DON'T TAKE A BATH DURING A THUNERSTORM

With the severe weather lately, I was reminded of my mother's insistence that nobody talk on the telephone during a thunderstorm, as that person could be electrocuted. As kids, we filed this one with the "don't cross your eyes or they will stay that way" threat. But, apparently, Mom was right on the telephone rule, at least with corded, landline phones, as lightning really can travel through the phone lines.

About 300 people in the United State are struck by lightning every year, according to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. Yes, the vast majority survive, but one in 10 don't. To avoid being one of the 30 who perish, you might want to heed my mother's thunderstorm warning, as well as others I found from America's most trusted source, Bob Vila.

Do not take a bath or a shower during a thunderstorm. "If lightning strikes near you, electrical currents could travel through the pipes in your home, putting you at risk of electrocution." Yikes. I guess I will need to find somewhere other than the shower to sing during a thunderstorm.

Don't wash the dishes. "You

shouldn't wash dishes during a thunderstorm for the same reason you shouldn't bathe during a thunderstorm: Lightning can travel through pipes, electrify your faucet, and cause injury. The dishes can wait." You don't have to tell me twice on this one, Bob.

Don't leave your tech devices plugged into outlets. "If an electrical storm has been forecast, unplug your computer, laptop, and other devices, and consider unplugging appliances. At the very least, plug appliances into a surge protector if they aren't already, but understand the surge protector probably can't stand up to a lightning strike nearby." I used to unplug my stereo each time we had a storm, but I have not done that in years. If I lose my current stereo now, it isn't that big of a deal. But, at age

15, I had my life savings invested in my Pioneer receiver, dual cassette deck and equalizer. The greater loss today would be my computer, and Bob's advice has me thinking I need to unplug that more often.

Don't do laundry. "Your washer and dryer are plugged into the wall, which is the first strike against them. The second strike is that they are metal, so lightning can run through them the same way it can your toaster or blow dryer." This is just one more reason to never trust the washing machine.

HISTORY

ADEL'S EARLY 1900S RESTAURANTS

"Oysters, Oysters, Oysters" was the headline. Ringer and Dinnell, proprietors of the new Columbian Restaurant, announced they "will serve you oysters any style from this date (Oct. 23, 1901). Bulk oysters of the finest variety will be kept in stock and will be sold at the lowest living price. We propose to handle the oyster trade." Ringer and Dinnell only handled the oyster trade until February 1902 when Rentie Morse announced that he had purchased the stock of Ringer and Dinnell and would conduct a restaurant at the old stand. He didn't conduct it long either, selling to Ward Ruth on May 14, 1902.

The Dallas County News announced on March 9, 1900, that "The Right Place Restaurant, in the building formerly occupied by the Dallas County Savings Bank, is the place to get meals or lunch. It is the only restaurant in town that has a fireproof safe."

While The West End Restaurant on West Main Street was being operated by Ed Wright, the City Restaurant was still going strong after it was purchased by N.B. Haskins in 1903. He promised to



continue the 15-cent as well as the 25-cent meal trade. However, by 1905, Mr. Haskins announced: "For sale, my restaurant stock and fixtures. Will invoice about \$800. I want to concentrate on my patent refrigerator. Good trade, best location in town."

The Star Restaurant appears in 1903 with a new name and new management. Located two doors north of the post office, it offered confectionery, bread and pastry, canned goods, oysters (of course), cigars, tobacco and soft drinks. Johnson and Curtis were the owners.

On Jan. 7, 1904, Jessie Tice and wife moved into their new restaurant, and, on July 6, 1905, they let the world know they had a new steam peanut roaster.

Kirtly's Restaurant, located north of the former Adel Bank building,

suffered a fire on Aug. 8, 1906. The loss was estimated at \$500, but the insurance company quickly settled the claim for the sum of \$80. On Aug. 22, 1906, Mr. Kirtly moved his restaurant stock into the room formerly occupied by Mr. Kelso south of the recorder's office. That didn't last long. On Oct. 24, 1906. George Spillers announced that he had bought the Kirtly Restaurant stock and would start a restaurant named The Iowa in the room next door south of the post office. The Iowa would have a full line of tobacco, cigars and everything you would find in an up-to-date restaurant.

Also in 1906, a Mr. Bonnewell moved his restaurant into the blue building on Main Street west of L.B. Smith's door.

After that, not much changed in Adel's restaurant business until January 1909 when Mr. Bonnewell sold his restaurant to John Ball of Waukee. Bonnewell then operated only his butcher business until December of that year when he announced he had moved out all his butcher equipment and expected to fit the room up for another first-class up-to-date restaurant.
