



Can I pay my utility bill online?

Yes! Pay online at www.AnkenyIowa.gov.

How can I get information about my property or real estate taxes?

Contact the Polk County Auditor's Office at 515-286-3753, the Polk County Assessor's Office at 515-286-3140, the Polk County Treasurer's Office at 515-286-3060 or visit www.assess.co.polk.ia.us.

How do I report a crime?

In case of an emergency, dial 911. To report a crime or any suspicious activity, contact the Ankeny Police Department nonemergency number at 515-286-3333, option 5. Reports can be made anonymously.

How do I contact animal control?

To report an animal control issue, contact the Ankeny Police Department nonemergency number at 515-286-3333, option 5.

Where can I register to vote?

Iowa residents may register online or download a registration form at https:// sos.iowa.gov/elections/voterinformation/ voterregistration.html.

Are fireworks allowed?

Use of fireworks is limited to July 4, 9 a.m. to 11 p.m., in Ankeny. Residents may only use consumer fireworks on their own personal property or on the property of a person who has consented to the use of consumer fireworks on his/her property. Use of fireworks on any public property is prohibited, including streets and parks.

Can I have a fire pit on my property?

Yes, recreational fires are allowed. Fires must be contained in an incinerator, outdoor fireplace, barbecue grill or barbecue pit and occupy an area of 3 feet or less in diameter and 2 feet or less in height. Open burning is not permitted, and a permit is required from the fire department for bonfires. Please consult the Recreational Fires Guidelines at www.AnkenyIowa.gov/home/showdocument?id=5803.

How do I reserve a shelter house for my event?

Make reservations online at www.AnkenyIowa.gov/register or call Parks & Recreation, 515-963-3570.

When is construction noise allowed?

Construction noise is allowed from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m., Monday through Friday, and 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. To report a violation, contact the Ankeny Police Department non-emergency number, 515-286-3333, option 5.

Where can I post garage sale/real estate/political signs?

Signs must be placed at least 5 feet from the inner edge of the sidewalk and at least 5 feet from any adjoining property. Temporary signs are not allowed in the public right-of-way (grassy area between the street and sidewalk). Garage sale signs are limited to a maximum of three days in advance of each sale and a half mile from the garage sale location but not within 300 feet of a major arterial intersection. Political signs must be removed 10 days after the election for which they were applicable.

Where do I get a pet license and Dog Park pass?

Visit AnkenyIowa.gov/pet. The City is partnering with PetData.com to offer online licensing. Deadline to apply is March 31. The fee for a pet license is \$15 per altered pet and \$25 per unaltered pet. A copy of current rabies vaccination is required. Dog Park passes are \$25 for residents and \$35 for nonresidents.

How do I get a library card?

Visit the library in person with photo identification and proof of current address. Children ages 12-17 need a photo ID or legal guardian present, and ages 0-11 must have a legal guardian present to apply. You may also apply online at www.AnkenyIowa. gov/library.

What is the snow ordinance?

A snow ordinance may be issued based on several factors including snow, sleet, freezing rain and blowing snow. When a snow ordinance is in effect, no parking is allowed on any public streets, alleys and on-street parking

until the City officially lifts the ordinance. Know when a snow ordinance is in effect by signing up for text alerts; text ANKENY to 97063 or visit www.AnkenyIowa.gov. As a property owner, it is your responsibility to clear snow from all sidewalks on or adjacent to your property within 24 hours after snow has stopped falling.

Is there a city ordinance for maintaining my yard?

Yes! Grass, weeds or other vegetation on your property should not exceed a height in excess of 12 inches.

When do I need a building permit?

Various projects require a permit. Visit www.Ankenylowa.gov/doing-business/building-information to view guidelines.

How do I register my child for sports?

Register online at www.AnkenyIowa.gov/register.

How do I report a broken streetlight or power outage?

How do I find out if a City event has been canceled due to weather?

Call the Weather Cancellation Hotline, 515-963-3575, for Parks & Recreation programs. Ankeny Kirkendall Public Library programs typically follow the Ankeny Community School District's weather cancellation announcements.

HISTORY OF ANKENY



John and Sarah Ankeny acquired the 80-acre tract of land on which the town of Ankeny was originally developed on July 11, 1874. On April 19, 1875, they laid out the plan for the city that bears their last name and recorded the plat three days later on April 22.

The Ankenys built the first store and post office on the corner of S.W. Third and S.W. Cherry; a combination hotel and boarding house was later built. John Ankeny was a promoter and stockholder of the Minnesota Narrow Gauge Railroad, which was later built through the town of Ankeny. That track is now the High Trestle Trail.

The original development of Ankeny is known as "Uptown." Going "downtown" meant you were going to Des Moines.

On Feb. 28, 1903, Ankeny was incorporated as a town, with a total incorporated area of 1-square mile. Seven years after its incorporation, the United States census indicated the city had a population of 445.

