

## A beautiful setting for life — and a wedding

As Susie Kamm and her husband, Steve, stared at what was then an empty field in Bondurant in 1995, imagining what their future place of residence would look like, little did they know that, nearly 30 years later, this would be the spot they would still call home.

This place, where thousands of memories have been made across the years, is something special to them. And it's been treated thusly, right down to field stones and boulders that dot the 1-acre plot of land, the decades-old lilacs given to Susie by her grandmother, and the numerous varieties or flora that give the spot such colorful life.

Naturally, over the years, the landscape around the property has changed and evolved, leading to what it is now — a beautiful, wellkept piece of land. Its beginnings were humble, Susie Kamm says.

"There initially wasn't a driveway or anything like that, so we started with steppingstones, because we thought that would be cheaper than concrete," she says.

The couple put mulch in front of the house,

but, by the third year, it was gone. Rain and the natural elements had seen to that. Rock, they decided, would be much better. So, rock it was, along with some strategically placed bushes.

The Kamms' landscaping work continued over the years. A small change here, a different color there. Nothing huge. Things were added or removed as needed, sometimes by mother nature via a derecho, other times by their own hands.

Until this year.

Those bushes planted years ago were now

too big and were removed. The mulch that went missing all those years ago? That came back, too. It needed to look especially good now. Their daughter, Amanda, was getting married and had chosen the Kamm home as the place it would happen.

Wedding or no wedding, though, the Kamms had been itching for an upgrade on the exterior look.

"The front of the house, with all the rock, was starting to look yucky with all the weeds and whatnot coming up through them," Kamm

says. "So, when we decided that the wedding would be here, we said, 'Yep, we've got to get this redone.' "

The couple didn't feel the need to hire a professional landscaper to map out a grand design. They would simply do as they've always done — trust their instincts.

A few mini evergreens were planted, and some beautiful clematis now grow up a wooden arbor out back. Up front are the "John Deere" plants. Susie has what she calls a "test garden" behind the house. There, she'll plant certain varieties to see if she likes the way they look when they mature. If so, they'll stay and likely will appear in other spots on the property.

Most of the plants have come from Susie's mother or grandmother, two influential people in her life.

"I spent a lot of time with my grandmother as a kid," she says. "She lived in Des Moines. Her grandfather used to have a peony farm by ML King and up the hill from Methodist Hospital back in the day. Between whatever he gave her and put in her yard, and what my mom had at our place when I was a kid, it's what we brought here to our place and used."

While the wedding is done and over, the landscaping projects are not. They never seem to be. It's a part of homeownership.

Kamm says she wants to clean up the garden in the back, add more variety to it, and eventually install a gazebo for more shade. Although the couple didn't plant a vegetable garden this year, they had in previous years, and that's something Kamm wants to get back to next season.

There's something about being outdoors and in nature — especially in a landscape just their own — that is particularly attractive.

"Steve does most of the mowing and trimming, stuff like that," Kamm says. "But the flowers are my thing. It's my outlet."

#### From famine to feast

When Dusty and Brittany Gilson first rolled up to their now-residence at 414 Fourth St. S.E. in Bondurant five years ago, the landscape resembled the moon.

Nothing. Barren. A house on some grass.

"There wasn't a plant on that entire property," Dusty Gilson says. There was zero curb appeal when they first viewed the home, Gilson admits, but what it lacked visually, the location more than made up for.

They loved it, the school system and the neighborhood. Sold.

The previous owners left them with a job. Half of the backyard was torn out in order to plant rose bushes. The dirt from the excavation was left in an unsightly pile at the end of the lot — sod, weeds and all.

Gilson went in with a tiller, leveled it out, sodded the ground once again, and then began laying things out the way he wanted them. There was no grand plan to what was going to happen landscape-wise; it was just going to happen, one way or another. The house deserved it.

"I just kind of shot off the hip," Gilson says.

Having worked for Perficut, a landscaping company in Des Moines for nine years, as well as managing a cemetery, Gilson had some working knowledge of how to design and grow things. But it was during his stint working at Iowa Farm Bureau in Wes Des Moines that Gilson learned what he really wanted.

"I got most of my ideas from there," he says. "And working for Perficut, I fertilized yards, so I got to see a lot of landscaping jobs, and I just took some of those and added my twist to it."

The next step was to add some trees to the yard. A single, lonely tree greeted them on their first day of residency. That changed quickly.

"I added three river birches, one Cleveland pear, one skyline honey locust, a cherry tree, two apple trees, two hydrangea trees, a lilac tree, an eastern red bud and a red sun maple," he says.

