Library full of learning experiences

Linda Davis of West Des Moines is a fan of the West Des Moines Public Library - and not just for checking out books or movies. She takes advantage of the many adult classes and events offered each month.

In fact, Linda and her son, Tom, often attend classes together. One of her favorite features is the music series. The WDM Public Library brings in musicians from different genres, such Hungrytown, which performs at libraries throughout the U.S. The library has also hosted local musician Bob Pace.

"We always come to listen to the music," Linda says. "No matter what or who is playing, it's always good."

She also regularly participates in adult craft night, where she's learned quilling, which involves twisting and gluing strips of paper together to create a design.

Linda likes how the library is well organized.

"I have little artistic ability. The library is so kind. They have everything meticulously set up. They don't assume you are skilled, and they explain everything," she says. "They are caring, and nobody feels like an outsider. You feel welcome and at home."

Linda and Tom also attend other educational classes. A "cutting the cord" class offered information about television streaming and cable options. She's learned about different cultures and discovered facts about henna tattoos.

"It was interesting. I'd never known about henna. I got a bird tattoo, which stayed on there for almost four weeks," she says.

Linda begin attending classes at the library when she moved to West Des Moines a year ago. She previously lived in the Waterloo/Cedar Falls area. After her husband's death in 2017, she moved to a senior community in West Des Moines so she could be closer to family.

She said she thought attending the classes might be a great way to get out of the house to meet some people. And an added bonus: Most events are free.

"It's like a routine now. We see what is available at the library and plan our month," she says, referring to her son, Tom.

The classes have proven to be a bonding experience, Linda says.

"Family is consistent, and you are in your safe zone. Friends often move or pass away. I'm

getting older, and I think more about the need for family," she reflects.

Linda says she has met new friends at classes, and it's vital for her to experience new things.

"It's great for mental health and to see a different side than just staying at home," she says. "I'm not a lonely person, but I think you have to work at taking advantage of the opportunities you have. You feel so much better about yourself getting out and doing things."

She says West Des Moines has an endless supply of things to do.

"I wish more people knew about these activities. The library is so accommodating."

School of Rock student

Danny Ready spends Monday evenings pursuing his passion by playing his drums or singing along with a dozen other students at the School of Rock in West Des Moines.

People mistakenly think he's been playing most his life. Yet, he's only been taking lessons for a year and a half. The band members he jams with are all newbies as well.

The School of Rock offers a variety of

instrumental, music and voice lessons for all ages from kids through adults. Their performance group is one reason he chose the School of Rock.

"You can't quite get the band experience by just taking lessons," Ready explains.

He wanted to take lessons for several reasons. He always liked music in high school and played trumpet in the jazz band. In high school, he discovered another love by beating the drums on a drum kit for the video game Guitar Hero Rock Band.

"That's the closest to really drumming that I ever played," he laughs.

In college, Ready played along on the drum kit to tracks on his headphones. When he moved to Des Moines, he wanted to do more with his drumming.

"It was fun, but it wasn't really making music when I did it by myself," he says.

That's when he began drum lessons at the School of Rock. Later, his drum instructor left, and he switched to vocal lessons instead. For both ventures, he simply wants to improve.

Ready admits that starting something new as an adult is intimidating.

"It's scary to step in and suck at it for a

while. You have to have these trials and tribulations when starting from zero," he says. "You have no choice but to be bad at it and get better. I have to leave my ego at the door."

Yet, with practice, he improved.

"When learning something new, you learn so much so fast," he says. "You improve right away. You keep chasing that continuous improvement."

Ready says he wants to keep the skill level high. As an adult, his greatest barrier to learning something new is a lack of time.

"When you're young, you have a ton of time and no money," he reflects. "If I get home, and I've had a bad day at work, it's easy to not do anything."

However, by taking music lessons, he says he has learned valuable life lessons.

"I'm choosing it wholeheartedly," he says. "If you start new with a heightened spirit, that helps. I understand it's going to take time. I've gotten more out of it because of my dedication."

Ready says taking lessons has been a great way to spend his free time.

"I've gotten stuck in life. Before I'd be at home and go on Netflix," he recalls. "Now I have something to do, where I can see results. My free time creates a new fun cycle as to how I spend my time on a daily basis."

Ready says it's worth spending time practicing because of the joy he gets from seeing himself improve.

"There's things that you do for fun, then there's things for satisfaction — stuff that you want to work toward. The feeling you get when playing over and over and finally getting it is rewarding," he says. "It helps fill my tank."

WDM Parks & Recreation

When Dianne Moorman and her friend, Janet, were exploring things to do in West Des Moines, they found a few activities at the library and at adult education classes in Des Moines.

Later, her neighbors mentioned they had taken a day trip to Clear Lake and marveled at how much fun it was. The neighbor mentioned they found the trip through parks and recreation programs for the city.

As she looked through the classes, she found a day trip to the Mississippi River. After that, she and Janet signed up to learn archery, disc golf and birding. She says, when she retired, she searched for things to do.

"I wanted to add some fun in to my life," she says.

Moorman had never been on the Mississippi River nor tried archery. She's explored other classes offered by WDM Parks and Rec.

"I had a lot of new experiences," she says.

In addition to the entertainment and learning, she enjoys the social aspect of meeting new people. She says WDM Naturalist and Parks and Rec staff member Jess Lancial is enthusiastic about her job.

"She brings in experts who really know their stuff," says Moorman.

