

While most of us are catching our last few Zs before dragging ourselves out of bed, others have long been awake and busy, many of them making it possible for us to get our days off to a good start. After all, someone has to make the donuts, brew the coffee and deliver those energy drinks to the shelves. Others rise and shine to care for the early morning needs of patients in hospitals, residents of care centers and women in labor. The list of those working while we sleep goes on, and some of them share their experiences as early risers in this month's cover story.

Jeff Way enjoys the early morning hours and is glad to have time to get tasks done before his co-workers start arriving.

Keeping deliveries on track

Travis McCuen of Bondurant gets up at 4 a.m. to be in Ankeny by 5 a.m. for his job as a regional dispatcher for Old Dominion Freight Lines. The company's center in Ankeny services shippers in the central states region and communities throughout central Iowa.

Travis not only has an early-riser schedule but also a less common work schedule overall.

"We work seven-on, seven-off shifts, so I enjoy the time off," he says.

Travis has been in the transportation industry for more than two decades, so he acclimated to this schedule some time ago.

"I am accustomed to early starts by now," he says.

Travis' career in transportation began before he graduated college.

"I worked at Perishable Distributors of Iowa in Ankeny all through college, as they had tuition assistance, and never left."

Perishable Distributors of Iowa in Ankeny is the refrigerated grocery warehouse for HyVee. It is one of two locations in Iowa, with the other dry grocery warehouse located in Chariton in southern Iowa.



Travis McCuen says his family benefits from his working the early shift because he has time in the afternoons and evenings for family activities, including coaching his son's baseball team.

Employees like Travis are working around the clock to keep the local population fed. Perishable Distributors of Iowa stock the HyVee grocery stores' refrigerated sections. It is a nonstop, 24/7 operation with a variety of shifts available. It is a fully owned subsidiary of HyVee Inc., the largest employer in Iowa.

To keep his schedule consistent — and to minimize the effects of early hours and long shifts — Travis tries to stick to a routine, even on his days off.


"I try to stay up until 10 a.m., but, ideally, I

like to fall asleep between 9 a.m. and 9:30 a.m.," he says.

He adds, he didn't need to adjust his schedule much because he was always a morning person. On his days off, he makes a point of staying up a bit later than on workdays and tries to sleep in a bit more the next day.

"I stay up later playing golf in the garage or watching movies on my day off," he says.

He says his early-morning schedule benefits his family.

"I did not have to get my family on board with my schedule as I'm still home by 5:30 p.m. to coach sports and do most of the family stuff," he says.

He has been coaching his son's baseball team for the last two years. For anyone trying to get into a routine or rising early, by choice or necessity, Travis has some simple advice.

"Just train yourself to go to bed early enough," he says.

Quiet time and family time

Heather Leeper, a pediatric medical billing specialist, is up and about early to start work at 5 a.m. But she says it is worth it to have a job she enjoys.

"I have been in the medical field for over 17 years, and I have always wanted to be part of patient care," she says.

Most of Heather's years in the medical field have been in the clinic, then in the billing department for the past three years.

Heather began her career before she even graduated college.

"I started at Mary Greeley Medical Center in Ames while in college," she says. "After college, I started working at Mercy Medical Center in Des Moines. I have been with Mercy for the past 15 years (in different roles)."

Heather's current shift starts early — by her choice.

"My shift starts early because I could pick my hours," she says.

Heather works four 10-hour shifts, so she can have Fridays off. "I like being up when everyone else is sleeping because, when I must go to the office, there is significantly less traffic to deal with, which means I also get to avoid rush hour traffic on the way home," she says.

When Heather works from home, she says it is nice and quiet while her family sleeps.

"I feel like I can focus better and be more productive with my time," she says.

Heather admits she has not always been a morning person but has become one.

"I have two kids, and they got me on the early morning schedule as infants, so it became my new normal," she says.

Heather adds that working while her kids sleep means she can be available when they are awake.

"Since my shift ends at 3 p.m. every day, I get to spend more time with my family after daycare," she says.

On her days off, Heather follows a different schedule.

"I sleep in until it is time to help get my kiddos ready for daycare and

school," she says.

When Heather decided to change her schedule to 5 a.m. to 3 p.m., she had to get her husband on board with the idea.

"This schedule meant that he had to get our two boys up and ready each morning and take them to daycare and school instead of having my help like he was used to having each morning," she says.

