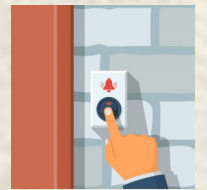


## From the Village Office

Village taxes for the 2026-2027 fiscal year will be collected at the Village Office June 1, 2026 to July 1, 2026. Monday 8:00 am - 4:00 pm, 6:00 pm - 8:00 pm, Tuesday - Thursday 8:00 am - 4:00 pm, and Friday 8:00 am - 1:00 pm. After July 1, 2026, a five percent (5%) penalty will be charged through and including July 31, 2026. Taxes received after July 31, 2026 will have penalty computed pursuant to Section 924-A and Section 1456 of the Real Property Tax Law.

### Vendors and Door to Door Sales

The Village of Scottsville requires a permit to allow door to door sales. If a solicitor comes to your door, please ask to see the permit issued from the Village. The permit will be on Village letterhead.



If the solicitor cannot provide a permit, please as always, report any suspicious behavior to 911 or the Village Office .

### DPW Brush Pick-up

Brush pick up happens April 1 - October 1. Please keep in mind that brush left at the curb for the DPW to pick up should be no larger than 4 foot lengths and bundled with twine. Small twigs should be bagged in paper landscaping bags.

### Catch Basins and Drainage Ditches

Please help keep our community drainage systems working properly. If you have a catch basin in your yard, near the road in front of your home, or a drainage ditch on your property, be sure to keep it clear of leaves and debris. When these become clogged, they can no longer function as intended and may contribute to localized flooding.

Much like maintaining access to fire hydrants, keeping these areas clear is a shared responsibility of all residents. Thank you for doing your part!

### Summer Roadwork

Phase Three of a multi-year project will continue this summer. Phases One and Two replaced gutters and installed sidewalks along Diana Drive from Chili Ave to Heather Lane, down Heather Lane and a portion of Briarwood Lane. Phase Three will continue on Briarwood Lane picking up where they left off.



This work is made possible in part by a Monroe County Community Development Block Grant and local funds.

To continue this project, the grant for Phase Four has been submitted to the County. Hopefully we will be awarded this money again and next summer will tackle the other side of Briarwood Lane.

The Community Development Block Grant has been very good to the Village of Scottsville. The past several years funding has been provided for various sidewalk projects throughout the Village.

### Garbage & Recycling Pick Up

Please be mindful of the time when putting garbage and recycling out by the curb. Your garbage totes should be out by 6:30 am on your garbage day so the DPW can pick it up promptly. We even suggest you put it out the night before.

It is also very important to keep the lid closed on your tote. We pay by the ton for garbage and recycling and those costs have gone up astronomically. If rain and snow is getting in the cost increases needlessly.

## Lawn Maintenance

Keep Your Lawn in Check: Village Mowing Regulations- As we head into the growing season, the Building and Code Department would like to remind residents about lawn maintenance requirements within the Village. Per Village code, grass and weeds must be maintained at a height of 10 inches or less. If a property is found to be in violation, the Village will send a notice informing the property owner of the issue. From the date of the notice, the owner has 10 days to address the overgrowth. If the lawn is not brought into compliance within that timeframe, the Village will hire an outside contractor to proceed with mowing and string trimming the property. The cost of the service will be billed directly to the property owner.

Don't Toss Grass in the Street! This is a big one – it's against the law to blow or dump your grass clippings into the street. Not only can these clippings clog up our storm drains and harm the environment, but they are also dangerous for motorcyclists and bicyclists. Please bag your clippings, use a mulching mower or compost them instead. Maintaining your lawn not only helps keep our neighborhoods attractive, but it also supports public safety and prevents pest issues. Thank you for doing your part!

Volunteers are able to register for our event in early April. We are planning to register a "joint" event on behalf of the Village, Town, GVGSP, OCWC and FoGVG. FoGVG will additionally promote to our membership lists and will also supply a portable toilet for the day. We would encourage active participation from the Village and Town residents, Town Recreation, and other community/school groups - so once the sign-up link goes live, please share out to your networks as well.

Two other nearby "ILMPD" events hosted by GVGSP are also in the works - Little Black Creek Park in Chili (between 84 Lumber and Byrne Dairy on Scottsville Road) and the Lehigh Valley Trailhead between River Road and the river in Caledonia (near CP Ward). FoGVG will supply portable toilets for these locations as well. Volunteers are welcome to sign-up for any location. CooperVision, Mendon Foundation and Avon Rotary have already expressed interest in signing up to support, so we believe we're off to a good start!

## Forestry Board News

**Grant Application** In conjunction with the Village of Scottsville, the Forestry Board has applied for a Genesee Valley Trails Town grant administered by Parks and Trails New York. Grant awards will be announced in late April. If we receive the grant, a new pollinator garden and native hardwood trees will be planted in Canawaugus Park in the fall. The Village Forestry Board goal is to advance the public park landscape, enhance the natural environment, bolster native habitat, and improve the visual aesthetic. This project will expand the local community's and the recreational visitor's experience at the intersection of the Genesee Valley Greenway State Park, the Village of Scottsville Canawaugus Park, the Town of Wheatland Indian Allan Park and the Oatka Creek. The Forestry Board proposal adds to the park area improvements made to date (kiosk, bike repair station, picnic tables, signs) and creates a welcoming gateway destination for Trail Towns with a focus on the local and native landscapes.

**Scottsville, NY – Tree City, USA 2026** Scottsville is designated as a Tree City, USA of the National Arbor Day Foundation as of 2015 and together, we work as a community for the common goal of a vibrant, healthy canopy along our streets and in our parks. The Village of Scottsville is committed to a livable and welcoming community that supports a healthy environment for its residents. This effort includes improving and maintaining the Village tree streetscape in partnership with residents.

**Forestry Board** The advisory board is comprised of Scottsville resident volunteers. The board plans and implements the annual Arbor Day tree plantings, seeks grants to purchase trees, and invites all village stakeholders to join in this effort. Meetings are held the second Tuesday of each month at 6:30 p.m. in the Scottsville Village Office. All are welcome.

## Open Burning in New York State

*Annual burn ban in effect from March 16 - May 15*

Open burning of household trash releases dangerous compounds including arsenic, carbon monoxide, benzene, styrene, formaldehyde, lead, hydrogen cyanide and dioxin, among others. Never is it allowed to burn trash, plastic, tires and leaves. Please limit fires to the list below. Open burning is also the greatest cause of wildfires in New York. *Please be considerate of your neighbors. Neighbors like to enjoy the fresh air with windows open.*

Open burning is prohibited in New York, with several exceptions.

- Campfires less than 3 feet in height and 4 feet in length, width or diameter are allowed.
- Small cooking fires are allowed.
- Fires cannot be left unattended and must be fully extinguished.
- *Only charcoal or clean, untreated or unpainted wood can be burned.*
- Ceremonial or celebratory bonfires are allowed.
