Continued GROWTH

POLK CITY EXPANDS WITH PURPOSE.

It's no secret Polk City is in the middle of a big moment. Growth is happening all around — from new housing developments to fresh energy in the business district. And people are noticing. What was once a quiet spot in the heart of Iowa is now one of the Des Moines metro's most talkedabout communities.

Currently, development is underway for a commercial area across from Kwik Star. Construction is also in progress on a new city water tower with completion expected in May 2026. The Polk City Junction Trail continues to expand, connecting the High Trestle and Neil Smith trails throughout town. And who could forget the multi-acre municipal park? Although bond funding

for the project failed, a new committee is now exploring alternative funding options.

This is all just to name a few of the big projects in the works.

Even with all the change, Polk City hasn't lost its footing. The town continues to grow at a steady pace, guided by a commitment to keeping its small-town feel intact. New businesses are settling in and becoming part of the fabric of the community, helping meet local needs and creating new spaces for people to connect.

As Polk City looks ahead, it is doing so with intention — welcoming progress while holding tight to the character and sense of belonging that make it feel like home.

OAK & BERK OPENS STOREFRONT

What began as a basement business nearly 11 years ago has grown into a special part of the Polk City community. Oak & Berk, originally known as 417 Designs, recently opened a storefront just off the Polk City Square, marking an exciting new chapter for owner Ashley Schrage.

Oak & Berk offers a mix of apparel, home décor and gifts, with a special focus on school spirit wear. In fact, it was the popularity of that product line that prompted Schrage to move out of her home and search for a permanent retail space.

"Spring of 2023, we introduced spirit wear to our lineup, and, by spring of 2024, we were looking for a production facility as we had outgrown my house," she shares. "Fall of 2024, we opened what was intended to be just a production facility but turned into our storefront plus production based on community feedback. Customers wanted a place they could walk in and readily get Comet gear, a gift for a friend, or a gift for that last-minute birthday party their child was invited to."

In October 2024, Oak & Berk officially opened in a repurposed house at 109 W. Van Dorn St. Schrage first connected with the building's owner, now her landlord, through their shared involvement with the Polk City Community Foundation.

"Before you know it, she had a space for me, and the rest is history," she says.

Although her goal had been to open by August, just in time for the school year, construction delays pushed the timeline back. But when Oak & Berk held its soft opening during homecoming week, it was clear the timing still worked out perfectly.

"We had our soft opening the week of homecoming, and there was nothing soft about it," Schrage jokes. "The community showed up in a big way. That's when I knew we were right where we needed to be."

Since that day, Schrage says the support from the community has been incredible and gracious. "When you pour into your passion, people notice and want to be a part of it," she says. "We've created relationships with many of our customers-turned-friends and love seeing them stop in or out in the community."

Her favorite visitors, though, aren't always adults.

"This summer, we've had many kids ride their bikes and scooters up to the shop," she shares. "Sometimes they purchase something, sometimes they just use the restroom, but it warms my heart knowing they feel comfortable coming into the store."

That sense of community goes both ways. Schrage feels a strong pull to give back, and Oak & Berk has already hosted fundraisers, made donations, sponsored events and partnered with the school district. A fun collaboration with the high school is also in the works, though details are still under wraps. In the meantime, she's preparing for RVTV's visit on Sept. 5 and the third annual Small Business Saturday on Nov. 29.

For nearly a decade, Schrage ran her business online and at pop-up markets. While she recognized customers' names, the relationships didn't go much deeper than that.

"Being able to see people face to face has been my absolute favorite part," she says of having a brick and mortar store. "Learning about their families, hobbies and styles has been so fun. Being involved in the Polk City Downtown District has also helped nurture relationships with other business owners in town as well."

Even when the doors aren't open to customers, Schrage and her team are often inside, hard at work. Most of what Oak & Berk sells is made in-house — a benefit for customers who want to see, touch and try things before they buy.

"Having customers able to stop in and try different styles and sizes before ordering or purchasing has been beneficial," she says.

From basement beginnings to a storefront full of stories, Oak & Berk is built with community and ready for whatever is next.

A POLK CITY FAVORITE SINCE 1998

For more than 25 years, Papa's Pizzeria has been a staple in Polk City, serving up pizza, pasta, sandwiches and more, all made with fresh, housemade dough and sauces.