The new routine was an adjustment for the whole family.

"It was definitely a transition for all of us, but I think it works well for our family now that we are used to it."

Heather says she is looking forward to the future as their young boys grow.

"It will be nice when our boys start after-school sports or activities because I am off at 3 p.m. and will not have to rush as much before those activities," she says.

Heather's office is located downtown by Principal Park, so she is especially glad she can avoid all the rush hour traffic.

Recently, Heather received a milestone service award for more than 15 years of service at Mercy.

Getting on top of the day

Jeff Way lives in Bondurant and works in human resources for a federal government agency in Des Moines, tending to different security matters.

"I deal with safety issues at different facilities throughout the metro," he says.

The community relies on Jeff to make his rounds before anyone else wakes up to go about their day safely and securely. His shift has always been early when everyone else is still sleeping.

"I have worked over 30 years for the agency, and I have always worked an early shift," he says. "I start early to get a morning report out to leadership so they are aware of incidents and can address those with subordinates to prevent further incidents."

Getting up early in the morning gives Jeff the chance to start his day with a peaceful walk.


"The thing I like best is I start my day by walking around our lake here in Bondurant," he says — "weather permitting."

Jeff has snapped some peaceful photos during the wee hours of the morning on his walks, including of a big blood moon in the night sky and the serene dawn skyline around the lake.

Getting to work early also means some quiet time before the majority of others arrive, which Jeff says gives him time at complete some essential tasks without distractions or interruptions.

Once coworkers begin arriving, Jeff has time to enjoy a morning brew.

"The best part of my early-morning routine is I make coffee and drink a cup with a friend at work," he says.

Jeff does adjust his schedule slightly when he is not working but still does not sleep in as late as most.

"I do not get up quite as early on my days off, but I'm usually up by 7 or earlier," he says.

As the day progresses, Jeff says he takes calls from coworkers, fielding communications, taking reports, and troubleshooting.

"I review emails specifically for information relating to accident reporting that may have occurred overnight," he says. "I then help those managers and employees review what went wrong and formulate actions to reduce the likelihood of a repeat incident. As most of those managers meet with their team early in the day, I get the information to them so they are timely."

His schedule does allow for some flexibility.

"My manager allows me to set my hours within reason," he says. ■



WINTER YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Mark your calendar for January 3 and January 10 for the winter yard waste season. Purchase a \$1.50 yard waste sticker at City Hall to dispose of live trees. Have left over lawn clippings? You can put those on the curb during winter collection also.

PROTECT STORMWATER: PROTECT STREAMS AND LAKES

During periods of snowmelt, deicers that have been applied to impervious surfaces such as driveways, mix with snowmelt and travel to nearby storm drains. Storm drains discharge directly to local streams and lakes. Some deicers can change the salinity of streams and lakes, which impacts aquatic life. What Can You Do? Shoveling and snow-blowing can be your best line of defense. Use deicers, sparingly, keep a safe distance from storm drains, streams, lakes, and wetlands. Use deicers in combination with minimal amounts of sand for better traction. Pre-apply deicer before snow or ice is expected. Know which deicers impact vegetation and concrete.





DRYNESS relief is here

There are five muscles that make up the opening and closing motion of the jaw. The muscles are: masseter, temporalis, medial pterygoid, lateral pterygoid and digastric. The strongest muscle in the body is the masseter muscle due to the weight and force this muscle exerts when being used. Since the masseter muscle has a lot of tension, people who experience grinding or clenching of their teeth often cause stress on this muscle. Around 8-10% of the population



grinds or clenches their teeth with or without knowing. Jaw pain, flat teeth, broken teeth, headaches, and/or earaches are results of grinding and clenching. Causes of grinding are stress, anxiety, sleep apnea and medication changes. There are no cures to stop grinding your teeth, but there are ways to manage the pain and symptoms from grinding. Mouth guards are effective for protecting teeth during the day and night. A boil-n-bite guard, found at a pharmacy, is easy to try at home while sleeping. Consult with your dentist about the possibility of a custom-fit guard if you choose. The night guard does not solve or address the cause of grinding or clenching but helps manage jaw pain and protect teeth from damage. If you experience one or more of these symptoms, discuss with your dentist, and they can help guide you in the right direction to help relieve jaw pain and protect your teeth.