Telephone service quickly followed incorporation, and electricity was made

available for the first time in 1907. Extensive electrical service was not generally available to residents until 1919 when the Central Light and Power Company was granted a franchise to operate a power plant in

Ankeny.

In 1907, Ankeny's first fire department was organized on a volunteer basis. The firefighting equipment at the time consisted of three ladders and 24 galvanized pails.

Between 1932 and 1940, Ankeny experienced four major fires that almost

destroyed the uptown business area. Most of the businesses rebuilt.

By 1942, the federal government had established an ordnance plant for the manufacture of ammunition on the site now occupied by John Deere Des Moines Works, Des Moines Area Community College and

Prairie Trail.


Ankeny's population experienced a rapid increase that continued after John Deere purchased the plant in October 1947. Production of corn pickers began in February 1948, with 570 employees.

By 1950, the town had grown to 1,229 citizens, and, by 1958, the first home mail delivery began. Ankeny was officially declared a city in 1961, and the number of residents living in Ankeny was 2,964 — more than double the 1950 total.

On June 18, 1974, a 20-minute storm rocked Ankeny, destroying homes, schools and a shopping center and killing two residents as they slept.

residents. A special census taken in 2005 showed Ankeny's population at 36,161 and a land size of 26.45 square miles. Ankeny has seen tremendous growth in its size and population. The 2010 census counted 45,582 residents and a land area of 29.14 square miles. Today, Ankeny has more than 65,000 residents.

Am I registered to vote in lowa?

Search the Iowa Secretary of State's website to see if you are currently registered to vote.

sos.iowa.gov/elections/voterinformation

How do I register to vote?

Download and complete the Official Iowa Voter Registration Form at sos.iowa. gov/elections/voterinformation. Polk County residents should mail completed form to the County Auditor's office: 120 Second Ave., Des Moines, IA 50309. Official Iowa Registration Forms are also available at the Ankeny Kirkendall Public Library reference desk.

Where do I vote?

On Election Day, you must vote in the precinct where you live. Locate your precinct or polling place online through the Iowa Secretary of State's web site. sos.iowa.gov/elections/voterinformation. You may also contact the Polk County Auditor at 515-286-3247 to find out where the polling place for your precinct will be and when the list of precinct polling places and sample ballots will be printed.

Do I need an ID to vote?

Yes! Iowa voters are required to show an Iowa driver's license or non-operator ID, U.S. passport, U.S. military ID or veteran's ID, tribal ID/document or Iowa voter ID card at the polls before they vote. A voter without one of the listed forms of ID may have the voter's identity attested to by another registered voter in the precinct or may prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents. Voters without the necessary ID or an attester will be offered a provisional ballot and can provide ID up until the time of the county canvass of votes (Monday after election day for Primary and General Elections).

When do I vote?

Polling places will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. for all elections.

Absentee voting

To vote absentee, download and complete the Official Absentee Ballot Request Form at sos.iowa.gov/elections/voterinformation. Polk County residents should mail completed form to the County Auditor's office: 120 Second Ave., Des Moines, IA 50309

Additional information



RECYCLING COLLECTION

Metro Waste Authority's Curb

It! program provides each residential household in MWA's service area with a 96-gallon cart with automated collection with every-other-week pickup. For those who generate less trash, 48-gallon carts are available. Requests for the smaller carts can be made by calling 24-GREEN. An exchange fee may apply. Check the lid on your cart for the pickup schedule in your area, and be sure to set your cart out by 7 a.m. For more information about the Curb It! program, call Metro Waste Authority at 515-244-0021.

Accepted Items

- Plastic containers "necked" containers and yogurt/margarine tubs
- Newspapers including inserts
- · Mixed paper
- Cardboard must be broken down and cut to fit into cart
- Shredded paper can be recycled in your new cart but it needs to be contained in a paper product such as a cereal or cardboard box or a paper sack
- · Tin and aluminum cans
- Paper food cartons milk (including soy, chocolate and cream), juice, protein drinks, wine, egg substitutes, soup and broth

Items NOT Accepted

- · Garbage or yard debris
- Food-contaminated material (e.g., frozen dinner containers)
- Plastic bags or containers with motor oil or other hazardous materials

City Recycling Events

The City of Ankeny and the Public Works department host a variety of recycling and clean up events throughout the year.
2022 Dates:

