Mallory (Wilson) and Aaron Rowe both attended Iowa State University and hung out with a group of mutual friends. When Mallory noticed Aaron's tattoo, which says "Be Kind," she was intrigued.

"Plus, I thought he was cute," she smiles.

The pair attended ISU football games and other college activities. She met his family in Wisconsin, while he visited Mallory's parents in West Des Moines.

The pair moved to Milwaukee after college graduation, where Aaron proposed to Mallory in 2022. They planned the wedding for 2024, upon moving back to Iowa. In addition, Mallory's brother, Jack, was getting married, too, and they wanted to space out their weddings.

While attending other people's weddings, Mallory gained ideas about what she wanted — and didn't want — at their wedding. The couple moved back to West Des Moines and began planning the wedding in earnest.

Mallory and Aaron discussed their priorities: a party atmosphere rather than a formal, stuffy affair. She wanted the wedding to match her lively personality.

A secluded venue

The first step was setting the date and selecting the venue. They chose Barnes Place in the countryside near Adel. It includes a space for indoor activities, a long porch and a pond. The treelined venue is secluded and quiet from traffic and other distractions.

They set the date for June 22, 2024. Since weather might be a concern, the ceremony could be moved indoors in case of inclement weather. Mallory liked the flexibility of the different indoor and outdoor seating options.

The couple used a free online wedding planning service, The Knot, for RSVPs and gift registry. The pair put together a guest list of about 230 of their friends and family.

"We wanted both sides of our families to be there," Mallory explains. "We love to host and celebrate, so it was the only time we could invite

everyone. The venue was big enough."

She and her mom went dress shopping and selected a dress from Holland Bridal in Pella.

She admits she's not a "detail" person, but the couple put together a binder of wedding plans, guest lists and addresses, so it would be easier when sending out thank you notes.

Barnes Place recommended various vendors, and the couple selected Fireside Grille in Altoona as the caterer. Barnes Place was helpful in coordinating the wedding plans and details.

"We had a decorator and coordinator through Barnes Place," Mallory explains. "Paula (with Barnes Place) was great. We didn't have to worry about anything. It went smoothly. The weight of the planning was off our shoulders."

June 22 arrived, and the rain held out, although the heat moved in.

"I was dripping with sweat the whole day," she admits.



'The Hymn to Dionysus'


I can never get enough mythological retellings. Ancient stories retold for a modern audience attract me like a moth to flame. I spent so much of my childhood enthralled by stories of gods, monsters and mythic adventure that getting to relive it as an adult just feels right.

Dionysus has always been a fascinating god, with a hundred weird and wonderful myths. In this telling, Natasha Pulley pulls out all the stops to make this story as wild, intimate and confusing as the gods themselves.

Phaidros is a Thebean soldier who has never seen the home he fights for, never met his parents, and who is thrust into tangled knots of politics over and over again, forced to follow orders he doesn't understand. As he matures, he finds himself struggling and experiencing strange and terrifying things until he finds himself caught up in something he never could have predicted.

This is a difficult book to discuss without

spoilers, but there is so much to love about the rich characters, beautifully wrought settings and absolutely masterful writing. If you're looking for something that will challenge and delight you — something different, something wild — this is the book for you. \blacksquare — *Review by Julie Goodrich*

'Our Infinite Fates'

Romance is having a capital "M" moment. There's so much of it being published, it's dizzying to know how to even begin to find the gems amid the fluff. For those looking for something a little different than the typical bodice-ripper, this beautifully epic tale is a great place to start.

Evelyn and Arden are ancient souls with a lot of baggage. They've fought the same fight throughout time, living hundreds of lives that always end with Arden murdering Evelyn. Time and again, Evelyn sees the end coming but can't stop it. This time, however, she is determined to stop the fate she's faced so many times before. She's going to find Arden first and fight for this life she's built.

Told in alternating chapters between the current iteration of the pair and a variety of their

past lives, this is a book filled with longing, regret and a unique spin on the concept of soul mates. I found the history fascinating and the writing felt poetic, like listening to an ancient epic. I was enthralled in a way that most romance fails to do for me. If you are looking for something soaring and heartbreaking this winter, I can't recommend this one enough. \blacksquare — *Review by Julie Goodrich*



WHAT to know about 're-grief'

When children have someone significant in their life die, it can be difficult to know how to best support them. It's natural to want to "fix it," but this is one of those things we cannot fix.