The fruit trees are paying dividends already, specifically the apple trees, which have been producing fruit, much to the family's delight.

Gilson is a fan of mulch in his landscaping.

"It just freshens things up every year," he says.

So expansive were the Gilsons' early landscaping efforts, that now, five years later, they're out of space.

"I'm tapped out," he jokes. "I have nothing I can do, except, like I tell my wife, tear it all out and start over again. She's like, 'No!' "

Given the opportunity to do it all over, Gilson says he'd go with less catmint. Two



plants, as he's found, was one too many.

"It grows like no other and takes over everything," he says. "It's kind of taken over the beds they're in. That, and I'd stay away from rose bushes. They're pretty, but they're maintenance."

The couple contemplated beginning a garden, but have yet to do so. Their children keep them busy enough as it is.

After a short period of having a swing set in the backyard, Gilson says they decided to take it out this spring. A replacement isn't in the works either, since a brand-new park is being built within walking distance.

"We're literally two blocks away, so we'll probably just walk there and use that," Gilson says.

## Master Gardeners share expertise

Polk County Master Gardeners, a program of Iowa State University Extension and Outreach, share their expertise through a variety of programs and three educational gardens in Polk County: the Demonstration Garden, 92nd Street and Dewey Gibbs Road, Urbandale; the Discovery Garden, 1207 E. Iowa St., Des Moines; and the Enabling Garden, 1050 First Ave. S., Altoona. The public can attend programs at the gardens and visit them to learn about the plants in them or simply enjoy a stroll in the peaceful settings.

The Demonstration Garden is the product of a cooperative arrangement between Polk County Extension, Urbandale Community School District and the City of Urbandale. The mature fruit trees and the many deciduous bushes and shrubs double as a learning lab where Master Gardener trainees receive handson experience in proper pruning techniques. Hardscaped paths allow people with disabilities and parents of small children in strollers easier access to displays.

The Discovery Garden at the Iowa State Fairgrounds is a cooperative effort between the Polk County Master Gardeners and the Iowa State Fair. It has grown into a beautiful spot maintained by volunteers and visited by thousands each year. About 5,000 square feet is replanted each year, and more than 80 Polk County Master Gardeners maintain the beds from early April through the first snow. All plants and beds are marked for the fairgoer's ease of information. The garden contains annuals, perennials, tropical plants, natives, ornamental grasses, hardy roses, dwarf conifers and bushes. Plants and beds are labeled during the Iowa State Fair.

The garden also features the children's tunnel made of gourds and other climbing vegetables and flowers for children of all ages to explore, a landscaped pond with a bog and rapids, composting areas, a rainwater harvesting system, and a variety of garden design techniques.

While the intent of the garden is to peak at the Iowa State Fair, it provides interest, color and a place to relax throughout the season. There is rarely a time when the garden isn't in use, whether by wandering gardeners, families with children interested in crawling through the tunnel, wedding parties, or someone just looking for a place to eat lunch or read a book. It is also a favorite place for photographers who value the variety of colorful borders which make up the garden.

The Enabling Garden is "where disabilities become abilities." It started in 2002 as a collaborative effort between Polk County Master Gardeners and the City of Altoona. The primary goal is to welcome people of all abilities to experience the garden. Through the use of design concepts such as raised beds and vertical wall gardens, visitors learn how gardens can be adapted to accommodate any gardener regardless of age or ability. Signs throughout the garden explain the design and construction methods used in making a safe and comfortable environment for leisure activities, as well as horticulture therapy. The garden also includes a meditative water feature, a rain garden and many seasonal annuals and perennials blooming throughout the summer.

The George Washington Carver Learning Center at the garden is the site of classes held during summer months, starting with an Arbor Day Celebration in April. Also featured are an interactive children's garden where they can play and experience all five senses, a miniature garden, a bottle tree and several unique sculptures by artist John Brommel including a 12-foot praying mantis.



#### 'The Daughters' War'

To be perfectly clear before we start, this is a book about grief. It is a story of loss and war and lives cut short in the pursuit of survival. Sure, this is a military fantasy at its most basic level, but, in truth, it is an ode to the beauty of grief, growing up and becoming something extraordinary.

Galva is the youngest daughter of prominent family, and instead of staying cloistered safety, she chooses to train with an experimental army unit that will likely mean her death. Humans are edging toward extinction, and the goblins just keep coming. Brutal, cunning and overwhelming, these goblins want one thing only: to tear down humanity and make them into livestock. Paired with a diverse and fascinating array of comrades, Galva will fight for her people's right to live and lose almost everything along the way.

