And a select few enjoy time at home working on a list of projects and relaxing with friends and family; that's more my style.

Meanwhile, my wife and kids not only enjoy vacations, they have come to expect them. I am slowly but surely learning to appreciate the time off as well. And, although our ideas of what a dream vacation may be differ, I am happy to be along for the ride.

about it since September."

Their favorite town was Zermatt, a carless village. They had to take a gondola up to the chalet.

"Goat bells would wake you up in the morning," she says. "The people were unbelievably kind. My daughter sobbed when we went back to the train to leave. It can be a challenge to travel with small kids, but I'm so glad we did. It was a wonderful experience for us all."

Around the world

After the stress of the pandemic, Mike Fuller left his job in the health care sector. His wife, Krista, and their girls, Jeanna, Madeline and Abigail, felt the effects as well. One night, while watching "House Hunters International," Krista wondered what it would take for the family to just leave it all behind for a while and travel to places unknown. The result was a fivemonth trip spanning three continents and 20 countries.

"Our oldest, Jeanna, was graduating from high school that year and just the craziness we all felt after COVID, the idea just hit me,"

Krista says. "We told the girls on beggars' night of 2021. The girls all missed a semester of school to do the trip."

They played it all a bit by ear. They didn't start planning destinations until a month before they left. They started by opening Google Flights and picking the cheapest European destination there was for that July ----Amsterdam. Once they had their first spot picked, they started to plan the next destinations a few weeks in advance.

"Mike was the major planner once the trip got going, and I made the arrangements," says Krista. "He used a lot of Tik Tok advice, and we were almost never led astray. Besides our first stay in Amsterdam and our time in India and Egypt, we used Airbnb for all of our accommodations. We even Airbnb'd a sailboat and captain in Greece for four nights as we sailed around the islands - one of my favorites for sure."

They traveled by plane, car, train and bus. They found, while in Europe, plane tickets bought two weeks out were generally the cheapest way to travel. Mike and Madeline ran the family Instagram account, which highlighted some of Mike's crazy endeavors including snake charming in India and SCUBA diving with sharks in Dubai.

Krista says there were many experiences they shared that were amazing. They lived for a month in Barcelona. They saw the Taj Mahal and the Great Sphinx, which is strangely now located near a Pizza Hut and KFC. They rode a mountain coaster in Andorra.

"They let you just drive around Cairo, population 22 million, zero stop signs or traffic signals," says Krista. "We took old, almost broken down four-wheelers to get to the desert, and then we went flying over sand dunes. It was insane and one of our favorite things. As it was getting

dark — and none of the lights worked — and we drove by a dead, decaying camel, I thought, 'This is where I have to call my dad and tell him he was right, and this was a terrible idea and please come get us.' "

Late in their trip, Japan opened up to travelers after COVID. They were able visit there last minute and felt like the only tourists in Japan. It was a top three destination for all five of them.

Some people might have wondered if they were crazy to take the girls out of school, but Krista says most people were supportive, especially Abigail's teachers. (She was in seventh grade at the time.)

"I realized the girls would learn so much traveling. I would definitely say traveling with three teenage daughters isn't for the faint of heart, but I would absolutely do it all over again. It was the trip of a lifetime."

Around Africa

Kelsey Nicol worked for ITA Group in West Des Moines for 15 years, and she would plan corporate incentive trips all over the world for Fortune 500 companies. She was fortunate to visit South Africa three times with clients, and she says she fell in love with it.

"After listening to motivational speaker and author Ben Nemitin at a conference in 2018, who spoke about writing down your bucket list and making it happen, my family created a plan," says Kelsey. "Last August, we went to South Africa (Cape Town and Kruger National Park) and Zambia. South Africa is my favorite place on Earth. Having been there for work many times, I couldn't ever leave Earth without sharing it with my family."

They selected Zambia to see Victoria Falls and have a river safari experience. It was important to Kelsey and her husband, Chris, for their kids, Liam, 12, and Stella, 10, to visit a local school while in Africa to see how other children in different cultures live. Dragonfly, the company they booked the travel with, works with a school in Zambia, so they recommended that the family visit there.

"We had a life-changing experience and were also able to teach at a classroom in Zambia where children walk four miles each way to go to school, motivated by the one meal in a day they will have there."

Now, the Nicols get updates from the school via Facebook and email. They hope to return someday and will continue to donate. The school welcomes any support and has a place for volunteers to stay on the property. They run off 100% donations.

"It was the most emotional, moving experience of the whole trip," says Kelsey. "It was such an experience for our family. I believe in not just speaking about a bucket list but making it happen." ■

The acquisition will ensure the continuation and growth of much needed home and community-based rehabilitation services to Ankeny and surrounding communities, while adding to On With Life's continuum of care.

