2024 Congressional Appropriations

RESOLUTION 2024 CONGRESSIONAL APPROPRIATIONS THE COMMUNITY PROJECT FUNDING

WHEREAS, Village of Scottsville (Village), Monroe County, supports the submission of a 2024 Congressional Appropriations for community supported projects in the 25th Congressional District on behalf of the Village, for the community Funding Program to repair portions of the Sanitary Sewer Infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the Congressional Appropriations process offers funding opportunities to municipalities to help pay for projects deemed necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Village has a complete engineering planning report of the Sanitary Sewer collection system that prioritizes the current condition of the infrastructure with sections of the Village marked for pipe bursting or lining; and

WHEREAS, with this study, the Village is "shovel-ready" to commence repair and upgrade to the Sanitary Sewer system to mitigate possible future disasters; and

WHEREAS, the Village will request \$842,400 in grant funding which will require a Local Match of 20% or \$210,600 for a total project cost of \$1,053,000;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village Board, on behalf of the Village, identifies the Village Mayor as its authorized representative, able to execute necessary documents relative to and as required for the 2024 Congressional Appropriations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Village Board does hereby authorize and obligate the Local Match hereby appropriated from the Village sewer fund; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Village recognizes and fully supports the submission of the 2024 Congressional Appropriations to perform maintenance to the Sanitary Sewer system in the Village.