This is not an easy book to read, but the starkness and gritty horror make the moments of humor and hope that much more powerful. The prose is hypnotic and stunning, like an epic poem, and will linger long after the cover is closed. It is absolutely worth the tears.

#### 'Masquerade'

There have been a handful of times in my life when I felt so wildly out of place that I couldn't tell up from down. That kind of upheaval is a powerful motivator for digging deep and finding out what you're made of. Transformation, power and selfdiscovery weave through this gripping, gorgeous story I fell in love with from the first page.

Òdòdó is a blacksmith in Timbuktu, a city being ground down under the heel of warrior king. Òdòdó's struggle suddenly changes, however, when she's kidnapped to be the bride of a warrior king who refuses to take no for an answer. Left with little recourse, the story follows Òdòdó as she learns to reclaim her power, navigate the politics of her new city, and embrace the power she finds unexpectedly at her fingertips.

This is a deep, tense and deeply satisfying story that weaves together West African myth with the classic story of Hades and Persephone in a unique and utterly enthralling tale. I love the blending of the familiar and the new. This feels like a classic in the making.  $\blacksquare$  — *Review by Julie Goodrich*

## **TAKE** precautions in summer heat

It has been scorching hot. I enjoy the heat, not the humidity, so dry summer heat is something I look forward to experiencing every year. Unfortunately, heat can be dangerous for people of all ages. Heatstroke occurs due to your body struggling to regulate its core temperature.



Heatstroke or heat exhaustion can cause severe dehydration and damage your heart, muscles and brain. It can even lead to death. Possible symptoms

are dizziness, weakness, nausea, muscle cramps and headaches. If you start experiencing these symptoms, stop what you are doing and rest, sit inside in the air conditioning, and drink a nice glass of water. If your symptoms persist for more than an hour, seek medical attention.

While it is important to enjoy the blissfulness of summer, it is vital to operate with caution and plan ahead to prevent any adverse events. It should be a high priority to stay active, but we also must have a plan for keeping cool. If you go on a walk, wear light-colored clothing and bring a bottle of water. If you are away from home, there are cooling centers all over the metro and surrounding areas. A cooling center is a place where the public can sit indoors in the air conditioning to cool down. Libraries

and community and senior centers are often cooling centers.

Avoid working or exercising outside between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. This is when the sun is the most intense. You should also stay hydrated. Have I mentioned drinking water? Staying hydrated is important for everyone all the time, but it is imperative to stay hydrated in the hot summer months as we age. As we get older, our body loses fluids more quickly, causing us to dehydrate. Our aging bodies do not communicate with us like they used to. Our body's messages telling us that we are thirsty and to drink can decrease over time. Your body could need water, and you may not feel like it due to your body not signaling thirst like it once did. Remind yourself to drink water by marking the bottle with a permanent marker with time goals on the water bottle itself.

Always be aware of those who may struggle to stay hydrated and cool. This could be a parent, neighbor, beloved pet or even a stranger in a parking lot.

## **BOYS** volleyball teams compete at nationals

Simonson, 18U team finish fifth in the nation.

Two local boys volleyball teams returned from a national tournament in Dallas, Texas, after having gone toe to toe with some of the best squads from across the nation for four days.

The 18U and 16U teams, based at the Ohana Volleyball Club in Grimes, performed well, with the 18U team having an exceptionally strong showing, placing fifth in the nation in Tier 2 of the three-tier competition. Jerze Simonson, Bondurant-Farrar High School, is a member of the team.

"It was great, and what's even more awesome about that is we will lose only two seniors from this team, so I basically have all my guys coming back next year," Anderson says.

The 16U team finished 16th out of 32 teams, having to overcome a rough first day, according to Anderson, to finish strong.

The Ohana club teams have made big strides in a short period of time. When first formed, the group consisted of athletes from Johnston and Des Moines Public Schools, Anderson says. Now, the club has grown to the point where athletes are traveling from as far as Bettendorf to be a part of the team.

The state of Iowa does not have a sanctioned boys volleyball season, but Anderson says the boys have been quick learners.

"They are coming in not knowing what to play or what to do, but when you relate it to other sports, they just pick it up so fast," he says.

Although not true across the board, it seems as though basketball players have the easiest time transitioning to volleyball, he says.

"We love basketball players," Anderson jokes. "They're usually tall, quick on their feet, and a lot of the quick movements that are good for basketball are good for volleyball as well."

The program's growth has basically been due to word of mouth at this juncture, Anderson says. Anderson holds some free camps and clinics during the summer as well to give kids who might not be familiar with the game an opportunity to see what the sport is about.