"We're thrilled about this partnership as there is a critical need for more home and community-based services in our area," said Dr. Jean Shelton, On With Life CEO. "On With Life already provides a range of post-acute services to individuals living with a neurological injury or condition, but the partnership and acquisition of New Horizons will help us deepen our reach and capabilities to serve even more people. New Horizons and On With Life were both founded by individuals with a strong passion to support the rehabilitation needs of the community and both have an unwavering people-first philosophy, making it a great culture fit."

New Horizons opened in 2000 and offers day programming and recreational therapy that includes exercise, arts and crafts, pet and music therapy, interactive and cognitive games, dance and movement and various community outings. Recreation therapy coordinators treat and help maintain the physical, mental and emotional wellbeing of persons served by helping to reduce depression, stress and anxiety; recover or maintain basic motor functioning and reasoning abilities; build confidence; and socialize effectively.

"We know that, through socialization and maintaining a certain level of independence, those we serve can enjoy a higher quality of life, and that's what we're all about," stated Lisa Noble, New Horizons executive director. "On With Life's track record in neuro rehabilitation is nationally recognized, so this partnership will provide an even higher level of services to those who need it."

On With Life plans to utilize and expand the current New Horizons services in Ankeny, and the official partnership and acquisition is scheduled to be finalized by July 1.

SPARKLE RUN continues to honor Moomey

This year's run benefits Above & Beyond Cancer's Young Adult program.

The Sparkle Run returns to honor the memory of Erin Moomey and raise money for programs that benefit people with cancer. A fifthgrader at Crocker Elementary, Erin died of complications from her battle with leukemia in October 2013. Soon after, two of Erin's elementary school teachers who were avid runners contacted the Moomey family and asked if they could put together a 5K walk/run in Erin's memory.

"We love to have this event every year to continue to remember Erin Moomey and the light she brought into the world," says organizer Becky Jordan. "Every single year, our community shows up to support us and remember the amazing girl she was."

Erin loved the color pink and called herself a "sparkle diva," so organizers wanted the run's name to reflect her sunny personality, and thus the Sparkle Run was born. The first run was held in 2014, and this year's 11th annual run will again be held in Ankeny at the DMACC campus on May 5.

Over the past nine years, run organizers have donated \$282,694 to several organizations including Blank Children's Hospital, Kids Living Brave, Make-A-Wish Iowa, Children's Cancer Connection, Pinky Swear, Tori's Angels, the Ronald McDonald House, My Happy Place and MercyOne Children's Hospital. Last year, \$41,000 was raised for Blank Children's Hospital, where Erin received treatment during her illness.

This year, the proceeds are going to Above & Beyond Cancer's Young Adult program.

"Because Erin would have now been 21 years old, we wanted to give the money to an organization we felt she would have been involved in if she was still with us," Jordan says.

Above & Beyond Cancer does amazing work in the Central Iowa cancer community, and organizers are excited to be able to help them grow their Young Adult program. They also hope to help pay for a young adult to join Above & Beyond's Transformational Journey this year, which will consist of hiking and camping the Appalachian trail for six nights this fall.

Packet pick-up and family activities will be held on race day May 5 at 2 p.m., with the 5K

walk/run and one-mile fun run for kids. The cost is \$30 per person for ages 19 and older and \$20 per person for those 18 and younger. Cost includes a T-shirt, which can be picked up the day of the event.

JESUS is alive

Rather than type hundreds of words of my own this month, I invite each of you to read the scripture below and "wonder" - in your own way - about what is happening or what could happen next...

From Luke's Gospel, chapter 24, verses 1-12 (NET)



"1 Now on the first day of the week, at early dawn, the women went to the tomb, taking the aromatic spices they had prepared. 2 They found that the stone had been rolled away from the tomb, 3 but when they went in, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. 4 While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men stood beside them in dazzling attire. 5 The women were terribly frightened and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? 6 He is not here, but has been raised! Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, 7 that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." 8 Then the women remembered his words, 9 and when they returned from the tomb, they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest. 10 Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told these things to the apostles. 11 But these words seemed like pure nonsense to them, and they did not believe them. 12 But Peter got up and ran to the tomb. He bent down and saw only the strips of linen cloth; then he went home, wondering what had happened."

In the Christian church, Easter is a celebration of Jesus rising from the grave - conquering sin and death! The scripture above tells us that, after Jesus' death, women who were close to him came to his tomb to honor him. Upon arrival, they discover Jesus' body is missing. They are reminded that Jesus has risen — just as he said. One of Jesus' disciples, Peter, also arrives and observes the empty tomb. The scripture says he "wonders" what had happened.