Children will continue to grieve as their development and understanding of the world changes. When the death occurs, the child understands only as fully as their cognitive development allows. As they age, and their development changes, their



understanding changes, too. They may have new questions or wonderings and may express their grief in new ways. This is called "re-grief" and can sometimes catch their adults off guard.

While our fundamental understanding of death may not change after adulthood, our understanding and experience of grief can change over time, too. Whenever a new life milestone occurs (i.e., we get married), we understand the world in a different way (as a newly married person). This can also have an impact on our grief. Remember, there is no time limit on grief.

How to help? 1. Listen, compassionately. "It makes sense you feel that and repeatedly if asked — in consistent, developmentally appropriate ways. 3. Encourage creative and physical activities (that they enjoy) to get feelings out of their bodies. 4. Encourage sharing memories and, if you knew their person, share memories you have. They may learn something new about them, and what a gift that is.

WHAT DOES an executor of an estate do?

The executor is the person named in a Last Will and Testament who bears the responsibility of finalizing a deceased person's estate. If you have been nominated as an executor, there are certain critical things you need to do.



The executor's job is to carry out the decedent's wishes outlined in the will. There is a reason the will writer named you. Your job is to ensure the estate is distributed correctly and that the decedent's affairs are wrapped up. You want to do it efficiently and correctly, but you also want to honor the decedent's wishes.

Get ready to rumble

You will need to communicate with many people: heirs, beneficiaries, family members who may think they are entitled to money, creditors and more. Brace yourself for potential conflict. You have to manage the emotions and expectations of heirs. Some may resent your authority. Some may question why you were named as executor. Some may just be desperate for money and not understand that the process takes time.

Get organized

You should take immediate steps to safeguard property. Secure the residence and take valuables to a safe place. Get all of the information you can on assets: bank records, investment information, life insurance policies, etc. Because being an executor is such an involved job, you should keep records of all of your work. Make a spreadsheet of assets and liabilities, keep meticulous records, and make a checklist of action items.

File the paperwork

Merely being named as the executor in a Last Will and Testament isn't enough. You have to file the will with the probate court and obtain a court order and letters of appointment (Letters Testamentary) to be vested with the authority to act on behalf of the estate. Make sure you go through the proper legal channels to guarantee you have the power to carry out your role.

Hire an attorney

The process of probate is not one that can be navigated alone. You need to have legal representation and advice to ensure that you follow the law. There are statutes regarding notification of heirs, timelines for disposing of property, and tax matters to handle. You don't have to do this job alone. Partner with an experienced probate attorney to help you.

A LIFETIME of volunteering

Walters makes a meaningful difference in the lives of youth.



Volunteering is a part of who Leyria Walters is.

Since moving to West Des Moines in 1977, she has become an integral part of the community, dedicating her time and energy to causes that enhance it and uplift others.

"This is home," she says simply.

Over the years, Walters has been involved in a wide range of volunteer efforts. From Girl Scouts to Sunday school, the PTA, and the American Heart Association, she has found ways to support those around her.

But one of the causes closest to her heart is the Youth Justice Initiative (YJI) through the West Des Moines Police Department.

The YJI program is designed to engage crime victims and community members in the justice process. It holds young offenders accountable to those they have harmed, seeks to restore victims' losses as much as possible, and provides opportunities for conversation and problem-solving.

Participants take part in a monthly circle where they first address their offense and then focus on self-improvement. Each week, they attend a study table, receiving a free meal and homework assistance in a safe space where they can grow and learn. As part of the program, they also participate in family classes, volunteer in the community and write letters of apology. Some former participants now volunteer for the program, as do some parents.

"It's a pretty cool system," Walters says.

Her passion for working with young people extends beyond YJI. In her last teaching job, Walters worked with "at-promise" students — her way of referring to youth at risk. She found meaning in helping them believe in themselves and their potential.

Walters finds that volunteering not only allows her to give back but also enriches her own life. It helps her make new friends, stay connected to the community, and gives her a sense of purpose.