But, beyond the menu, what really defines the restaurant is its heart — owner Shawn Comer. Shawn Comer is owner of Papa's Pizzeria, a staple in the Polk City community.

Papa's first opened its doors in February 1998 as a family-owned restaurant. Over the years, the menu has grown to include wraps, salads, wings, appetizers and, now, a full bar. Yet its roots remain the same with quality food made from scratch, served in a welcoming space.

"I feel more comfortable in a small town since I grew up in one," Comer explains of why he opened a business in Polk City. "The people are super nice, and I can get involved in committees and projects and fundraising. I embraced the community, and they, in turn, embraced me. I love Polk City and the people who live here."

That community-minded spirit became especially clear during the pandemic. When COVID-19 forced the dining room to close, Comer used the time to remodel the space, including updating the bathrooms and dining area. In 2024, he took another step forward by adding a full bar and introducing new menu items like hot honey pizzas, Reese's pie, and a more extensive gluten-free lineup.

For Comer, even the daily drive to work



is a highlight.

"I get to drive across the mile-long bridge every day and see Big Creek and Saylorville Lake and all of the beauty that comes with it," he says.

Family also plays a big role in the business. Every Sunday, the Comers gather for dinner, and conversation often turns to what is next for Papa's.

"We want to do at least one project every year to enhance our business," he says.

With nearly 50 years in the restaurant industry, Comer brings decades of experience to Papa's. But what keeps him going is the people he works with.

"I love working with today's youth and teaching them life skills and responsibilities," he says. "They are like family to me, and I couldn't do it without them."

NEW TO TOWN

Keilin Isaacson and her husband, Greg, fell in love with the charm and close-knit feel of Polk City. So much so, they knew they wanted to open a business in town.

"As healthcare professionals and parents, we saw a vibrant community growing in both families and opportunity, yet there was a noticeable gap in access to personalized aesthetic and wellness care," Isaacson explains. "With no other med spa presence in town, we knew Polk City would be the perfect place to plant roots, connect with people, and offer something truly meaningful."

That presence is now Lush Lifestyle Medicine, a wellness and aesthetics practice rooted in the belief that health and beauty go hand in hand.

Opening on the Polk City Square in August, Lush will offer advanced aesthetic services and evidence-based wellness treatments, including things like dermal fillers, microneedling, weight optimization, hormone therapy, IV hydration and more.

"We've poured so much heart into creating a space that feels welcoming, modern and tailored to the unique needs of this community," Isaacson says.

So far, the Isaacsons have felt a tremendous amount of support from the Polk City community.

"From kind messages and shoutouts on social media to people stopping by during renovations just to say hello, we've felt so welcomed," Isaacson says. "We've met so many amazing locals already, and it's been humbling to hear how excited people are to have us here "

Greg and Keilin Isaacson are owners of a new business, Lush Lifestyle Medicine, a wellness and aesthetics practice.

What excites the husband-and-wife duo most is being able to serve the community where people live, work and raise their families.

"Having a physical presence in Polk City allows us to build real relationships with our patients and offer a consistent, elevated experience that feels close to home," Isaacson says. "We absolutely believe it will help our business grow, not just in numbers, but in impact."

Lush Lifestyle Medicine also plans to host educational events, model call opportunities, and community wellness days that invite people to learn, connect and feel their best. Long term, their vision is to continue growing as a trusted name in lifestyle medicine throughout Iowa.

"We're deeply grateful for the warm welcome and can't wait to serve this incredible community," Isaacson says.

WHEN DO I NEED A BUILDING PERMIT?

All construction projects require a Building Application Permit be submitted online at www.polkcityia.gov.



All new construction, remodels, additions, alterations, conversions, repairs, removals and demolitions require a building permit. Decks, fences, signs and detached sheds also are required to be permitted. Plumbing, mechanical and electrical work require trade permits. All work must conform to applicable city codes and ordinances of The City of Polk City. Work must not commence until a valid building permit has been approved and issued with all associated fees paid. A permit will be issued once all requirements have been met. Permits will be valid for one year and work must commence withing 180 days of being issued to remain valid.

DO I NEED A PET LICENSE?

Annual licenses are required for all pets in Polk City. Every owner of a cat or dog 6 months or older must get a license for it from the clerk's office. Registration begins the first day of January each year. Late fees begin April 1. To obtain a license, a pet owner must present a current rabies vaccination certificate.

ARE COMMUNITY FACILITIES FOR RENT?