As I read and reread this scripture, I started praying for you. I'm praying that you will read the scripture, wonder, and ask God questions like these ... "Are you real? Is this true? What is happening? What does an empty tomb mean for me? Can you show me? How can I get to know you better?" I pray that new knowledge of God's love for you overwhelms you and causes such gratitude within you that you pause to "wonder" every single day about the goodness and love of God!

Jesus is alive. God's love is real. Today is a great day to "wonder" and remember that God loves you!

Easter roast

Yield: 1 roast


- Salt
- pepper
- garlic powder
- 1 roast (3 pounds)
- 1 bag (1 pound) baby carrots
- 1 bag (1 1/2 pounds) trio potatoes or potato of choice
- 3 cups beef broth
- 1 can (10 ounces) cream of mushroom soup
- 1 tablespoon garlic pepper
- 3 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 onion, roughly chopped
- 1 bundle asparagus

Directions

- Preheat oven to 350 F.
- Sprinkle salt, pepper and garlic powder over roast and rub into front, back and sides. Place seasoned roast in middle of large roasting pan.



- Place carrots on one side of roasting pan and potatoes on other side.
- In large bowl, mix beef broth and cream of mushroom soup with garlic pepper. Pour mixture over roast, potatoes and carrots. Sprinkle brown sugar over carrots and add chopped onion. Cover and cook 2 1/2 hours then remove from oven, add asparagus and cook uncovered 30 minutes.
- Serve from pan or place on platter for more formal presentation.



This film is by director Yorgos Lanthimos, who gave us "The Lobster" and "The Killing of a Sacred Deer," two movies I reluctantly suffered through. His new film, "Poor Things," has received the same type of praise as those earlier films, and I will respectfully disagree. The cast includes Willem Dafoe, Mark Ruffalo and a brilliant (and Oscar-winning) Emma Stone in a film that defies description — and that's not a good thing. BEWARE of phone call scams

Have you received a phone call urging you to act immediately because you owe money to the IRS, something is wrong with your bank account or debit/ credit card, or there's a warrant out for your arrest? These are common messages scammers may use to scare you into providing your personal information or sending them money. These attempts have become more sophisticated with messaging and technology that makes their call appear to come from a known phone number.

What are phone call scams?

Most phone call scams involve a fraudster impersonating the IRS or other government organization, a bank, law enforcement, Microsoft or a similar organization. They commonly claim you owe money, your family member is in danger, your credit card has been compromised, there's a problem with your bank account or computer, or there's a warrant out for your arrest.

Once the scammer gets you on the phone, they instill a sense of urgency, requesting you act quickly to either obtain your personal information, receive access to your personal computer, or complete a money transfer. If the fraudster gets ahold of the desired information, they go on to commit identity theft, steal additional funds and more. It's important to note that these attacks are random, and victims are not usually targeted.

How to protect yourself from phone call scams

If you answer a call and notice any of the red flags mentioned above, hang up immediately. Never give out your information to someone you don't know or for a request you didn't expect. Keep in mind, even when a phone number appears to be local and looks like the organization's legitimate number, it could be fake. Scammers have evolved over time and can now even "spoof" phone numbers.

What to do if you're a victim of a phone call scam

If you've received a phone call scam and have already given out your information or made a payment or you believe your identity may be compromised, here are immediate steps to take:

1. Contact the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) to file a complaint online or by calling 877-FTC-HELP (877-382-4357).

2. File an identity theft claim online at identitytheft.gov.

3. Notify the financial institution(s) you work with.

4. Notify the three major credit agencies, Equifax, Experian and TransUnion, to place a freeze on your credit.

5. File a police report with your local police department.

6. Change all your internet banking passwords. ■

TIME for financial spring cleaning?

WHAT IS Social Security Disability?

Social Security Disability is a program managed by the federal government. This program provides income to those who are unable to work due to physical or mental conditions that will last more than a



year or result in the individual's death, and the conditions prevent the individual from performing any type of work activity. The two main programs of Social Security Disability are Social Security Disability Insurance and Supplemental Security Income.

Social Security Disability Insurance, which is also referred to as SSDI, is a program that provides benefits based on the individual's work history and the amount that he or she has paid into Social Security. Applicants under this program must be younger than 65 and have enough "work credits" earned.

Supplemental Security Income, which is also referred to as SSI, is a program intended for those who have not worked long enough to qualify for Social Security Disability Insurance. In addition, an individual who has never worked may be eligible for Supplemental Security Income. Individuals applying for this program must have limited income and resources. These guidelines generally match the eligibility criteria for Medicaid (Title XIX).

The application and appeal processes are similar for the two programs. The first step is the initial application, where the applicant submits an application and all medical evidence to the Social Security Administration. If the initial claim is denied, then the applicant has 60 days to file an appeal, which is referred to as a request for reconsideration.

