Do you know how the ADM Scholarship Foundation was started? In the mid-1980s, then High School Principal Stan Norenberg had a vision. He wanted to establish a foundation that would grant a scholarship to every Adel-DeSoto graduating senior going on to post-secondary education. (Minburn came into the school district later.) He shared this dream with a visiting speaker, a WHO radio broadcaster. A week later, Mr. Norenberg received a check for \$150 from the broadcaster with a note saying, "To attain a dream, you need to start somewhere." In 1985, the foundation was established. Today, more than \$889,000 in

MARK O. HEEFNER

Mark O. Heefner, 73, died on Jan. 3, 2024, at home after a long battle with Diffuse Lewy Body Disease. A memorial service will be held on Saturday, Jan. 13, 2024, at 1 p.m. at Panther Creek Church of the Brethren. Mark was born on April 5, 1950, in Cedar Rapids to Richard and Dorothy (Miller) Heefner.

He also spent time with the high school softball program helping with field work or whatever else needed to be done. When the kids were in high school, he also enjoyed the many hours spent helping with the Panther Creek Church youth group.

Mark is survived by his wife, Pat, of Adel; his children, Jeff (Jenny Purvis) Heefner, James (Leosan) Heefner, Jay Heefner and Jamie (Josh) Hachmeister; eight grandchildren, Sean Heefner, Lauren Heefner, Jake and Scarlett Heefner, and Nash, Nyah, Nell and Nori Hachmeister; two brothers, Dan (Jana) Heefner and Sam (Cindy) Heefner; two brothers-in-law, Jim (Donna) Logsdon and Kenny Logsdon; and numerous nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his parents; his sister, Galeda Burkholder; and his father-in-law and mother-in-law, Virgil and Coletta Logsdon; and his beloved little Chihuahua, Sadie.

RFCIPE

QUICK, EASY RECIPES TO ADD TO YOUR DINNER ROTATION

(*Family Features*) Making time for meals together can have a positive impact on the wellbeing of families, including children and adolescents. In fact, regular meals at home can help reduce stress and boost self-esteem, according to research published in "Canadian Family Physician."

Mealtime conversations are also a perfect opportunity to connect with your loved ones. A study published in "New Directions for Child and Adolescent Development" showed these conversations help improve children's vocabularies more than being read aloud to.

Making time for meals together shouldn't require spending all night in the kitchen, however. A simple-to-prepare ingredient like eggs can help you spend less time cooking and more time with family. ■

POBLANO FRITTATA

Servings: 4 (2 wedges per serving)

- 4 large eggs
- 1/4 cup fat-free milk
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro
- 1 teaspoon olive oil
- 2 medium poblano peppers, seeds and ribs discarded, chopped
- · 2 cups frozen whole-kernel corn, thawed
- 2 medium green onions, chopped
- 1/4 cup finely shredded Cotija cheese or crumbled queso fresco
- 1 medium tomato, chopped
- 1/4 cup fat-free sour cream

Directions:

In medium bowl, whisk eggs, milk and cilantro. In medium skillet over medium heat, heat oil, swirling to coat bottom of skillet. Cook poblano peppers 3 minutes, or until browning on edges, stirring frequently.

Stir in corn and green onion. Reduce heat to medium-low and carefully pour in egg mixture. Cook, covered, 10 minutes, or until mixture is just set on edges and still soft in center. Avoid overcooking. Remove from heat.

Sprinkle with cheese. Cut into eight wedges. Place



two wedges on each plate. Top with tomatoes and sour cream.
