Imagine captaining a sailing vessel on Saylorville Lake, reeling in the "big one" at Big Creek State Park, or hiking the trails surrounding the nature center at Jester Park. Golfing, camping, picnicking, paddling, shooting, birding, hiking, horseback riding, hunting, biking... all possible in northwest Polk County. Jester Park, Big Creek State Park, and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Saylorville Lake anchor a premier "Outdoor Family Zone" that brings federal, state, county, local and private partners together to create a magnificent destination for Iowans and beyond. More than 800 campsites are available during the spring, summer and fall recreation season. More than 40 picnic shelters of various sizes can accommodate groups from 20 to 500 people. Numerous boat ramps provide access to 6,000 acres of water on Saylorville Lake and 950 acres at Big Creek State Park for both motorized and non-motorized watercraft. More than 50 miles of paved and natural surface trails accommodate a wide range of use including biking, hiking and equestrian activities. Saylorville Lake is also listed as a global bio-preserve and significant bird area for waterfowl that use the lake during their spring and fall migrations.

ATTENTION: Updated check-in and check-out times, check-in procedures

Starting in 2024, all U.S. Army Corps of Engineers campgrounds within Rock Island District will have a new check-in and checkout time for registered campers. All registered campers may check in no earlier than 2 p.m. on the day of their reservation. All registered campers will need to be checked out of their site no later than 12 p.m. (noon). This affects Acorn Valley, Bob Shelter, Cherry Glen, and Prairie Flower campgrounds at Saylorville Lake. Checking in will also be different this year. If a registered camper has an existing reservation, they may proceed to their registered site after 2 p.m. without checking in with the fee booth. Check ins are no longer required at the fee booths.

Reservations are required for all campsites at Saylorville Lake and can be made in advance or day of at www.recreation.gov or by calling 877-444-6777.



New work on the Neal Smith Trail

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers at Saylorville Lake has recently acquired management of four miles of the Neal Smith Trail south of Sycamore Access towards Des Moines from the Sycamore Access South parking lot down to Saylor Creek. This section was previously managed by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources. However, the Iowa DNR and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers both agreed to end the lease and return management back to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. This section will now be managed by our staff and volunteers.

Work has already started, with vegetation, shrubs and hazard trees trimmed back along all four miles of the trail. A wider swath has also been mowed along the trail shoulder to allow increased visibility and additional space for walkers, bikers and other recreators to navigate around one another more easily.

Completed improvements:

- Repainted parking lots striping
- Forestry mulching completed along edges of parking areas
- Filled large pothole in parking lot
- Trimmed overhanging tree limbs
- Removed hazard trees
- Replaced wildlife management signs



Improvements currently underway/planned:

- Forestry mulching the edges of the trail from Sycamore Access to Saylor Creek, south of I-80
- Resurfacing multiple sections of rough trail

For the safety of our staff and other users, please use caution when you see us out working in these areas. We appreciate your support and patience as we continue to improve this section of the trail.

Campground improvements

We've been busy. Saylorville Lake campgrounds and day use areas provide a variety of outdoor recreational opportunities for visitors throughout the year. Over the past several years, some of the areas have received such heavy use that upgrades and repairs to water and sewer line systems have become a necessity. As a result, during the 2023 recreation season, Prairie Flower and Cherry Glen campgrounds and the Cherry Glen picnic area at Saylorville Lake were closed to allow for some much-needed improvements to take place.

Between Cherry Glen and Prairie Flower campgrounds, more than \$5.5 million dollars in improvements and repairs were made. Replacement of water and sewer lines were primarily needed due to leaking lines, broken hydrants, and inoperable valves. The sewer lines also had tree root invasions, causing lines to be clogged and broken. Below is a full description of the work that took place during the 2023 recreation season.

Cherry Glen upgrades

Cherry Glen received some major upgrades during the 2023 construction period. Nearly 500 feet of broken sewer lines were replaced, along with relining nearly 2,000 feet of sewer lines. The sewer lagoon treatment facility was completely rehabbed, with sludge removed, work to increase storage capacity, and the replacement of the plastic liner. Due to the sewage lagoon construction, the Neal Smith Trail received some damage from equipment. However, 1,600 feet of the trail near the Cherry Glen lagoon will be replaced with concrete. The dump station in Cherry Glen campground was completely renovated with new water and sewer service and expanded to three lanes. The new





lanes also have an improved slope for proper RV waste disposal. Finally, hazard trees and shrubs were removed in the campground to allow for visitor safety and better aesthetics.