Next, if the request for reconsideration is denied, then a request for a hearing may be

filed. This hearing will allow the applicant to appear before an administrative law judge. After the hearing, the administrative law judge will issue a decision regarding the individual's disability status. If the administrative law judge issues an unfavorable decision, an appeal to the Appeals Council may be submitted. The final appeal step is to request the Federal District Court to review the decision. An applicant may be represented by an attorney at all levels.

In certain cases, an individual may be eligible for both programs. Applying for disability can be a long and complicated process. An expert attorney is able to analyze an individual's eligibility and assist with the application and appeal processes. ■

NEW treatment for dry eyes

Having dry eyes sounds like such a trivial problem, but those who suffer from it know it can be a serious burden. Approximately 16 million Americans suffer from dry eye disease, and it's a growing problem due to increased screen time. The symptoms include stinging, burning, a gritty sensation, red eyes, fluctuating vision and, in some cases, watery eyes. I still remember going to the eye doctor when I was in college to seek some help for my dry eyes, and



all I got was a sample of some lubricating drops which did little to ease my suffering. Thankfully, dry eye management is now one of the most rapidly growing areas of eye care. There are a variety of new treatment options such as prescription medications, oral supplements, eyelid cleaners, improved artificial tears, and light therapy. Intense pulsed light, also known as IPL, is a machine that delivers controlled pulses of red and infrared light to the face and eyelids. IPL has been used for more than two decades in dermatology, but recently it has become popular in eye care due to the realization that it helps people with dry eyes. Treatment with IPL has been shown to improve oil gland function, decrease ocular inflammation, destroy vessels associated with rosacea, reduce the population of bacteria on the eyelids, and increase tone of eyelid skin, which may improve blinking. All of those benefits can ease the discomfort and pain from dry eyes. Patients have had great success with IPL, and we are committed to helping patients get relief from their dry eye symptoms.

HEALTH **By Elijah Evans EMOTIONAL** granularity

The way we describe our emotions has a strong influence on how much relief we get from talking about them. For instance, simply acknowledging "I was mad" isn't likely to change our feelings much, whereas something more specific has a much higher likelihood of creating insight and consolation, such as: "I felt disrespected because I had previously explained why I didn't want a surprise birthday party, so when my friends threw me one anyway,



it seemed like they were disregarding my wishes, on my birthday of all days. It also made me worried I couldn't trust them to respect my feelings going forward." Lisa Feldman Barrett explains this phenomenon in her book "How Emotions Are Made," and she terms it emotional granularity. She also explains research she has carried out showing that, when people use more specificity (higher emotional granularity), this has the effect of heightening positive emotions and down-regulating the intensity of negative ones. Therefore, a simple (but not always easy) principle for enhancing our emotional wellness is pushing ourselves to be more detailed in how we label and explain our feelings. If this is something you are struggling to do on your own, a licensed mental health professional can help expand your emotional vocabulary and understand the source of troubling feelings.

WHAT IS spinal stenosis?

Canal narrowing causes pain.

Spinal stenosis occurs when the channels through which your spinal cord and nerve roots travel become narrowed, thus squeezing the spinal cord and nerve roots. Spinal stenosis can lead to pain in your lower back, legs, neck, arms or hands, depending on where in your spine your spinal cord and/or nerves are getting squeezed. Spinal stenosis can happen anywhere in your spine, but it's most likely to happen in your low back (lumbar spine) or in your neck (cervical spine).

Symptoms of spinal stenosis

To get the best treatment for your spinal stenosis, it's important to recognize and understand the symptoms. Since spinal stenosis can gradually develop as you age, the symptoms can also gradually develop — and gradually worsen. Also, symptoms can vary a great deal. You may have no symptoms at all, since narrowing of the spinal canal or other channels does not always compress the spinal cord or nerves.

Spinal stenosis in your lumbar spine can cause pain or cramping in your legs when you stand for long periods of time or when you walk. The discomfort usually eases if you bend forward or sit down but comes back when you stand upright. Pain that eases when you bend forward is typical of lumbar spinal stenosis. Other symptoms of lumbar spinal stenosis may include numbness, weakness or tingling in the leg or foot.

Spinal stenosis in your cervical spine can cause pain in the neck and shoulders. It may radiate down your arm or hand. Cervical spinal stenosis can also cause headaches, numbness or muscle weakness. It can also affect the nerves that control your balance, which can lead to clumsiness or a tendency to fall. The pain from cervical spinal stenosis may be occasional or chronic, and it can range from mild to severe.

Treatment for spinal stenosis

From my experience, many cases of spinal stenosis respond more favorably when a multidisciplinary approach is taken. A qualified chiropractor can significantly improve the function of the spinal joints, while, at the same time, a medical doctor can address the biochemical inflammatory components. When chiropractic physicians and medical physicians work together, the patient benefits.
