

ICE RINK OPEN

The City of Altoona's Ice Rink which was donated by the Iowa Wild, in partnership with Wells Fargo, is now open (pending freezing temperatures). This donation is a continuation of their Community Rinks program.

Altoona's Ice Rink is in Ironwood Park, 2222 3rd Ave. SW. It will remain open as weather permits this winter season.

EMERGENCY ACCESS

Maintain your sidewalks and driveway of snow and ice. If you do require an emergency response, a clear approach to your door is the safest route for the emergency responders and you. Maintain your outdoor lights to illuminate your numerical house numbers. If you call "911" for an emergency response, turn on your lights to make it easier and faster for responders to find your home.

CITY TRAILS IN WINTER

The City of Altoona does clear the snow from the trails during winter. However, we do not treat the trails with salt or sand. The trails are cleared last, following the city facilities' sidewalks and parking lots. Please enjoy the trails but be cautious of the weather conditions.



WINTER TRASH & RECYCLING CART PLACEMENT

Please remember that your garbage and recycling toters must be accessible 18 inches from the curb, even after a snow fall. **Please do NOT place your carts on city streets.** City snowplows cannot clear snow properly when these are placed on streets. This is especially true in cul-de-sacs which are impossible to plow if carts are placed in the road. In times of heavy snow, your driveway approach is likely the best spot to place your carts.

FLOOD INSURANCE

Floods are the most frequent and costliest disaster in the United States, but the number of homeowners opting to have a National Flood Insurance Policy continues to decline. FAITH **By Nathan Anenson**

TEACH me to pray

Do you pray? Does it work? What exactly is prayer? These are not new questions. In fact, 2,000 years ago, some young Jewish men asked their rabbi these same questions. They said, "Lord, teach us to pray" (Luke 11:1). And the greatest rabbi of all time taught them to pray with purpose, power and the right perspective. This rabbi was named Jesus, and he was uniquely qualified to teach because He had heard every prayer since time began.

Jesus taught that prayer is a two-way conversation with God. Its purpose is to develop closeness with the One who created you, loves you, and gives meaning to your life. We talk about how a lack of connection with others has caused a loneliness epidemic. But there is also a divine loneliness that can occur without meaningful connection with God. Prayer is that means by which we find wholeness for our souls.

We also learn from Jesus that God is not mean or stingy when it comes to answering our prayers. God is like the perfect father who longs to bless his kids with the best gifts. However, prayer is not a mechanism to get God to do what WE want, but rather a conversation in which God can guide us to do what HE wants. God is not interested in being a vending machine for our short-sighted wishes, but rather, as a perfect God, He longs to align us with His good and perfect plans. It is within these good plans that God says yes to our prayers.

Finally, as a practitioner of prayer, Jesus taught that big words and many words do not impress God. Jesus said, "And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words" (Matthew 6:7). God does not need convincing. He is not waiting for you to say special words. Just talk to God like you would a good friend or a good parent. Be honest; get it all out. God is not in a hurry to get somewhere else; rather He is on the edge of His seat, waiting to talk with you.

Prayer builds the most important relationship of your life. You can tell God what you are thankful for, what you are sorry for, and what you need. Then listen. What is God saying to you? How is He inviting you to trust Him, to surrender to Him, to be led by Him? Jesus is uniquely qualified to teach you how to pray. Start your journey with this prayer: "Lord, teach me to pray."

- 4 large red leaf lettuce leaves

- In large skillet, cook bacon until crispy. Drain on plate lined with paper towels. Set aside.
- In medium bowl, mash avocado, sour cream, lime juice, hot sauce, Worcestershire sauce and salt with fork until combined and smooth.

ONLINE shopping security tips

With almost all brands selling their products and services online, offering great deals and even free returns, online shopping continues to grow in popularity. However, with increases in online transactions come increases



in online fraud. As you scour the web to find the best deals, keep these six online shopping security tips top of mind.

1. Shop from reputable brands and websites



THC content and benefits of hemp

WINTER skin care tips


