If only.....

The winters were shorter and the summers longer. By the time you get this, the meteorologic event known as a full solar eclipse will be upon us. Expect full totality at 3:20 PM on April 8. Estimates for out-of-town visitors range from 150,000 to 500,000. All hotels are fully booked.

The Monroe County Sheriffs Zone B had a meeting with first responders to coordinate and be as ready as possible for the expected wave of people who are traveling here for the best viewing of the eclipse. They gave us a few tips for you (and maybe your out-of-town guests) to think about:

- ◆ Gas up vehicles the day before, or morning of 4/8. Have snacks and water in the car. Dress appropriately for the weather.
- ◆ Pick up prescriptions the day before.
- ◆ After the eclipse is over, first responders are expecting very heavy traffic for extended periods of time –patience will serve you well.
- ◆ Wear approved special eclipse glasses. Here is a link to what to look for and why: <https://tinyurl.com/mwc3kynd>
- ◆ Call 911 for emergencies command centers will be set up around the county, including NYS Troopers, Monroe County Sheriffs, Rochester Police Department, Ambulance and Fire. Our own WSJFD will be staging at the fire hall.

Saturday, May 4- Arbor Day Tree Planting – 9:30 AM Johnson Park- As part of our Tree City Designation, we celebrate Arbor Day with a ceremonial tree planting. Many thanks to CooperVision for sponsoring this annual event and donating the tree(s).

Saturday, June 8 – We’re very excited to bring *Joe Beard and the Swamp Road Jukes* back again to the American Legion for their annual Chicken BBQ. We’re also declaring that day “**Yard Sale Trail**” to coincide with several other larger sales going on that weekend.

Saturday September 14 – Greenway Cycle Challenge – a family friendly 10-mile route from Scottsville starting at Canawaugus Park and ending in Avon, with activities along the way.

From the Village Office

Village taxes for the 2024-2025 fiscal year will be collected at the Village Office June 1, 2024 to July 1, 2024. Monday 8:00 am - 4:00 pm, Tuesday - Thursday 8:00 am - 4:00 pm, and Friday 8:00 am - 1:00 pm. After July 1, 2023, a five percent (5%) penalty will be charged through and including July 31, 2024. Taxes received after July 31, 2024 will have penalty computed pursuant to Section 924-A and Section 1456 of the Real Property Tax Law.

Vendors and Door to Door Sales

The Village of Scottsville requires a permit to allow door to door sales. If a solicitor comes to your door, please ask to see the permit issued from the Village. The permit will be on Village letterhead.



If the solicitor cannot provide a permit, please always, report any suspicious behavior to 911 or the Village Office .

DPW Brush Pick-up

Brush pick up happens April 1 - October 1. Please keep in mind that brush left at the curb for the DPW to pick up should be no larger than 4 foot lengths and bundled with twine. Small twigs should be bagged in paper landscaping bags.

Another option is to reserve the DPW truck. The DPW will drop off a truck at the end of the day, you can fill it to the brim and the DPW will pick it up in the morning. No need to tie and bundle or bag! To reserve the truck, stop by the Office to fill out an application and pay the \$25 fee.

UPCOMING PROJECTS

Wyvil Ave. and Maple St. are being prepped for sewer lining. With the help of a grant, we had the sewer lines throughout the Village evaluated by camera to prioritize the areas that need attention. Soon Kenyon Pipeline will be in the Village slip lining the pipes along Wyvil and Maple.

The triangle at Rochester and Main Street will require a total replacement of the sewer pipe. That will be a much bigger project and will cause traffic concerns. More to come on that.

While all this work is being done, the DPW will be stretched pretty thin. Please be patient with them.

Summer Roadwork

The DPW will be performing roadwork along Diana Drive from Chili Ave to Heather Lane and down Heather Lane. This work is made possible in part by a Monroe County Community Development Grant and local funds.

This is Phase One of a three year project. The grant for Phase Two has been submitted to the County. Hopefully we will be awarded this money again and next summer will tackle Briarwood Lane. And Phase Three will be the rest of Diana in summer 2026.

The Community Development Block Grant has been very good to the Village of Scottsville. The past few years funding has been provided for various sidewalk projects throughout the Village.

2024 Great North American Eclipse



On April 8, 2024, a total solar eclipse will cross North America, passing over Mexico, the United States, and Canada. A total solar eclipse happens when the Moon passes between the Sun and Earth, completely blocking the face of the Sun. The sky will darken as if it were dawn or dusk. When watching the partial phases of the solar eclipse directly with your eyes, which happens before and after totality, you must look through safe solar viewing glasses ("eclipse glasses") or a safe handheld solar viewer at all times.

Open Burning in New York State

Annual burn ban in effect from March 16 - May 14

Open burning of household trash releases dangerous compounds including arsenic, carbon monoxide, benzene, styrene, formaldehyde, lead, hydrogen cyanide and dioxin, among others. Never is it allowed to burn trash, plastic, tires and leaves. Please limit fires to the list below. Open burning is also the greatest cause of wildfires in New York. *Please be considerate of your neighbors. Neighbors like to enjoy the fresh air with windows open.*

Open burning is prohibited in New York, with several exceptions.

- Campfires less than 3 feet in height and 4 feet in length, width or diameter are allowed.
- Small cooking fires are allowed.
- Fires cannot be left unattended and must be fully extinguished.
- *Only charcoal or clean, untreated or unpainted wood can be burned.*
- Ceremonial or celebratory bonfires are allowed.
