pour over meatballs. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour.
- Three pounds of meat will make 122 balls using a small scoop and 72 with a 1 ½ tablespoon scoop.

Jean's famous dressing

"Both my mother and my mother-in-law were great cooks," Laura Silverthorn says. "My late mother-in-law, Jean Silverthorn, was a cook for the Earlham School District. Everything she touched tasted like gold. She had a love for real butter, whole milk and cream. Most of her recipes contained these ingredients.

"I will never forget the day I first met her. I was always small growing up. Her first words to me were, 'You're no bigger than a minute! How 'bout a piece of pie?' This was followed by her wonderful laugh. She had such an infectious laugh, and, to this day, I can still hear it. Of

course, you cannot turn down the offer of pie. This was my introduction to the best food I have ever tasted.

"The funny thing about Jean was that she never wrote amounts down or measured ingredients precisely, but she knew exactly what to add to make her food irresistible. I remember having her sit at my dining table walking me through how to make her famous cinnamon rolls. She would say, 'Just add a little bit of this or that,' or 'Give it a good hard right' when describing how to punch the dough. The whole time, I was trying to write everything down so I could remember it, and she was laughing that memorable laugh.

"We always had Thanksgiving at Jean's house. Her kitchen was small, and she commanded

JEAN'S FAMOUS DRESSING

INGREDIENTS

- · 3 sticks butter
- 4 ½ cups chicken broth (made from instant powdered bouillon)
- 4 tablespoons of flour
- 2 cups whole milk
- 1 loaf white sandwich bread. cubed
- ½ cup instant onion
- 3 cups celery, finely diced
- 1 small container powdered sage

DIRECTIONS

- · Make the gravy by melting one stick of butter in a medium saucepan. Add flour and cook for one minute. Add milk and instant onion. Add 1 1/2 cups chicken broth to the pan and bring to a boil. Remove from heat.
- In a 2-gallon Ziploc bag, add and shake together the bread, celery, and 3/4 of the container of sage. Pour into an 11-inch by 15-inch cake pan. Pour the rest of the chicken broth over the bread mixture (it should be very moist).
- Pour the gravy over the top and fold in. Dot the top of the dressing with the remaining butter and sprinkle the remaining sage on top.
- Bake uncovered at 350 degrees for approximately 1 to 1 ½ hours or until brown on top.
- Note: I use the larger pan to keep the butter from spilling over in my oven.

the space. All we had to do was show up and eat. This made her happy. As she got along in years, she had difficulty making the whole meal, so we all started helping. This is where I learned how to make her dressing and pies.

"I have written down many of my mother and mother-in-law's recipes, and family members are always asking me to share them. I am happy to share one of Jean's recipes we had to have each Thanksgiving and Christmas. Jean said, 'Just add some celery and sage,' so I tried to tell you how much to use in the recipe. Of course, if you want to add more or less, you would be cooking like Jean. I miss her so much."

Eggnog pie

"I first had this pie 30-plus years ago at my mother-in-law's parents' home," Marilou Harryman says. "Since that day, I have made at least one each year (usually more) because they are so easy to make and so delicious. One year, my son even made and sold them when he was in high school. Of course, you can only make them this time of year as this is when eggnog is available. I have been known to freeze eggnog so we can have them during the year. I often hear people say, 'I don't like eggnog.' I say, just try it and you'll be surprised, and, more times than not, they like it." ■

EGGNOG PIE

INGREDIENTS

- 1 (3.4 ounce) box instant French vanilla pudding
- · 2 cups eggnog
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 package Dream Whip (I use 2 cups Cool Whip instead)
- 1 graham cracker pie crust
- Nutmeg

DIRECTIONS

· In a bowl, mix the pudding, eggnog and vanilla for several minutes until thick. Then fold in the Dream Whip. Once mixed together well, pour into a graham cracker crust. Add some sprinkles of nutmeg on top and refrigerate.

FIGHTING for joy on Christmas

WHY is gray hair more wiry?

Do you have gray hair and wonder why it is so coarse and frizzy? Almost like it's a different head of hair? You're not going crazy; it basically is.

As we age, there are structural changes that occur within each hair strand. The protein keratin, which hair is composed of, is influenced by factors such as moisture content, melanin levels (the pigment found in the hair that gives us our hair color), and the overall shape of the follicle. Melanin



decreases with age, causing us to lose color, which also causes the strand to lose elasticity, making it more coarse. The aging process affects hair follicle shape, which can lead to changes in the texture of the hair.

Also, with the aging process comes the body's lack of moisture production. The oils the scalp produces runs down the hair shaft, keeping the overall appearance of the hair shiny and smooth. Oil production reduces significantly with age, leaving gray hair feeling dry and brittle. The environment and one's lifestyle also have an effect on the graying process. UV rays, stress and diet can further impact hair health, which exacerbates textural changes in the hair.

So, while gray hair is wiry, frizzy and harder to manage due to the lack of oils and melanin level, your favorite stylist can recommend lots of expert ideas to help fall in love with this hair stage of your life.

SIMPLE eating hacks for success

(Part 3) 'Tis the season for family, friends and food. Be encouraged that there are a few "hacks" you can consider as you prepare for the festivities that this season brings to help you avoid the cravings and the aftereffects of the eating habits that this season brings. (See hacks 1-3 in previous months). Hack No. 4: Movement is the best "medicine."