- Earth Day Stream and Watershed Cleanup: April 23, 8-11 a.m.
- Ankeny Cleanup Days, May 14, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.; May 15, noon to 4 p.m. Typically held annually every spring, residents can dispose of large unwanted items free of charge. The designated site for Cleanup Days is at Ankeny Sanitation headquarters, located at 7002 S.E. Delaware Ave.
- Tree and Branch Recycling: May 14, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.; May 15, noon to 4 p.m.; Oct. 1, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Held three times each year, Tree and Branch Recycling Days allow Ankeny residents to dispose of trees and branches free of charge. The designated site for Tree and Branch Recycling Days is at the City Maintenance Facility, 211 S.E. Lorenz Drive.
- Leaf Collection Days: Oct. 22 Nov. 20. Held each fall, this four-week program allows Ankeny residents to dispose of leaves free of charge. The designated site for leaf collection is the Prairie Ridge Family Aquatic Center, 1220 N.W. Prairie Ridge Drive.
- Christmas Tree Pick-Up: January. Held each January, residents can place their Christmas trees along the curb, in the right-of-way. City crews will make one pass through the community. Residents living in private developments or on private streets should also place their trees upon the city right-of-way to be picked up. City crews cannot access private streets or drives to pick up trees.
- Cardboard Recycling Drop-off: Sites available every day. Visit one of the free cardboard recycling drop-off locations in Ankeny: City Maintenance Facility, 211 S.E. Lorenz Drive, and Prairie Ridge Middle School, 1010 N.W. Prairie Ridge Drive.

Cart Placement Guidelines

Curb It! is an automated collection program designed to make it easier for you to recycle. When participating in automated collection programs, there are a few cart placement guidelines to follow. Your help is appreciated in making it easier for carts to be collected.

- · Your cart should be within 18 inches of the curb with the short metal bar facing the street. To avoid damage to public and private property, place the cart at least three feet away from mailboxes, lamp posts and other permanent structures.
- Place your cart on as level of a surface as possible but away from low-hanging tree branches.
- Yard waste bags, garbage carts, Curb It! carts and other large items should be spaced three feet apart.
- Close lids prior to pick-up lids must be closed on your Curb It! carts in order for the recyclables to be collected.

MANAGING STORMWATER

Help improve water quality in Ankeny

Learning about Stormwater and Runoff

What is stormwater? Stormwater is the rainfall or snowmelt that runs off any surface where water can't soak in, like roads, driveways and roofs. To better manage stormwater, we should try to get rain to soak into the ground where it falls. Unmanaged stormwater can cause water pollution, stream bank erosion and flooding.

Soak in the rain at home


Here are some of the ways you can help manage stormwater on your property.

- Improve your grass through soil quality restoration. This
 - method of aerating and introducing compost helps increase the organic matter in the soil. Healthy turf grass in good quality soil absorbs more rain.
- When landscaping, use plants that are native to Iowa and are adapted to our weather conditions. These plants grow deep root systems that help infiltrate precipitation.
- Add a rain garden. Divert water from a downspout into a landscaped depression that captures rain and then allows it to infiltrate into the ground over 12 to 24 hours.
- Add a rain barrel or cistern to store water for later use on lawns, flowers and trees.

BMP Cost Share Program — Did you know?

The City has a Best Management Practices (BMP) program to help add stormwater features to your yard. BMPs such as rain barrels, native landscaping, or soil quality restoration may be eligible for a 50% cost reimbursement. For a rain barrel, the maximum reimbursement is \$75, limit one, but, for other features, the maximum amount is \$1,800.

SNOW ORDINANCE

Know snow — be prepared for winter weather in Ankeny

The City may declare a snow ordinance based on several factors including snow, sleet, freezing rain and blowing snow. When a snow ordinance is declared, the following rules apply:

- No parking is allowed on any public streets, alleys and on-street parking within the city.
- No parking is allowed until the snow ordinance is officially lifted by the City.
- Parking in The District at Prairie
 Trail and Uptown business district is
 prohibited from 2-6 a.m. during a snow
 ordinance.
- Vehicles parked on the street during a snow ordinance may be ticketed \$40 and may be towed.
- When a snow ordinance is declared, the City will announce the start and stop times for parking restrictions via:
 - Text message (text ANKENY to 97063 to opt in for text message alerts)
 - www.AnkenyIowa.gov
 - City of Ankeny Facebook page
 - Local news media

Things to know about Ankeny snow removal operations

When snow accumulation occurs, plow trucks will make multiple passes to fully clear all streets. Plow trucks are also used to apply salt (you may see a plow truck with its wings and plow up).

Snow removal for cul-de-sacs:

- Plow trucks will initially clear a path around the outside of the cul-de-sac. Depending
 on the amount of accumulation, another truck may arrive later to complete snow
 removal in the bulb of the cul-de sac.
- In the event of lighter snowfall, the center of the cul-de-sac may not be cleared.
- When cul-de-sacs are cleared, the snow may be pushed up and over the sidewalk. (If
 this is necessary, the property owner is not expected to clear this piled snow off the
 sidewalk.)
- As Public Works clears all city streets, residential neighborhoods and business districts,
 Parks Maintenance removes snow from public parking lots, sidewalks and trails.


