Good Thursday Morning to You!

I admit it. I watched too much television while growing up. I constantly remind myself of this with the useless trivia that is embedded in my brain. For example, I first heard many songs as TV commercials, only to learn later they were actually hit tunes.

<u>"I Heard It Through the Grapevine"</u> apparently wasn't about the California Raisins. Who knew? Marvin Gaye did, for one. But he doesn't deserve all the credit. The song was written by Norman Whitfield and Barrett Strong for Motown Records in 1966. The first recording was produced by Whitfield for Gladys Knight & the Pips and released as a single in September 1967. The Miracles were the first to record the song in 1966, but their version wasn't released until August 1968.

How about the TV commercial of that kid oh-so-slowly pouring Heinz ketchup on his hamburger to the sound of <u>"Anticipation."</u> I would have sworn that the words were "Heinz is the patience." I was wrong. But "Anticipation" was oh-so right, as the1971 Carly Simon song peaked at No. 13 on the Billboard pop singles chart and at No. 3 on the Billboard Adult Contemporary chart. The song also garnered Simon a Grammy Award nomination for Best Pop Female Vocalist. She wrote the song in 15 minutes while waiting for Cat Stevens to pick her up for a date. Seriously.

Rarely has a song been a better fit for a TV commercial than "<u>I Can</u> <u>See Clearly Now</u>" was for Glass Plus window cleaner. Singersongwriter Johnny Nash made this the lead single for his 1972 album of the same name, and it reached No. 1 on the U.S. Billboard Hot 100 and Cash Box charts.

When giving my toddler daughters baths, I would frequently sing "Rub It In," a song written and originally recorded by Layng Martine Jr. and produced by Ray Stevens. Billy "Crash" Craddock recorded



the song three years later and took it to No. 1 on the country music charts and Top 20 on the pop charts in 1974. The version I remember, though, was for Glade Plug-Ins for their popular TV commercial jingle, "<u>Plug It In, Plug It In.</u>"

"<u>Short Shorts</u>" is a song written and performed by The Royal Teens. It reached No. 2 on the U.S. R&B chart and No. 3 on the U.S. pop chart in 1958. That was well before my time, but Nair hair removal products made this tune top of mind in my childhood years.

And finally, a song that originated as a TV jingle, only to be revised as a hit song. "I'd Like to Teach the World to Sing (In Perfect Harmony)" is a song originally written by British songwriters Roger Cook and Roger Greenaway and sung by Susan Shirley. The lyrics were rewritten by the songwriters, together with advertising executive Bill Backer and songwriter Billy Davis, for The Coca-Cola Company to become "<u>Buy the World a Coke"</u> in the 1971 "Hilltop" television commercial sung by the Hillside Singers.

Ever wonder why old barns are usually red in color?

Hundreds of years ago, many farmers would seal their barns with linseed oil, which is an orange-colored oil derived from the seeds of the flax plant. To this oil, they would add

ferrous oxide, or rust. Rust was plentiful on farms and it killed fungi and mosses that might grow on barns, and it was very effective as a sealant. It turned the mixture red in color.

1990. George H.W. Bush and Mikhail Gorbachev agree to end production of chemical weapons. At a superpowers summit meeting in Washington, D.C., U.S. President George H.W. 
Governors Days!