Prairie Flower upgrades

Prairie Flower also received some much-needed upgrades during the 2023 construction period. Water and sewer lines were upgraded to allow for better water flow and fewer issues with plumbing. Approximately 800 feet of broken sewer lines were replaced, and 900 feet of new sewer line and a sewer lift station were added for the new Prairie Flower North Dump Station. The new dump station was constructed on the north side of Prairie Flower Campground, which allows for group loop campers to dump on their way out of the campground, rather than having to go to the south side, and allows campers to easily fill up on water before heading to their campsite. The Prairie Flower South dump station was repaved and expanded to three lanes, which allows for more campers to get water and dump waste at one time, preventing traffic backup. Roughly 11,000 feet of new water lines were installed in Prairie Flower South, along with all new water valves, yard hydrants, fire hydrants and six water meters to assist with isolating and detecting leaks in the future.

Beyond water and sewer line repairs, seven of the Prairie Flower group loops were repaved and the Prairie Flower North shelters got new steel roofs and steel-wrapped shelter posts. The damaged Prairie Flower entrance road by the fee booth was repaved with concrete to allow a smooth ride for campers entering, and concrete was placed on six campsites within the Prairie Flower South campground as well. Hazard trees and shrubs were also removed to make the park more aesthetically pleasing and safer for campers. Finally, a new three-phase power service is being added to Prairie Flower North for future 50-amp upgrades to campsites.

The staff at Saylorville Lake is dedicated to ensuring the safety of all recreational users and keeping Saylorville Lake a great place to recreate and relax with family and friends.





America the Beautiful Passes – Military

A free Military Lifetime pass is offered for Gold Star Families with a valid Gold Star Family Voucher or US military veterans with a valid, veteran ID. A Military Annual pass is



also offered if you are active military, which includes dependents. Check online for required documents needed to obtain the pass. These passes cover 1) entrance fees at National Park Service and US Fish and Wildlife sites and 2) standard amenity fees (day-use fees) at Bureau of Land Management, Bureau of Reclamation, US Forest Service, and US Army Corps of Engineers sites.

Bob Shetler to be closed for 2024 recreation season

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Rock Island District, announces the Bob Shetler Campground at Saylorville Lake will be closed throughout the 2024 recreation season to facilitate upgrades and repairs to water and sewer line systems. The fishing areas near the outlet at Bob Shetler will remain available for use during the 2024 closure.

During the closure, significant infrastructure work is scheduled, including installation of 17,000 feet of water lines, boring a new line under the Des Moines River, and new water valves, yard hydrants, fire hydrants, and four water meters that will help to isolate and detect leaks in the future. Additionally, more than 1,000 feet of sewer lines will be replaced, new lift stations to pump waste to the sewer lagoons will be installed and the fish cleaning station septic tanks will be rehabilitated.

All upgrades and repairs are essential to park operations and will serve the public for many years to come.

The Prairie Flower and Cherry Glen campgrounds, along with the Cherry Glen picnic area, are on track to open at the start of the 2024 recreation season. All other recreation areas at Saylorville

Life jacket loaner stations

At Saylorville Lake, we take water safety seriously, and that's why life jacket loaner stations are now available at all U.S. Army Corps of Engineers designated boat ramps and beaches at the lake. Accidents can happen to anyone, at any time, and it is our goal to make water safety simple for those recreating at the lake.

Over the winter, an Eagle Scout offered to build seven new life jacket loaner stations to help improve water safety at Saylorville Lake. The new loaner stations are much nicer than the previous plastic stations. They have wooden frames, large hooks to hold the life jackets, and a large, easy-to-read, bilingual sign explaining how to properly fit a life jacket and the guidelines for using loaner station life jackets.

Life jackets housed on these stations are available on a firstcome, first-served basis, and parents/guardians are responsible for making sure children are in the correct-sized jacket. Remember, it only takes an average of 60 seconds for an adult to drown and 20 seconds for a child. If a life jacket doesn't fit, it can't work properly to save a life. As with all life jackets, loaner or not, it is important to inspect them before each use to be sure they are in proper working condition. Rips or tears can

significantly reduce the effectiveness of the jacket. Borrowed jackets should always be returned to the loaner station when done being used so others can stay safe.

Saylorville Lake's life jacket loaner stations can be found at Lakeview High Water Boat Ramp, Lakeview Main Boat Ramp, Sandpiper Boat Ramp, Oak Grove Beach, Cherry Glen High Water Boat Ramp, and Cherry Glen Main Boat Ramp.