"Once the boys get past that initial stigma that it's only a girls' sport, they end up liking the sport," Anderson says.

Anyone is welcome to try out and participate in the clinics.

This year, the club will be expanding to two 18U teams, a 16U team and a 14U team.

Anderson says the season begins in October and runs through June. Practices are held at the Ohana Sports Complex at 1400 S.E. Gateway Drive in Grimes twice a week for two hours each. ■

## **COMBATTING** cold sores

## LASER hair removal 101

Laser hair removal is one of the most popular aesthetic treatments. Benefits include drastically reduced hair growth, resulting in smoother skin, freedom from ingrown hairs and folliculitis, money and time saved, and boosted confidence. This procedure uses highly concentrated light energy to target pigment within the hair follicle, producing heat and destroying the follicle. Depending on the type of laser used, such as an 810 Diode laser, LHR



is suitable for all skin types, from fair to dark skin. LHR works best on pigmented hair, such as brown or black hair. Lighter hair colors, such as red, white or gray, do not respond well to LHR. LHR is most effective when hair is actively growing, as that is when the hair is thickest in the follicle with more target pigment present. Since only a percentage of hair is in a growth phase at any given time, multiple sessions are recommended at varying intervals, depending on which area of the body is being treated. Facial hair can be treated more often, while legs require less frequent treatments. LHR sessions are quick (just seconds for an upper lip to several minutes for a larger area), and surprisingly comfortable when using an 810 Diode laser. As school approaches in August, many children will return to carrying backpacks to and from school. Here are a few tips to help our students fit and carry their backpacks:

• Make sure the backpack is positioned over the mid-back muscles.

• Do not carry more than 10-15% of your body weight in the backpack. For a child who weighs 50 pounds, he/she should carry no more than 7.5

pounds. A child who weighs 80 pounds should carry no more than 12 pounds. A child who weighs 100 pounds should carry no more than 15 pounds.

• Make sure to wear both shoulder straps, and wide shoulder straps are preferred to distribute the weight evenly.


• Backpacks with multiple compartments are preferred for small items, allowing larger and heavier items to be placed in the center of the bag and positioned closest to the wearer.

• Take off the backpack while standing.

## **BUILDING** sites certified

Two more sites in Bondurant have been designated ready for industrial development through the Iowa Economic Development Authority's (IEDA) Certified Sites program. The sites have a combined total of nearly 270 acres that have met or exceeded specific criteria, including transportation and utility infrastructure. Both offer quick and easy access to Interstate 80 and the four-lane U.S. Highway 65.

"Having the availability of certified development sites gives Iowa a tremendous advantage in attracting new companies and quality jobs to our state," said Debi Durham, director of IEDA and Iowa Finance Authority. "Certifying any site is an extremely rigorous process, and Bondurant having multiple sites with this status is a major accomplishment. It demonstrates dedication to economic growth and prosperity for the community and the state."

Durham recently joined local officials to recognize the city for "becoming a welcoming place for business and people." Bondurant is Iowa's first community to certify four sites since 2012, when IEDA launched the program to address a lack of project-ready industrial sites in the state.

The 188-acre Timmins Industrial Park features three sub-dividable parcels within city limits, and Interstate 80 runs along its southern boundary. Zoned light industrial, the site has ample space to accommodate a variety of operations, and its flat topography allows for flexible and cost-effective development options.

Bondurant Industrial Park Plat 2 — a greenfield site that's also in city limits and adjacent to the existing Bondurant Industrial Park - has nearly 80 developable acres that offer high visibility along U.S. Highway 65. Positioned just north of Interstate 80, the site is zoned medium industrial, which would suit industries like manufacturing and assembly.

Bondurant's first certified site, announced in 2019, was quickly secured by Amazon for its central Iowa fulfillment center. Myers Industrial Site, the second site certified in September 2022, is located east of Hubbell Avenue/U.S. Highway 65 and south of N.E. 78th Avenue with easy access to Interstate 35, The site is zoned as medium industrial, which makes it suitable for a wide variety of industries.

Bondurant Mayor Doug Elrod commended the city's effective collaboration with property owners and thanked economic development partners who were instrumental in the certification process.

"We have seen the enormous value in achieving certification through the IEDA program," he said. "Since the launch of our site certification efforts, the city has experienced significant job and valuation growth, with more than 4,400 jobs being added and our commercial and industrial valuation increasing by more than 800%. Through these efforts, we have been able to provide enhanced service and amenity levels for our community."