As a chiropractor, this saying matches my philosophy to a T. There are many benefits of movement (beyond a healthy moving spine). If you move after a meal, it pushes sugar into your muscles instead of your bloodstream (ultimately avoiding that post-meal crash). It doesn't take much movement — you don't have to hit the gym or do an HIIT workout. A simple 10-minute walk or even moving around to do the dishes and clean-up is all it takes to avoid a sugar

Hack No. 5: Stop counting calories. It seems like a great idea to make sure your caloric input is less than your caloric output. But the problem with this method is that not every calorie is created equal. For example, 200 calories of carbs are going to play a greater toll on your health than 200 calories of protein. Instead, focus on the nutritional content of what you are eating. Picture half of your plate being veggies, a quarter protein, and a quarter carbs and fat from the sauces and/or dressings you use to embellish your carbs. ■



TOP 5 reasons your check engine light is on

From minor to serious issues, here are a few reasons your check engine light might be on.

- 1. Loose gas cap. Check to make sure it is properly secured and that there are no cracks in it.
- 2. Failing oxygen sensor. If you're experiencing a decline in fuel economy and your check engine light appears, have your oxygen sensor checked.
- 3. Failing catalytic converter. When your catalytic converter is failing, it could be caused by issues related to other systems that work interdependently with it that have not been addressed.
- 4. Failing mass air flow sensor. Always have your mass air flow sensor checked when the check engine light comes on. Since many parts of the engine work together, when one part fails, others tend to follow suit.
- 5. Damaged spark plugs or wires. It's important to keep in mind that these are some of the most common reasons for the check engine light to come on; however, there can be other issues that cause the check engine light to illuminate. Also, a flashing check engine light indicates a major internal failure and requires immediate attention. Regardless, you should not ignore the check engine light. Always check it as soon as possible to ensure the integrity of your vehicle.

GOING the distance for fellow veterans

Group finds it rewarding to provide transportation to others who have served.

A small group of volunteers is truly going the distance for local veterans in Madison County. Joan Naylor, Madison County Veterans Affairs transportation coordinator,



arranges free rides for local veterans to and from medical appointments through the VA system. Naylor also does some of the volunteer driving, along with Terry McDowell, Gary Davis, Tom Verstraeten and Paul Welch.

"I've been doing this the longest," McDowell says. "I started doing this in Indianola. I'm 78, and I started doing this when I was 63, since I retired from the post office. I'd heard about it and thought it was a good cause."

The service began in Madison County after the group acquired a van in 2019.

"The maintenance is all paid for by the VA," Naylor says. "All we have to do is drive the vets.'

Naylor emphasizes the service is completely free to veterans.

"It's all free to the vets. Some of them offer to give us some money, but we can't accept it," she says.





Tom Verstraeten, Terry McDowell, Joan Naylor and Gary Davis are all veterans, and they enjoy helping other veterans get to appointments.

Naylor says usage of the service fluctuates greatly.

"It varies. Last year, we took 84 people. We're up to 54 this year. It varies month to month," Naylor says. "We take them basically wherever their appointment is, as long as it's VA sanctioned."

Most of the rides are to and from Des Moines and are scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis.

"Whoever calls first gets that day," Naylor says.

The van does not have a ramp or lift, so riders must be able to get into and out of the van independently.

"However, we can take a walker or crutches or a cane," Naylor says.

The drivers point out that they know there are still more veterans who could benefit from the service, so they are striving to get the word out. Naylor speculates on the reluctance of some veterans to use the

"A lot of them don't want to ask for help," Naylor says. "We tell them it's free, the service is there, we want to make sure we utilize it so we can keep it."

The group also is seeking more volunteer drivers and says it's generally a "best fit" for a retired person, because of the fluctuations in the number of rides requested. All drivers receive training and an initial physical, plus background checks. Drivers 60 and older get an annual physical.

"The physical is paid for by the VA. There's no money out of the driver's pocket," Verstraeten says.

The drivers said the driving routine is not challenging. They simply drive veterans to appointments, wait until the appointment is done, then drive the veteran back home. The most enjoyable part, they say, is conversing with the riders. Naylor shared a favorite story about a WWII veteran.

"When the driver brought him back, the driver said, 'I want to take him again next time,' because the rider was so much fun to talk with,"

THE IMPORTANCE of umbrella insurance

What is umbrella insurance?

Umbrella insurance is a form of liability insurance that will supplement your basic liability policies, such as your auto, home or renters' insurance. An umbrella liability policy covers a much higher limit and goes above and beyond claims directly relating to your home and auto. The main purpose of your umbrella policy is to protect your assets from an unforeseen event, such as a tragic accident in which



you are held responsible for damages or bodily injuries. If another party files a lawsuit against you, your umbrella coverage will pay for the damages you're legally responsible for up to the policy limit.

Why is umbrella insurance important?

Your car, house, investments and retirement accounts, as well as your normal checking and savings accounts and even future income, are all considered assets. It is important to know that, if you are sued for a lot of money and do not have enough liability insurance or an umbrella policy to cover those costs, all or your assets are exposed. People typically choose to buy an umbrella policy because they want to prevent the possibility of financial ruin due to one misstep or unforeseen accident. An umbrella policy can provide the protection to prevent such an outcome.

The children were experienced and advised of all the safety rules including the use of headgear at all times. A participant removed her headgear as she was leaving the field in order to better hear someone calling her name. The minor claimant was hit in the eye resulting is a \$475,000 settlement.
