BUTLER BRANCH

The quiet little stream that flows out of the northwest corner of Adel and divides Kinnick Feller Park from Oakdale Cemetery was named after Adel's first land agent, who turned out to be a man of questionable reputation.

Thomas Butler came to Adel in 1847. He was a hustling sort of fellow and was named the first lot fund agent for the newly formed town. He figured prominently in politics, occasionally acted as a preacher and, for a while, was quite popular. He sold nine lots that October, but the demand was so poor and the price so low that, for a time, the founders withdrew them from the market. Then it was discovered that Butler had left his home in Missouri because of some financial troubles and had settled in Adel in the hope of making some money. After his reputation caught up with

him, he was asked to resign as lot agent. He then moved elsewhere, leaving "a deficit in his official accounts."

The stream that bears his name

still trickles peacefully around the cemetery and is also known as Butler Creek. The northern branch

LET'S GO FISHING, PAL

I have often wondered, like many of you, why immigrants don't come into our country the legal way. The answer, I am told, is that the process is quite complicated, lengthy and costly. Still, I pondered, is it worth breaking the law and risking having you and your family deported? Then, I tried to buy a fishing license.

Yes, a fishing license. It's a simple document with the Iowa Department of Natural Resources to show that I paid a fee and can legally cast a line in the water in the state of Iowa. Sure, I could risk it and break the law, but I wanted to do the right thing. So, I visited the DNR website and attempted to buy a license, but my only choices were non-resident options. Keep in mind, I have lived in Iowa for the last 20 years. Apparently, though, I purchased a one-day, non-resident Iowa fishing license as Nebraska resident a few decades ago while camping at an Iowa state park. As such, that address is carved in stone in the Iowa DNR database, and I was unable to buy an Iowa resident fishing license online. Ugh!

Still wanting to do the right

thing, I bypassed the website and visited a local retailer to buy a fishing license. The clerk asked for my driver's license, which showed my



Iowa address. When he pulled up my options on his screen, I saw the same results — only non-resident choices. At this point, I was willing to pay more and simply buy a non-resident license, but I couldn't because it didn't match the address on my driver's license. Ugh! Ugh!

The store clerk told me to call the DNR weekdays between 8 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. This didn't aid me in my effort to fish that weekend, but I decided to do the right thing and call on Monday. I talked with a helpful DNR representative and explained my situation. She said I would need to fill out a "residency change" form and submit that, and she directed me to the DNR website. I could not find that form in the list of 700-plus links, despite word searching for the exact name. Ugh! Ugh!

So, I printed the two-page form and

began filling it out manually. It was a basic information request — until section two where I was instructed to attach a copy of all of the following: a recent paystub, a copy of a utility bill, my home purchase agreement, a vehicle registration and a copy of my driver's license. Seriously. For a fishing license. Ugh! Ugh! Ugh! Ugh!

But wait. There is good news in this story. A DNR employee replied to an earlier email of mine and verified my account.

Despite the frustrations, in the end, a logical human being made sense of it all. This process gave me a better appreciation of what those who attempt to become legal American citizens must face. I am still not going to purposely break the law, and I don't expect others to either, but there has to be a better way.

began in the center of Colfax Township while the southern branch started in Adams Township. There is even a poem, written many years ago, about its beauty. I could not determine who the author was.

O, Butler Branch was a famous stream

To the boys I used to know I am proud to tell, that I knew it well

In the days of long ago It was such a stream, it seems to me.

That nature did intend To swell the joys of bare-foot boys In pleasures without end. It wound about through wooded dells

Past many a grassy glade; With many a pool so deep and cool

In sunshine and in shade.

(There are several more verses not included here. The poem ends with:)

Don't talk to me of mountains grand

Of seashore lake or ranch: None can compare in beauty fair, With good old Butler Branch.

Oakdale Cemetery, Adel's third burial ground, was laid out prior to 1880. The first bridge over Butler Branch into the cemetery was north of the present one. It fell into disrepair, so, in 1910, a contract was awarded to the Marsh Engineering Co. to construct a new concrete bridge over Butler Branch at the entrance to the cemetery. "It will be of ornamental design built of reinforced concrete and will be north of the pavilion." The county supervisors agreed to help the town with the expense in the form of \$750 from the county bridge fund.

The newspaper reported that "A new road to the bridge was graded up several feet and covered with gravel. A winding driveway from the west entrance at the end of Walnut Street was laid out to the cemetery and it will be a pleasant and attractive drive."

This bridge is still in use today as the entrance to Oakdale Cemetery.