Working with us: a fulfilling experience

Volunteering with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers at Saylorville Lake offers a unique and rewarding opportunity to connect with nature, foster community, and contribute to the stewardship of our outdoor spaces. Saylorville Lake relies on the dedication of volunteers to maintain, enhance, and create memorable experiences for visitors, as well as provide quality outdoor recreation while preserving and protecting our natural resources for the future.

Campgrounds and recreation areas often serve as hubs for building a sense of community among outdoor enthusiasts and volunteers alike. Volunteering provides an opportunity to engage with the public, staff, and other volunteers.

Olofson Shooting Range



The Olofson Shooting Range was completely renovated in 2017 by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources. The range is operated by the Iowa DNR and staffed by range safety officers. It is designed as a public facility that allows an opportunity to shoot all types of firearms. We feature a new registration/classroom building, 33 shooting lanes on a 30/50/100-yard range, shotgun sports including trap and skeet, along with a 3D and static archery range. This satisfies almost any shooting need in a safe, welcoming environment.

Hours and cost: The range is open year round from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on weekends and 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. on weekdays (closed Monday and Tuesday). The basic charge is \$10 per hour for the range usage or \$6 per round of 25 for the shotgun sports. We do not rent firearms or sell ammunition, so you must bring your own, although we do have targets available.

Olofson Shooting Range is closed: Jan. 1 (New Year's Day), Easter Sunday, July 4, Thanksgiving Day, Dec. 24 and Dec. 25.

Location and contact: We are located at 11652 N.W. Nissen Drive, in Polk City, Iowa. This is conveniently located between Saylorville and Big Creek Lake, just four miles north of Polk City. We can be reached at 515-795-4000.

Classes: We offer classes throughout the year, such as beginning shooting, hunter education, concealed carry, and a variety of outdoor skills topics. These classes are listed on the DNR website at https://register-ed.com/programs/iowa and registration is usually required.

Facilities and activities

Big Creek Lake was created as part of the Saylorville project to protect Polk City from floods. A diversion dam, which forms the 866-acre Big Creek Lake, was primarily developed as a flood control project but also offers a wide variety of recreation. Big Creek State Park and the adjoining public hunting areas provide recreation for visitors of all ages and interests. The focal point of the 3,550-acre complex is the lake.

Picnicking/shelters

Shelters and picnic areas, a beach, playground and several boat ramps provide a variety of outdoor recreation opportunities. Open picnic shelters, located in pleasant settings around the lake, can be reserved through the park reservation system. Shelters at the beach are handicap accessible.

Camping

Camping is not permitted at Big Creek State Park. However, there are several large federal and county camping areas about four miles away on Saylorville Lake.

Trails

A 26-mile paved multi-use trail allows bicyclists and pedestrians to travel from the beach south through the Saylorville Lake area all the way to Des Moines. A connection to the High Trestle Trail can be made by traveling east on 142nd Avenue for two miles. Eleven miles of snowmobile trails provide winter recreational opportunities. Big Creek is also popular with cross-country skiers.

Lake activities (swimming, boating, fishing)

Big Creek Lake's clear water provides great family swimming fun. Refreshments are available at the beach during the swimming season. A large wooden play structure is located at the beach. Disc golf and volleyball areas provide additional entertainment.

Big Creek Lake provides excellent fishing year-round. The lake's clear waters are stocked with crappie, bluegill, largemouth bass, walleye, channel catfish and muskie. The lake is popular for a variety of boating activities. Any size motor may be operated at "no wake" (5 mph or less) speeds on the lake. Five modern boat ramps, three on the west side and two on the east, provide excellent access to the lake. A gravel ramp is located on the upper end of the lake. A fishing pier is accessible to the mobility impaired. Big Creek has a concessionaire that offers pontoon boats, kayaks, paddle boards, bicycles and more. Hunting


The state park is a wildlife refuge where hunting is not permitted. However, hunting is allowed on the lake itself and in designated public hunting areas around the lake. Upland areas open for hunting are marked with public hunting signs. Favorite game includes pheasants, rabbit, deer and squirrel. Waterfowl hunting is popular on the lake. 



The permanent Native American Artifact Exhibit located inside the nature center honors the people and wildlife that inhabited this area thousands of years before Polk County Conservation became stewards of the land. Explore fossils, or pottery and tool remnants — all found on park lands.

Educational Ambassadors

Luna, a Great Horned Owl, and Indigo, a Short-eared Owl, reside at Jester Park in a raptor enclosure near the nature center. Both raptors were rescued after injury and can no longer live in the wild. Walk in the Wide-Open


Exploring Jester Park's eight miles of hiking and multi-use trails is an adventure for your senses. Gaze at the native shagbark hickory






