





HOW TO win against temptation

A few years back, a team of divers and scientists examined the Titanic resting on the ocean floor. To their shock, there wasn't a huge gash from hitting an iceberg but only six narrow slits, each no wider than



your hand. In other words, it didn't take much to sink the unsinkable Titanic. It doesn't take much to sink our lives as well.

All of us face the temptation to sin (see 1 Corinthians 10:13). Because temptation doesn't warn you it's coming, we need to be on our guard and understand how temptation works.

James 1:14 says each one of us "is tempted when, by his own evil desire, he is dragged away and enticed." Temptation always begins with evil or destructive desires that deceive us (dragged away and enticed). These are hunting

and fishing terms meant to explain that our evil desires trap and lure us. Of course, traps are hidden, and fishing hooks have bait. A good hunter knows where to set a trap, and a good fisherman knows the right kind of bait to attract the fish he wants.

I think it's helpful to ask: What kind of bait gets you to bite? What kind of traps do you keep stepping into over and over again?

Next, when we are deceived, we always move toward disobedience to the Lord (this is called sin). James 1:15 says, "Then, after desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, gives birth to death." It is good to remember that, the longer sin is allowed to grow, the harder it is to stop. Finally, the end zone for disobedience is always death, which includes spiritual and relational separation from God.

If you are in a place in life where temptation always wins, I want to encourage

you to bounce your focus off what tempts you and place it on the Lord. The more your focus is on Jesus (in worship, reading the Bible, and prayer), the more you may experience temptation, but the easier it will be to resist.

One more thing... Refocusing from temptation to the Lord may also mean physically removing yourself from a situation. If you don't want to get stung, get away from the bees. The intersection of desire and opportunity is where sin blooms. Maybe you need to change the channel, get off that website, walk out of that movie, or change jobs. Be smart; put yourself in situations you know will help you to not be tempted. It is my hope that applying even just one thing from this article will give you the tools and encouragement to experience victory over temptation and sin.

MEET Ellie Roquet

Inspiring balance and personal growth through music

In the bustling halls of ADM Middle School, Ellie Roquet's passion for teaching and connecting with students is impossible to

A 2021 graduate of Wartburg College, Roquet began her teaching career splitting her time between DeSoto Intermediate and ADM Middle School. She taught one period of seventh-grade girls' choir at the middle school and spent the rest of her day teaching fifth- and sixth-grade general music and choir at DeSoto. Those early years sparked a realization about the growing needs of the district's music program.

Roquet advocated for a full-time middle school choir position, citing the enthusiasm

of younger students and the district's growth. By her third year, she transitioned to the middle school fulltime, where she now teaches seventhand eighth-grade choirs.

Roquet's commitment to growth didn't stop there. In her second year, she launched ADM's first middle school show choir — a non-audition group in which any seventh or eighth grader could participate.

"Show choir was such a huge part of my life growing up, and it's what made me want to be a choir teacher," Roquet says.

Starting a program from scratch wasn't easy, but she embraced the challenge.

"It's a big task to take on, especially when you look at the other metro schools and see their show choir programs have been around quite a while," Roquet says. "Starting it up has been a challenge, but the students have been willing to move forward and get it going with me."

Even with the hurdles, the show choir program has flourished, with risers purchased by the district and jackets funded by a donation from the Kiwanis Club. Last year, the group participated in its first competition and earned a Division II ranking, just one point shy of Division I.

"It sparked them a little bit, and they're ready for this next season when we go to two competitions," Roquet says.

Teaching has always been in Roquet's DNA, inspired by her mother, an elementary PE teacher. While Roquet initially considered careers in math or admissions counseling, music ultimately became her calling.

Middle school, in particular, holds a special place in Roquet's heart.

"They're just so ready to learn, even though they don't want to admit it sometimes," she says. "They're soaking up all that information, and I hope they learn that there is a balance. There is a balance between fine arts and athletics and all the other activities and academics, and it can be really overwhelming sometimes to do all of those things, but it's possible to do."

Beyond music, Roquet is also a coach for middle school volleyball and track, allowing her to connect with students in various capacities.

At the core of her teaching philosophy is a belief in balance. She encourages her students to pursue their passions across fine arts, athletics, academics and friendships.

A sticky note in her binder serves as her daily reminder: "I want every student to have the opportunity to be an athlete, a musician, a student, a friend, a teacher, a son or daughter, and a great person while getting 100% out of it." ■

Fast and reliable internet will soon be available to underserved and unserved Iowans, Panora Fiber, an independent communications company, located in Panora and Guthrie Center, that provides internet, TV and voice services to the surrounding areas, finished its Bagley fiber build in 2024, and service installations have begun for new customers from the rural Linden to Redfield fiber build. In spring 2025, construction will start in rural Redfield to Adel/Earlham, and, in summer 2025, in rural Madison County.