She adds that many classes are low cost and often free. Classes are available for all area residents, not just those in West Des Moines.

She suggests checking out the offerings.

"I'm a lifelong learner," she says. "Some people might not be aware of what's available. I've had a lot of fun so far."



The West Des Moines Community School District is an excellent learning hub for children. It also offers adult learning classes for district residents.

Sue Otte helps to coordinate classes for after school kids and adults.

"The main focus for adults includes parenting classes. The free classes offer topics such as health and wellbeing, academics, general parenting and college planning."

Various educators and community leaders teach the classes, typically held at the Learning Resource Center in West Des Moines or at a local school.

"We've got parenting classes for parents whose kids are starting kindergarten. We also offer college planning for students in ninth grade. It gives an overview for parents on how to apply and prepare for college," she explains.

She says it's a good resource for parents with students in WDM schools.

"We feel it's a good chance for experts to share their knowledge with parents," says Otte. "It's a good resource." ■

936 people served

Dowling provides a 'merrier' Christmas with donations.



and family members were a generous bunch of folks, spending \$57,706 for the 2023 Christmas Basket program. The tradition was started more than 50 years ago by the sisters of St. Joseph Academy. Items purchased were donated and given to those in need in the Des Moines area.

Jeff Ferguson teaches United States government and serves as director of student activities at Dowling. He's been in charge of the Christmas Basket program for 32 years.

He says that 103 families were served from the Des Moines area, including families from Moulton Elementary, Holy Family School and other schools.

The Dowling staff and faculty supplied 441 gifts — one for every child attending Moulton Elementary. They gave away \$6,000 in gift cards for gas and grocery stores. They purchased and donated 200 Blank Park Zoo and 200 Science Center of Iowa tickets.

In addition, they purchased hundreds of gifts. Ferguson noted the most popular toy was Barbie, followed by Legos, earbuds and

tablets, televisions and household items, such as pots and pans.

Families requested clothing — mainly winter coats — and Dowling purchased 90 winter coats of all sizes. A box of food was donated including turkey, ham and vegetables and household toiletry items were also provided.

Ferguson says the Christmas Basket program received assistance from community members and local businesses, including:

- Variety A Children's Charity donated 11 bicycles
- Capital City Produce donated fruits and vegetables
- Cards for a Cause and Outreach made 50 Moulton families a Christmas card
- Dowling Art Club made candles and donated \$300
 - Two Men & A Truck donated 150 boxes
- Kum & Go offered gift cards at a discount

Although there are too many folks to list, Ferguson says he is grateful for all of the people

who helped with the donations, shopping, deliveries, transportation, translation skills and those who served on committees.

"We served those in need all across the Des Moines community, helping them have a merrier Christmas," he says. "All told, 936 people had a merrier Christmas because of our

"I have done this for 32 years, and I am amazed and humbled by the compassion and generosity of our students, parents, faculty, staff and greater Dowling community. I am truly blessed to work with such wonderful people." ■

- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 4 flour tortillas
- 4 large red leaf lettuce
- 2 large tomatoes, cut into 1/4-inch slices
- Spanish rice (optional)
- banana peppers (optional)



Directions

- In large skillet, cook bacon until crispy. Drain on plate lined with paper towels. Set aside.
- In medium bowl, mash avocado, sour cream, lime juice, hot sauce, Worcestershire sauce and salt with fork until combined and smooth.
- Spread thin layer of avocado mixture over tortillas. Layer with lettuce leaves, tomatoes and bacon. Fold sides up and roll.
- Serve with Spanish rice and banana peppers, if desired.





THC content and benefits of hemp

'Martyr!'


There's something special about reading a debut novel. When that author is a beloved poet, however, I get a little worried. Poetry in long form doesn't always translate well, and sometimes substance gets lost in a whirl of words. I shouldn't have worried. Akbar has a true gift in whatever form he chooses to display his craft.

Cyrus is an Iranian immigrant to the U.S. who is struggling with that age-old question, how can I make my life matter? Different voices weave through the narrative, some real, some ghostly, some entirely fictional. Themes of the power of being present, of hope, and, of course, love, surround the disparate chapters and tie

them together. Often very funny and more profound than it should be, especially when Cyrus is talking to Lisa Simpson.

At first disjointed and seemingly unconnected, this is a rich and sad and powerful story that ties so many threads together with a bow of magical realism and vibrant longing. The poetry Akbar is known for bleeds into the pages. The writing is stellar, but there's a story here that transcends itself, coalescing around the near universal feeling of being both stuck and untethered at the same. I haven't been this excited about a new author in a long time.



'Witchcraft: A History in Thirteen Trials'

I was a little surprised when I picked up this book. I expected a scholarly retelling of the famous witch trials in the U.S. and the U.K. from ages long past. I had no idea there were trials in Norway, specifically to accuse and bully indigenous populations. I had some vague notion of witchcraft in historical African countries, but I had no knowledge of the lengths the colonizing British forces would go to control the populace. I should have known better and am so glad I've read this book.

Viewing the history of witchcraft and its political uses through the lens of the legal systems, scholar and expert Marion Gibson tells 13 very different tales of witches all across the globe and what their prosecution, and persecution, says about the times and places they lived. These are engaging, intriguing and often very sad tales that put a misunderstood feature of human history into sharp relief.

The span of time and the implications of "othering" take us right up to modern times and the new ways in which people are ostracized and shunned. This is an important book for scholarship, but equally applicable to our lives now, and the struggles of women and minorities everywhere.


