Speaking how fast things move, I wanted to take this opportunity to ask everyone to PLEASE SLOW DOWN on our streets, STOP at our stop signs and STOP for our school busses. I've been in regular contact with the Sheriff's department, and they have given the Deputies on duty a heads up to patrol for speed. The MCSO is having the same manpower issues as most everyone is experiencing, but they will do what they can. Additionally, the Village has ordered their own Speed Radar Signs—they will be portable (so we can move them), battery operated and will be able to collect and record some data. They should arrive in a couple of weeks.

Having heard so much about this issue has made me aware of my own tendency to drive fast and I appreciate that awareness. I've made a conscious effort to pay attention to my speedometer, and "slow down through our towns!"

# **Village Holidays**

The Village Office and DPW will be closed for the following holidays.

Residents whose garbage collection day is normally Monday should put out their toters Monday evening for Tuesday collection. Tuesday's collection will take place on Wednesday and recycling will be picked up on Thursday.

# **BRUSH AND DEBRIS - LEAF PICK UP**

- Leaf vacuuming will begin early October and go until the snow falls.
- Leaves must be raked as close to the road as possible in long rows instead of a big mound.
- Keep sidewalks, streets and concrete drains clear of leaves as this can cause drainage issues.
- Grass clippings and all lawn rakings **must be placed in recyclable paper bags. No plastic bags.** Paper bags for lawn debris are available for purchase at most home improvement stores.
- Do not bag or use containers for leaves during this time.
- Do not mix brush, nuts, apples, other trash or animal waste with the leaves.
- After loose leaf pickup is complete, place leaves in biodegradable lawn bags for pickup.
- No brush pick up during leaf season. Brush pick up will resume in April.
- Village residents may drop off their brush at the DPW Recycling Center during the work week. Please call ahead. Proof of residency is required for dumping.
- Before October, for hauling large amount of brush, village residents may have a DPW truck dropped off at their home, a charge of \$25 per day, per load. Please call ahead for this option. Removal of trees, plants and shrubbery on private property is the sole responsibility of the homeowner.
- For yard work and tree removal done by a contractor, it is the responsibility of the contractor to remove all debris.
- Removal of home improvement and construction debris, including and not limited to roofing materials, drywall, plywood, sinks, etc., is the sole responsibility of the homeowner.
- In the event of a wind storm that takes down branches, the DPW will pick up fallen branches due to the storm. Notice of the dates will be given on the website and Facebook Page.

# Garbage & Recycling Pick up

Please be mindful of the time when putting garbage and recycling out by the curb. With different drivers and the upcoming change in weather, the route the garbage truck takes is subject to change. Your garbage toter(s) should be out by 7:00am on your garbage day so the DPW can pick it up promptly.

## **Bulk Garbage Items**

Items such as couches, chairs, dressers, carpet pieces , etc. require a \$10 sticker to be placed on the item. Extra garbage bags that do not fit in the tote requires a \$1 sticker. The old tube TVs are \$25. Refrigerators and items with freon are \$35. Stickers may be purchased at the Village Office.

### S-t-r-e-t-c-h Your Tax Dollars!

Be sure your recycling and garbage tote lids are closed. We pay to dispose things by the ton, rain and snow add unnecessary weight to the tote.



Do you have more recycling than fits in your tote? There are extra totes at the DPW, you can bring recycling up to the DPW during regular business hours.

## Walk Like a Penguin



With the serene, snow globe like powder coming soon it is important to remember that ice follows. Here are some helpful hints on how to walk on ice and in snow this winter!

- Wear boots with a grip or neoprene sole. Slick soles such as leather or plastic can increase your chances of slipping.
- Take special care when entering or exiting vehicles. Make sure to lean on the back of the seat or the vehicle to give yourself support.
- Walk with your hands out incase of a fall. If they are in your pocket, you will not have enough time to catch yourself.
- Take short, shuffling steps or "walk like a penguin" on icy areas.

### In the Case of Falling:

- Roll with the fall- If you feel yourself falling, try to roll so you fall onto the fleshiest parts of your body. Above all, make sure to protect your head.
- Relax your body
  – Experts say to become as languid as
  possible when falling to prevent damage and soreness.

# Get Your Vehicle Winter Ready

# Prepare your car before the snow comes!

- Service the radiator and maintain antifreeze level.
- Check your tires' tread or, if necessary, replace tires with all-weather or snow tires.
- Keep the gas tank full to avoid ice in the tank and fuel lines.
- Use a wintertime formula in your windshield washer.
- Prepare a winter emergency kit to keep in your car in case you become stranded. The kit should include:
  - 1. Cell phone, portable charger, and extra batteries;
  - Items to stay warm, such as extra hats, coats, mittens, blankets, or sleeping bags;
  - 3. Food and water;
  - Booster cables, flares, tire pump, and a bag of sand or cat litter (for traction);
  - 5. Compass and maps;
  - 6. Flashlight, battery-powered radio, and extra batteries;
  - 7. First-aid kit; and
  - 8. Plastic bags (for sanitation).



### Winter Reminders

The Village DPW prides themselves on keeping our streets and sidewalks safe and useable in the winter season. You can help by remembering the following:

- Overnight parking is prohibited on village streets from 3:00am 6:00am from November 1 through April 1 for snow plowing purposes. Tickets will be issued to vehicles parked during these hours. The fine is \$50.
- New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law states that it is illegal to shovel or plow snow into the roadway. If you use a snow blower, point the blower away from the street. If you hire a contractor to plow your driveway, you should make certain that they do not plow snow into the street.
- Please do not place refuse or recycle bins in the street or on the sidewalk.
- Please keep bushes and trees trimmed so the sidewalk plow can keep the sidewalks clear.