"There are now limited internet options in these rural areas. In some places, including wooded and hilly sections, the internet service is not very good," Panora Fiber General Manager Andy Randol said. "Residents deserve fiber optic internet, and Panora Fiber can't wait to bring it to them. As we complete segments of the construction in 2025, we hope to begin service installations in phases, barring

major weather issues or other disruptions."

New Panora Fiber customers will be able to select from Fiber Internet+ plans ranging from 200 Mbps to 2 Gig (2,000 Mbps) — all providing unmatched reliability and the best connections for streaming, gaming, work from home and more.

The fiber builds in rural Redfield to Adel/Earlham and rural Madison County are partially funded by an award from the State of Iowa's Empower Rural Iowa Broadband Grant Program, which helps bring ultra-fast internet to underserved and unserved areas. By the end of the project, Panora Fiber will have installed hundreds of miles of fiber optic cables and extended network connections to roughly 1,000 locations in Dallas and Madison

"It's important to note that this award won't cover all of our fiber build expenses. Panora Fiber has a lot of skin in the game," Randol said.

Residents of rural Redfield to Adel/ Earlham or rural Madison County can visit panorafiber.com/fiber-build for details. Completion of forms is the initial step in the process and provides Panora Fiber with the contact information required to move toward service installation. Those interested can also call 641-755-2424 to learn more about service availability.

"Due to rising construction costs, Panora Fiber will only do fiber drops in 2025 to households that have filled out an Application for Service Form with us and committed to becoming one of our internet customers," Randol said. "There's no charge to customers for these fiber drops."

To introduce fiber internet service to residents in these fiber build areas, Panora Fiber staff members will be going door to door in selected sections prior to construction.







Q: What could be causing knee pain in my child?

A: Osgood-Schlatter disease is a condition that can cause your adolescent son or daughter knee pain. With Osgood-Schlatter disease, the tendon that connects from the knee cap into the top of the shin becomes inflamed and starts to pull away from the bone. This is more prevalent during periods of growth spurts for kids, as they tend to grow faster than the tendon can possibly stretch.



Symptoms usually include pain, tenderness and swelling at the top of the shinbone or below the knee cap. This pain usually will increase with exercise or activity, especially running or jumping activities. They may also have tightness in the surrounding muscles, particularly in the thighs, which can enhance the pull on the tendon. Your doctor will probably perform a thorough physical examination, focusing on your child's knees and hips. X-rays may also be done in order to get a closer look at the knee. If the case is mild, the doctor may recommend rest and ice. With other cases, the doctor may prescribe anti-inflammatories, crutches and, in very extreme situations, surgery.

A physical therapist can help the healing process with interventions to correct muscle imbalances, such as a home exercise program involving stretching of the tightened muscles and tendons.

GASTROESOPHAGEAL reflux disease (GERD)

Gastroesophageal reflux disease, or GERD, is a chronic digestive condition where stomach acid or bile irritates the food-pipe lining. This occurs due to the weakening or malfunctioning of the lower esophageal sphincter, the muscle ring that closes off the esophagus from the stomach. As a result, stomach contents can flow back into the esophagus, causing discomfort and damage to the esophageal lining.



Common symptoms of GERD include heartburn, regurgitation of food or sour liquid, difficulty swallowing and chest pain, especially when lying down or after eating. Chronic GERD can lead to more serious complications such as esophagitis, Barrett's esophagus or esophageal cancer if left untreated.

Factors contributing to GERD include obesity, pregnancy, smoking, certain medications and consuming large meals or specific foods like fatty or fried items, coffee and alcohol.

Management and treatment of GERD often involve lifestyle changes such as maintaining a healthy weight, eating smaller meals, avoiding trigger foods, and not lying down immediately after eating. Medications like antacids, H2-receptor blockers and proton pump inhibitors can also help. In severe cases, surgery may be considered.

Addressing the causes and symptoms of GERD can prevent long-term health issues.




McGUIRE Video Production

SNOW AND ICE CONTROL – SNOW REMOVAL POLICY:

Here's the "snowdown" on some helpful tips to remember in the coming months:

Snow parking: It is unlawful to park any vehicle on any street or alley during a snow removal period. The ban continues from the beginning of snowfall until 24 hours after the snowfall ends. Residents should be aware of weather conditions and not park on City streets if there is a possibility of overnight snow.

Sidewalks: Snow removal from sidewalks is the responsibility of the property owner. You have 24 hours after the snowfall to clear your sidewalk. Please pile the snow on your yard and not in the City street. (A helpful hint for residents: clear your sidewalks after the snowplows have finished plowing to the curb. If you fail to clear your sidewalk, the City may do so and bill you.)

Snowmobiles: From November through March, snowmobiles may be operated on the Raccoon River Valley Trail between 7:00 a.m. and 10:30 p.m. The speed limit is 10 mph.

Mailboxes/Fire Hydrants: Residents are responsible for clearing snow around their mailbox to assure delivery of mail and that their mailbox is properly installed behind the curb line. The Fire Department requests property owners who have a hydrant to clear snow away for easier access.