Miller Park Shelter House is one of two enclosed facilities available for rent. It is ideal for birthday parties, graduation celebrations, and baby or bridal showers, with a seating capacity of 51, restrooms, full kitchen and heating and air conditioning. The community room at City Hall is also available to rent. It is ideal for weddings, graduation celebrations, family gatherings, baby/bridal showers, meetings and trainings with a capacity of 172. Two parks have open air shelters available for reservations or can be used on a first-come, first-served basis. WHAT ABOUT RECYCLING AND WASTE REMOVAL?

For trash collection, call City Hall to request a Metro Waste Authority container. Collection will occur on Fridays. Residents should have their brown cart at the curb by 6 a.m. on Fridays. If you have a missed collection, contact Metro Waste Authority at 515-244-0021.

For recycling, contact City Hall to request a Curb-it Cart. Curb It! is the residential recycling program that equips each home with a green Curb It! cart to set at the curb bi-weekly on the same day as garbage collection. In Polk City, that means Curb It! Carts are picked up every other

Friday morning by Metro Waste Authority. Learn more at mwatoday.com/wasterecycling.





For yard waste in Polk City, you can subscribe to the Compost It! program for curbside yard waste disposal. Yard waste like grass clippings, leaves and garden vegetation are not allowed in your regular garbage, but that doesn't mean it's difficult to dispose of it in a safe, smart way. A few different disposal options are available, and the Compost It! season runs the first full week of April until the last week of November, plus two weeks after Christmas. During this time, residents in participating communities can dispose of yard and garden waste at

the curb using bags, stickers or carts. Learn about each of these options on Metro Waste Authority's website

Polk City has a recycling center and brush pile at 409 E. Northside Drive. The recycling center is open Monday through Sunday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. It is open to everyone and handles cardboard and mixed paper, plastic bottles and tin cans. This area is funded by the Metro Waste Authority.

The brush pile is open to Polk City utility customers only (photo ID required). It is open Mondays and Fridays from 7:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. and the first Saturday of the month, 8 a.m. to noon. Disposal of routine maintenance items such as grass clippings, leaves, tree trimmings and organic landscaping waste can all be done there.

HOW DO I CONTACT PUBLIC WORKS FOR CITY MAINTENANCE QUESTIONS?

Some of the responsibilities of the Public Works Department include maintaining the city water supply, sanitary sewer and storm water sewer systems; street maintenance, street cleaning, snow and ice removal on streets and city property; and maintaining city parks. For anything concerning these areas, call 515-984-6233. After hours, call 515-984-6565. The Public Works Department is open Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. and on-call 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The Public Works Maintenance Facility is located at 301 E. Northside Drive.



HISTORY OF POLK CITY



Polk City emerged as a predominantly rural community in the 19th century, enjoying slow but steady growth throughout its history. Polk City has experienced considerable change during its 175-year history.

Native Americans first cut paths through the timber and prairie, followed by European settlers in the late 1840s. Several sources indicate that some of the first settlers used the remnants of an abandoned Native American village along present day Booth Street for their settlement.

The first Polk City area settler was George Beebe, who arrived in 1846. Beebe was instrumental in laying out the town, and he also donated land for a town square and mandated that the land be used as a park. The Town Square remains the center of the community today. 1846 also marked the construction of the first water-powered mill that was built in the Big Creek area to grind livestock feed, wheat and corn.

In May 1850, Polk City was officially recorded as a town, and, five years later, the town outmatched Des Moines with a flour mill, five shoe shops, three general stores and five saloons. However, Des Moines — then known as Fort Des Moines — still managed to become the county seat of Polk County, and, in 1857, Polk City fell just



short of becoming Iowa's new state capital to Des Moines.

In 1874, the Des Moines & Minneapolis Railroad built a line between Ames and Des Moines through Polk City. Five years later, Polk City was nearly bypassed by the railroad in favor of straightening the route from Ames to Des Moines. In response to protest, a compromise was made, and the Polk City Junction line was established and then incorporated in 1875.

A turning point in Polk City history came in the 1960s when planning began for the Saylorville Reservoir. The Army Corps of Engineers presented two alternative plans. The first option was to buy out and relocate Polk City residents to allow Saylorville Lake to encompass the area. The second, and chosen, option allowed for the preservation of Polk City by creating a second dam to form Big Creek Lake. This decision has resulted in a significant amount of development in Polk City since the






