LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF 2023 AMENDING CHAPTER 39 OF THE CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF SCOTTSVILLE IN RELATION TO RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

BE IT ENACTED, by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Scottsville, Monroe County, State of New York, as follows:

Section 39-2 of the Code of the Village of Scottsville shall be amended by deleting existing Section 39-2 in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

§ 39-2. Appointed Village Officers.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 3 of the Village Law, any person holding an appointed public officer within the Village of Scottsville need not be a resident or an elector of the Village of Scottsville, provided that the person who is an appointed Village Officer resides within the State of New York, except that all members of local Village boards shall remain residents or electors of the Village of Scottsville.

This local law is adopted pursuant to NYS Municipal Home Rule Law.

All other local laws of the Village of Scottsville that are inconsistent with the provisions of this local law are hereby repealed provided, however, that such repeal shall only be to the extent of such inconsistency. In all other respects, this local law shall be in addition to such other local laws regulating and governing the subject matter covered herein.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, word, section or part of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, word, section, or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

This local law will take effect upon filing in the office of the New York State Secretary of State.