"I'm a people person," she says.

Over the years, she has received notes from the young people she has worked with — messages of gratitude that she keeps as reminders of the difference she's made. She knows that, one day, when she can no longer volunteer, those notes will serve as memories of a lifetime of service.

But, for now, she's still hard at work, alongside many other dedicated volunteers.

"It takes many people to get the job done," she says. ■

LIBRARY'S outreach program

Provides materials for 2,000 seniors

Books provide entertainment, information and an escape from the ordinary. Readers turn to the library for much-needed resources. Yet, not all folks can easily get to a library.

That's where the West Des Moines Public Library Senior Outreach Program comes in. The homebound delivery program provides a browsable collection of materials, including large print, DVDs, books on CD and Playaway audio books.

Betsy Richter is the WDMPL homebound and outreach assistant and manages deposit collections in 20 assisted living facilities in WDM, reaching about 2,000 seniors. Volunteers also deliver materials to the homebound.

Materials are exchanged once a month, and no library card or check out is needed.

"Many of our senior living communities have a very literate clientele," Betsy says. "One person told me that, in a month, she was able to read 18 of the books we had provided."

The service provides memory care bundles designed for people with memory concerns. Materials include no-text picture books, conversation cards and reminisce books highlighting different decades. These books prompt conversation with families and staff and are designed to calm and provide comfort.

After a need was identified to serve the homebound and senior communities, the program expanded over the years. The WDM Library Friends Foundation (a nonprofit that helps fund WDM library services, materials and programs) helped to fund the project.

Betsy says a recent study from the Alzheimer's Association shows that reading can help prevent or delay the onset of dementia.

"A recent census data estimates that 14.6% of West Des Moines' population is over the age of 65," she adds. "These taxpaying citizens deserve the right to have library materials. Many people at this age experience mobility issues. This service allows them to utilize their library and find ways to expand their minds and find entertainment."

Betsy's goal is to provide better services and materials for all residents, including service to folks in hospice.

"It is a joy to know that people who find

comfort in reading are able to do so until the very end," she says.

The goal is to provide the aging population with the best possible care.

"Writer Rita Mae Brown said, 'When I got (my) library card, that is when my life began,' " Betsy says. "It's never too late to get a library card and start your next adventure with a good book."

The public can help by donating to the library and joining the WDM Library Friends Foundation. The tax-deductible donations also support library youth and adult programming and the new Words on Wheels vehicle. Honored as Social Studies Teacher of the Year

One of the ways she engages students is through oral history and personal experiences. She offers guest speakers, including Vietnam War veterans, refugees and boat people for their personal stories.

"It's very cathartic for veterans. Some of them have never talked about their experiences before."

Krois interviewed a parent about 9/11.

"It's really a memorable day in history for a lot of people," she explains. She says some people think social studies is controversial.

"I teach history and what happened. I let kids see different

perspectives," she explains. "There are always topics to build on each other throughout history."

In her classes, she tries to represent other countries.

"Sometimes history has been Americanized. I work with a wide population of kids, and I want them to see themselves in the subjects I teach," Krois says.

Krois travels during summer months and returns with ideas and history to share in the classroom. It's a bucket-list goal of hers to visit every presidential grave.

"Now I have to go see Jimmy Carter's," she reflects.

One reason she likes teaching is the diverse population of the students. "I learn so much from them. It's like I get to travel abroad when they share their traditions. It's neat."

Krois says she enjoyed "coming home" to teach at Valley.

"I work with really good people," she says. "All of the people I work with are deserving of the award. I just happened to get it."

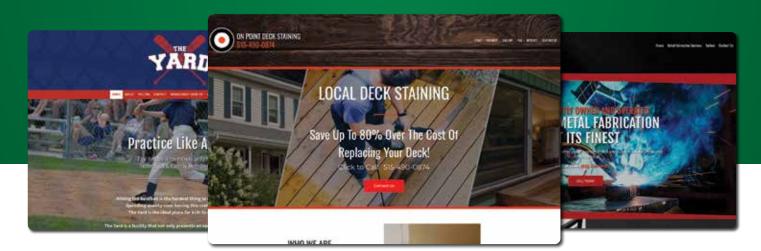


