BILLIONS left on the table by short-term tax thinking

According to one analysis, as much as \$650 billion in tax savings are left on the table each year that could be in the hands of U.S. retirees with better retirement income planning — an astonishing amount of



money that could help fund your retirement. So how does this happen?

Regarding taxes, we are taught to look at the year at hand, find the write-offs, pay your fair share, and move on to next year. That's OK during the working years, but, as you get closer to retirement, the key to saving money on taxes is thinking long-term.

We meet with many families and individuals daily who have most of their retirement savings in a 401(k) or similar employer-sponsored account.

Some forward-thinking is involved in making the most of this type of account when you retire. The money in a traditional 401(k) is pre-tax, so when you take distributions, they count as ordinary income. If you have a \$1 million 401(k) and do no long-term tax planning, you could see a \$500,000 tax bill in retirement.

But what if you started thinking about the tax impact of spending that money five or 10 years before retirement? That's when you can start implementing strategies that leave less on the table and put more in your pocket.

One strategy involves converting some or all of that pre-tax money into a Roth account. The year you convert, you pay income tax on the amount rolled over, but you never pay taxes on the money again - not the growth or the qualified distributions. The more time you have before retirement, the more strategic you can be about converting amounts that have less of an impact on your tax situation each year.

If you convert the money, you don't have to worry about the government requiring you to take taxable distributions at age 73. Traditional 401(k)s and IRAs are subject to the required minimum distribution (RMDs) if you don't.

That's just one long-term tax strategy. It's not right for everyone. It would help if you worked with a retirement planner and a trusted CPA to ensure you do it right.

Before implementing this or any strategy, we show the families and individuals we work with the potential tax savings in dollar amounts. That way, they understand precisely how and why they are taking steps that could help them leave less on the table and have more to spend in retirement.






MEET Danielle Craig



WHY use a trust?

Trusts are some of the most talked about and least understood legal documents in existence. The reasons they are so difficult to understand are also the reasons they are so widely employed: They are flexible, private and loosely regulated. The most widely used trust instrument is the simple revocable trust. A revocable trust is a written legal document that names a grantor (the person granting property to the trust), a trustee (the person who will control



the property while it is owned by the trust), and beneficiaries (those who the trust will pay). Revocable trusts are legal fictions and alter egos of the grantors of the trust, using the grantor's social security number instead of a separate tax identification number.

Some primary reasons to use a trust are: 1) to avoid probate administration of your estate (especially if you own real estate in the name of one titleholder only or out of state property); 2) to save on death taxes (either federal estate taxes or Iowa inheritance taxes); and 3) to control your property long after you are dead. I draft simple revocable trusts mostly for the first reason. In Iowa, if you own real estate in only one individual's name, or as tenants in common with

others, rather than joint tenants, a probate administration will be required in order to convey clean title of that land to your heirs or any purchasers after you die. Although the probate process is clean and efficient, it still takes an average of nine to 12 months to complete and will cost your heirs thousands of dollars to complete. If, instead, you execute a revocable trust agreement, with the assistance of an Iowa licensed attorney, and then deed your real estate into the trust name, that document will then mandate what happens to the real estate after you die without necessity for court involvement. The second reason does not apply to the majority of estates right now because federal estate taxes are not charged on estates with a gross value of \$13,610,000, or less, and, in 2024, Iowa's inheritance taxes are exempt for lineal descendants and phasing out over time. The third reason is still valid, but I counsel my clients not to force their cold dead hand over their assets for more than one generation because we really do not know what our children may face after we die.



Pancakes:

- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1 egg, lightly beaten

- 3 tablespoons melted butter
- · 1 teaspoon vanilla



WHAT is spinal stenosis?

Spinal stenosis is a narrowing of the space around the spinal cord in either the lumbar (low back), thoracic (mid back) or cervical (neck) regions that can cause nerve pinching. This narrowing can lead to pain that can develop into chronic neck or back pain if not addressed. Stenosis symptoms could include persistent pain in the buttocks, arms, lack of feeling in the legs or arms, and decreased physical activity or function. Along with spinal stenosis,



people will commonly develop muscles that are tight and muscles that are weak and need strengthening.

There are two different types of spinal stenosis. The most common is acquired spinal stenosis, which is a narrowing of the spinal canal that occurs as we age. Congenital spinal stenosis is less common and is when the spinal canal is narrower from birth.

Spinal stenosis is usually diagnosed by an MRI or other imaging tests. Treatment may include medication for pain and/or inflammation, injections for pain relief, restriction of activity, and physical therapy. Physical therapists can help relieve some of the symptoms caused by spinal stenosis through the use of soft tissue mobilization and exercise. If these conservative treatments do not help relieve symptoms, your doctor may recommend surgery.



GET LOST — in a daydream

"How will you go about finding that thing the nature of which is totally unknown to you?"—Meno.

This may seem like a philosophical question, but it appears just as important for every individual to answer today as when it was first said in ancient Greece. Wishing others to "get lost" could be well intentioned, because getting lost can cause what was unfamiliar to appear. "Lost" comes from the Old Norse "los," and one translation is "falling out of formation." This implies it's an action rather than a state of being.



Good news is you can access the expansive blue from anywhere thanks to the power of your mind. Daydreaming stimulates creative innovation in the brain's right hemisphere but also activates the hippocampus, which suggests this could help improve learning and memory. 

HOW TO endure a hard season

Have you noticed how often people tend to call God "good" when times are good? But when times are hard, well, that's a different story.

Sometimes, we let our circumstances determine our view of



In the Bible, a man named Habakkuk struggled with God. To be more exact, he was angry and confused with the Lord due to his circumstances. But he made this declaration in prayer: "Though the fig tree does not bud and there are no grapes on the vines, though the olive crop fails and the fields produce no food,



though there are no sheep in the pen and no cattle in the stalls, yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will be joyful in God my Savior" (Habakkuk

Why would he say this? He made the surprising decision to rejoice in the Lord even when the hardships were still there. The reason he did this — and so can you — is that he learned something important: God's goodness is not determined by circumstances, and it is possible to experience joy or peace in Him even in the chaos of a life storm. He recommends anyone who plans to open a small business become a member of the chamber.

"Being a chamber member has so much potential. Take advantage and use all the resources available at the chamber to make your business a success," he says.


