Amendment to Village/Town and Irondequoit Bay South Central Pure Waters District Intermunicipal Construction and Service Agreement

Page 4 Construction Paragraph 2 replacement

2. The VILLAGE will finance all VILLAGE/TOWN costs including but not limited to, costs associated with planning, design, construction, inspection, engineering, legal administration, and other costs of the LOCAL PROJECT and REGIONAL PROJECT. These costs are estimated to be \$3,590,000 as shown on Exhibit C. The VILLAGE shall calculate both VILLAGE and TOWN shares of the annual debt service payment each year based on the number of "EQUIVALENT DWELLING UNITS" ("EDUs") located in each municipal jurisdiction in that year. The VILLAGE and TOWN EDUs will be expressed as percentages of the total number of combined VILLAGE and TOWN EDUs applied against the annual debt service payment. The VILLAGE and TOWN list of EDUs shall be reviewed by a Scottsville Wheatland Regional Sanitary Sewer Committee* (SWRSSC) every two (2) years, or as residential and/or commercial projects that materially increase the flow. **

*The SWRSSC was formed following completion of construction and commissioning of the LOCAL PROJECT and REGIONAL PROJECT and is comprised of the following six (6) members: VILLAGE and TOWN Code Enforcement Officers, VILLAGE Treasurer, a VILLAGE Trustee, the VILLAGE DPW Superintendent and the TOWN Highway Superintendent.

**The SWRSSC agreed to set the percentage based on a five-year average of equivalent units as of January 2023. The current percentage is calculated to be 72% VILLAGE responsibility and 28 % TOWN responsibility. This percentage will remain in effect until a review by the Committee determines that the percentage difference exceeds 1%.

3. The VILLAGE shall invoice the TOWN semi-annually by January 1st and July 1st for the TOWN share of the annual debt service payment for the cost of the LOCAL PROJECT and REGIONAL PROJECT. Upon receipt of this semi-annual debt service invoice, the TOWN shall pay the VILLAGE by means of a lump sum payment. The TOWN shall pay semi-annually by February 1st and August 1st.


